MEMORANDUM FOR MR. CLEGG

[REDACTED] Private, United States Supreme Court Police Guard, United States Supreme Court Building, Washington, D. C., called at my office today requesting information concerning the FBI National Police Academy. He specifically wanted to know whether a member of his organization was eligible to attend the Academy. I informed him that I could not definitely state whether a member of his organization was eligible for attendance advising him that the matter of eligibility would have to be considered by higher officials of the Bureau.

A copy of the Bureau's publication, "The FBI National Police Academy - Questions and Answers" and an application blank were given to Private [REDACTED] and it was suggested that upon receipt of the executed application the Bureau would advise his superior [REDACTED] United States Marshal for the United States Supreme Court as to whether his organization was eligible or not.

Private [REDACTED] was informed that even though a member of his organization was eligible to attend the Academy, it would be impossible to consider an application for the last session of the Academy this year, and that the earliest possible consideration which could be given an application would be for the second or third session in the year 1942.

Enclosed for Bureau, encased in cellophane envelope, is an undated, anonymous handwritten communication containing threats against the Supreme Court, Washington, D.C., as well as a stamped envelope in which it was received. The envelope is addressed Supreme Court, Washington, D.C., and is posted Los Angeles, California, 1/5/65. In the lower left corner of the envelope is the following: "Go to Russia. that is where you belong."

One photo copy each of letter and envelope is transmitted to Los Angeles. The letter reads as follows:

"January

Supreme we are going to get rid of you if we have to shoot every Damn one of you.

You never did a thing right in your lives.

You will be shot or drowned. Jackasses!

This is our city and nation

We will not have a Supreme Court.

Go to Hell

The above was made available to SA [redacted] by [redacted] Marshal, United States Supreme Court, on 1/11/65. The letter was received at his office on 1/8/65 and was opened by his secretary, [redacted]. Only [redacted] and [redacted] have handled instant communication. [redacted] stated he had not brought instant communication to the attention of any of the Justices and has no intention of doing so. He does not desire its return, stating that it appears to be from a "crackpot." It occurred to him that the FBI might care to examine and retain it for possible future reference purposes. Neither [redacted] nor [redacted] have any ideas concerning the identity of the anonymous letter writer and stated they do not recognize the handwriting.

The Bureau is requested to process instant letter for latent fingerprints. Those developed should be preserved for possible future comparison purposes. No effort is being made at this time to obtain elimination prints from either [redacted] or [redacted].

The Bureau is also requested to make appropriate examination of instant letter and search it through the anonymous letter file, advising Los Angeles and WFO of the results.

Los Angeles is being carried as origin as instant letter was mailed from Los Angeles.

The FBI Laboratory and the Latent Fingerprint Section, FBI Identification Division, Washington, D. C., advised that after an examination, no marks or other distinguishing features were found on the envelope or letter, which would assist in tracing them to their source. The envelope was examined and found to be a U. S. Government envelope. No latent fingerprints of value were developed on the envelope or letter.

On January 18, 1965, Robert L. Brosio, Assistant U. S. Attorney, Los Angeles, advised that he is declining prosecution under the Extortion Statute in this case in view of this letter being a run-of-the-mill and "crackpot" type letter, the identity has not been determined, and no further investigation deems warranted at this time.

b7c On February 15, 1965, Special Agent [REDACTED] Secret Service, U. S. Treasury Department, Federal Building, Los Angeles, was advised of the above letter and envelope.

This document contains neither recommendations nor conclusions of the FBI. It is the property of the FBI and is loaned to your agency; it and its contents are not to be distributed outside your agency.

U.S. Discovers Overpayments: Aid Given to Ineligibles

A federal investigation into the Lindsay administration's welfare practices has uncovered evidence of fiscal mismanagement that is costing the taxpayers as much as \$85 million a year in overpayments and aid to ineligible recipients.

City officials yesterday made public sparse portions of the report of Health, Education and Welfare in Washington. The full report is expected to be released Friday.

The study, which began last October at the request of five New York City congressmen, scrutinized 545 cases in the federally supported Aid to Families with Dependent Children program.

According to the findings released by the city, the federal probes found that an astonishing 9.4% of the cases were not eligible for such public assistance.

In addition, the study found, in 26% of the cases examined there were overpayments averaging \$48 a month each.

There are about 124,000 aid to family children in the city. According to federal figures, the overpayments total more than \$2.3 million a month, or about \$20 million a year.

As for ineligibility, the estimated 13,600 cases, at an average monthly average of \$40 each, meant that the city is spending about \$4.8 million a month, or about \$48 million a year on persons who should not be on the family children rolls at all.

Human Resources Administrator Mitchell I. Ginsberg issued an eight-page statement denying the federal charges of mismanagement, but conceding that the report shows "a high degree of unworkability of the present public assistance program."
