Attached Atlanta teletype advises that the body of Larry Rogers was recovered on 4/9/81 in apartment 17 at 460 Temple Street, N. W., Atlanta, Georgia.

A fiber recovered from the head area of the victim may be similar to a fiber recovered from previous crime scenes; however, a definite conclusion has not been made by the Georgia State Crime Lab (GSCL).

Other evidentiary items include fibers, hairs, shoe prints, and possible latent fingerprint impressions on two doors and one cabinet.

A green four-door 1972 Buick was recovered near the front door of apartment 17, which is being processed by the GSCL.

The Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) was authorized and requested by former Attorney General Benjamin R. Civiletti on November 6, 1980, to initiate an immediate preliminary investigation to determine whether the missing black children in the Atlanta, Georgia, area were being held in violation of the Federal Kidnaping Law, Title 18, United States Code (USC), Section 1201. In connection with that investigation the FBI was additionally authorized to examine the circumstances surrounding the disappearance of the black children whose bodies had been recovered. At that time, the bodies of eleven children had been found and four children were missing.

The Atlanta Office of the FBI first became involved in the case of the murdered/missing children in Atlanta on June 22, 1980. At that time, the Atlanta Bureau of Police Services (ABPS) reported to the Atlanta FBI Office that Latonya Wilson, a black female, seven years of age, had been kidnaped from her residence during the night. At that time, FBI liaison was established with the ABPS to determine if a violation of the Federal Kidnaping Statute existed. The remains of Wilson's body were recovered in Atlanta, Georgia, on October 18, 1980. The cause of death could not be determined.

On July 31, 1980, the ABPS reported to the Atlanta Office of the FBI that Earl Lee Terrell, a black male, eleven years of age, had disappeared from a local swimming pool. During the evening, his family received a call demanding \$200 for Terrell's safe return. The FBI entered the case at this time to determine if violation of the Federal Kidnaping Statute existed. A telephone monitor was set up on the telephone where the ransom call was received in the event another ransom demand was made; however, none was forthcoming. The remains of Terrell were discovered on January 9, 1981, in East Point, Georgia. The condition of the body precluded a determination concerning the cause of death.

The Attorney General

In response to this tragic situation, a special task force was established on July 17, 1980. This task force was comprised of ABPS detectives as well as detectives from other metropolitan Atlanta area police departments and agents of the Georgia Bureau of Investigation (GBI). The Atlanta Office of the FBI assigned two Special Agents (SAs) in a liaison capacity to offer the services of the FBI Laboratory, the Behavioral Science Unit, and to afford coverage of out-of-state investigative matters.

On August 6, 1980, Morris G. Redding, Deputy Director, ABPS, requested the assistance of the FBI Behavioral Science Unit in this matter. On August 14, 1980, an SA assigned to the FBI Behavioral Science Unit at Quantico, Virginia, attended a conference in Atlanta, Georgia, with local law enforcement officials investigating this case.

On November 7, 1980, one SA each from the FBI Behavioral Science Unit and the FBI Laboratory were assigned to Atlanta on a temporary basis to assist the task force.

On November 7, 1980, in response to the request of the Attorney General, the Atlanta Office of the FBI assigned one SA Supervisor and three SAs on a full-time basis to immediately set up the framework for conducting a Major Case investigation. On November 10, 1980, two additional FBI SAs with previous homicide investigative background were sent to Atlanta from other FBI Divisions to assist in this matter. During the week of November 10, 1980, the files of the APBS in these cases were reviewed for background and investigative lead development.

On November 17, 1980, the Atlanta Division of the FBI commenced a Major Case investigation into the murdered/missing children. In addition to the SAs previously assigned to this case, ten SAs from other field divisions were sent to assist in this investigation. The Atlanta Office assigned nine additional Agent personnel from their office complement for a total manpower allocation of 25 Agents working this case on a full-time basis. Additionally, the Atlanta Office assigned two stenographers and one clerk to assist in handling the large volume of paperwork generated by this case.

The Attorney General

At the outset of this case, the FBI provided a program analyst who has prepared Visual Investigative Analysis (VIA) charts to assist in this matter. The facilities of the FBI Laboratory and Identification Division have been used to process evidence and latent fingerprints, conduct chemical analyses, tool mark identifications, sound recording identifications, as well as other scientific tests. It is to be noted that the majority of the potential evidentiary items obtained at the crime scenes has been retained by local or state authorities. Extensive use has been made of polygraph examinations. Several individuals have been placed under hypnosis in an attempt to elicit information to assist in this case. In one murder case, an expert was sent from the FBI Identification Division in an effort to develop latent fingerprints on the body. Additionally, at one stage of this investigation expert fingerprint examiners were assigned to this case comparing suspect fingerprints to the latent prints developed on available evidence.

It is noted that because the FBI entered the investigation over one year subsequent to the initial killing, each of the then 15 cases had to be individually reviewed and certain investigative steps taken to assure the accuracy of previous investigation.

On January 3, 1981, Lubie Ceter, victim number 16, disappeared from a suburban Atlanta shopping center without a trace. On January 9, 1981, in an attempt to locate Ceter, a massive search was conducted by 250 officers of the ABPS, said search being coordinated by the FBI. As a result of this search, the remains of two children, Christopher Richardson and Earl Lee Terrell, were located. The body of Lubie Ceter was discovered in a wooded lot in the southwest section of Atlanta on February 5, 1981.

It is now a probability that one individual may be responsible for 20 or more of the homicides in this case. In an attempt to identify this individual, several investigative steps have been initiated, among them, the surveillance of selected high-risk shopping centers frequented by young children. The surveillance phase is being conducted by the ABPS at the direction and coordination of the FBI. The Atlanta FBI has also obtained a list of all sex offenders released from Georgia prisons in the last five years. The files of individuals who appear on this list are being reviewed to determine whether they should be considered logical suspects in this case. Additionally, the Atlanta Division has obtained a list of sex offenders from metropolitan Atlanta area police departments and a similar type of review is being pursued.

The Attorney General

This investigation currently encompasses the murder of 28 black residents of metropolitan Atlanta, Georgia, and the disappearance of one black child during the period of time since July 21, 1979. Two of the victims are female, 21 victims are young males, and the remaining five are 17-27-year-old males. At least 15 of the homicide victims died as a result of asphyxiation and/or strangulation. No evidence of sexual abuse has been detected in the autopsy examinations of the victims. Victim Darron Glass has been missing since September 14, 1980.

In view of the fact that a number of recent homicide victims had been located in rivers in the Atlanta, Georgia, area, the FBI, assisted by officers from the task force, targeted 14 bridges for surveillance purposes. The surveillance was conducted from dusk to dawn for a two-week period commencing May 11, 1981, in an attempt to apprehend the killer(s) while disposing of the body of one of his victims. During this period 46 SAs were assigned to this matter on a full-time basis. Generally, during the past five months there have been 30 SAs assigned to the investigation. Presently, there are 30 support personnel assigned to this matter. Approximately 20 of these employees are implementing the Investigative Support Information System (ISIS) which involves computerization of the investigative facts in this case.

FBI director's remarks rankle officials investigating slayings

ATLANTA (AP) — Atlanta officials said Tuesday they have not solved any of the 23 slayings of young blacks and urged FBI Director William Webster to stop making "casual press statements" suggesting a break may be near.

"The question is, have we solved the cases? The answer is no. We know more about some than others, but we do not have sufficient evidence to indict," Public Safety Commissioner Lee Brown said.

Webster was quoted Tuesday as saying there is a suspect in 12 to 16 cases of the cases, and three or four other cases not connected either to each other or the others have been "substantially solved."

For his part, Mayor Maynard Jackson told Webster in a letter, "Your statements undermine the public's confidence in our investigation and create a great deal of misdirected media speculation and invective."

He urged him to "consider the impact of your casual press statements on our local situation here."

Asked for a comment from Webster, FBI spokesman Roger Young

said, "Any comment we would have made in confidence to Atlanta authorities and not through the media ... We will be in touch with Atlanta authorities so they understand the context in which the remarks were made."

Atlanta police have said repeatedly that they believe several different killers are responsible for the crimes and some of the slayings seem unrelated to others.

Brown said he telephoned Webster Monday night and the FBI director said he did not recall phrasing his

remarks in the way he was quoted. He said Webster told him he had intended only to explain the difficulties of the case.

Brown also said police were using a computer to help find the green station wagon, with a license plate that included an R and a 5, in which Larry Rogers, the latest victim on a special task force list of 23 black youths slain since July 1979, was last reported seen.

The description was provided by a witness who also described the man driving the car.

Grieving Atlantans bury victim number 23

ATLANTA (UPI) — Atlanta buried another black youth Tuesday, the 23rd victim in a string of baffling murders dating back 20 months.

"My God, my God, why?" asked the Rev. Isaac Wheeler, standing in the pulpit of the Mount Moriah Baptist Church near the dark tan casket of Larry Rogers, a retarded 21-year-old.

"May you be able to sustain us and keep us in our darkest hour," Wheeler prayed. "All of our hearts are filled with sorrow. Lord, we pray for our community."

The decomposing body of Rogers was found in an abandoned apartment building April 9. Like 11 other victims, Rogers died of asphyxiation, specifically strangulation. In addition to the 23 young blacks who have been slain, two others are missing.

A remembrance written by Rogers' family appeared in the announcement of the church services. It read in part: "Good night, Larry. Your life ended so strange the other day. When death came and took you away. We will try and think of you not being dead. You're just out of sight. So, good night, dear Larry, good night."

Uniformed police officers sitting on the steps of private homes across the street from the church took pictures of people arriving for the services. The photographs are reviewed to determine whether any of the same people might be turning up at the various funerals.

Leon Hall, representing Mayor Maynard Jackson and the city council, told members of the family sitting on the front row "your city loves you. We assure you we will bring this nightmare to an end."

In announcing the grant, Health and Human Services Secretary Richard Schweiker said it was for direct counseling as well as educational services "to help the people of Atlanta to deal with the aftermath of the slayings."

Barrett has prior juvenile arrests including aggravated assault, drug violations, theft, and receiving stolen property. Victim was reported missing at 2:00 am, 5/12/81. His mother states she last saw her son at 4 pm on 5/11/81.

The Atlanta Division telephonically advised that the autopsy reveals the cause of death was ligature strangulation. Approximately three stab wounds were located on the chest area.

DeKalb County police authorities are retaining exclusive jurisdiction; therefore, the homicide has not been referred to the Atlanta Task Force.

According to Deputy Chief Morris Redding of the Task Force, this victim will not be added to the list until a preliminary investigation is conducted.






