

The Worker in its May 16, 1948 issue carried an article on Page 11, Column 1 reading as follows:

"THE WARREN BRANCH of the FBI probably has been awarded the J. Edgar Hoover Award of the Loyal Louse. The agents went to the directors of the YWCA there and succeeded in bringing sufficient pressure on the directors to force the resignation of one of the workers at the YW. Her sin: She was in favor of Henry A. Wallace for president."

Rebulet June 18, 1948, requesting that an agent of this office contact a ranking official of the YWCA at Warren, Ohio regarding the item in the May 16, 1948 issue of The Worker, which indicated that the Bureau was responsible for the discharge of a YWCA worker at Warren, Ohio.

[REDACTED] YWCA, Warren, Ohio, [REDACTED] advised that [REDACTED] was employed as a Program Director of the Business and Industrial Department of the YWCA at Warren, Ohio from September 1, 1947 to May 1, 1948 and resigned voluntarily to accept a position in a settlement house at Chicago, Illinois. *b7c*

[REDACTED] advised that she and other officials of the YWCA at Warren, Ohio had received numerous complaints from labor, management, public officials at Warren, and officials of the YWCA at Warren because of the fact that [REDACTED] was taking an active part at Warren in the "Wallace for President" local committee at Warren, Ohio. [REDACTED] advised that because of these numerous complaints she discussed this matter with [REDACTED] and as a result of this discussion her resignation was submitted. *b7c*

[REDACTED] advised that no agent of the Bureau called on her or any of the other officials of the YWCA, to her knowledge, regarding [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] was informed that there is absolutely no basis for the statement appearing in the May 16, 1948 issue of The Worker.

[REDACTED] advised that she realized that the item in question is absolutely untrue and has no basis, in fact. *a*

[REDACTED] stated that he had received a copy of the Sunday Worker for July 16, 1950, and after examining it he felt that its contents were of a highly seditious nature. [REDACTED] said he wanted to bring this to the attention of the Bureau with the thought in mind that some steps might be taken to stop the production of material of this type during the present emergency. He stated that he intended to call the contents of this issue of "The Worker" to the attention of Congressmen Karl Mundt, Richard Nixon, and T. Vincent Quinn, and he inquired whether there was anything he might suggest to the Congressmen to assist the Bureau in taking action on this matter.

I told [REDACTED] that, of course, we appreciated his calling and he could be sure his call would be made a matter of record. He was told that the Bureau was an investigative agency and that any legal steps taken to stop the publication of "The Worker" would have to be initiated by the Department.

The Bureau is trying to locate a copy of "The Worker" for July 16. When this is done, it will be reviewed and if it contains material of a seditious character, it will be submitted to the Criminal Division of the Department for an opinion as to what, if any, action can be taken regarding this.

It is noted that the Los Angeles Field Division sent in several copies of the "People's World," which is the CP West Coast paper, pointing out that they contained articles which appeared to be seditious in nature. Copies of these issues were submitted to the Criminal Division of the Department this morning asking for an opinion as to whether a violation of any Federal law was involved.


