



extracted undrilled."

This clipping would indicate that an
agent Dunn, the bullet was recovered, was shot and killed
three days later while resisting arrest.

It is suggested that you endeavor to work
on this report with reference to the killing of Dunn.



On Oct. 6, 1927 agent interviewed Sheriff Geo Carroll, Cheyenne Wyo., who stated that Mrs Harmon Barker, wife of Harmon Barker, made a confession to him that her husband, a notorious bandit was slain in a gun fight at Wichita Kansas August 29, 1927; that he was the one who killed deputy sheriff Art Osborn at Pine Bluffs, Wyo., Aug 1, 1927, and that Elmer A Inman, subject of I.O #972 was not the party who killed sheriff Osborn. Sheriff Carroll further stated that Mrs Harmon Barker was sentenced to Canon City Colo., Penitentiary for a period of four years, being accessory before the fact for the killing of Deputy Sheriff Osborn; Sheriff Carroll states that subject Inman belongs to the outlaw gang in Oklahoma, known as the "Terrill-Kyne Gang" and that Inman was one of the gang who recently attempted to rob a jewelry store at Colorado Springs Colorado, the other members being Ray Terrill, Danny Daniels, Ralph Scott.
