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

Silvio J. Mollo, Assistant United States Attorney, Southern District of New York, advised in 1954 that, on the basis of the information available, no prosecution would be had since no obstruction of interstate commerce was indicated, nor was there any indication that threats, force or violence were being used by S.G.S. Associates, Incorporated.

Information was developed in 1956 that Carlo Gambino, well-known New York hoodlum, was a principal in S.G.S. Associates, Incorporated. This information was verified from examination of the books and records of the firm by a Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

Carlo Gambino, Federal Bureau of Investigation number 334450, New York City Police Department number B-128760, was born September 1, 1902 in Sicily, and currently resides at 2230 Ocean Parkway, Brooklyn, New York, and 34 Club Drive, Massapequa, Long Island, New York. He has an arrest record dating back to 1930 which includes arrests for violations of the alcohol tax laws and confidence game; he was an attendee at the 1957 Apalachin meeting of notorious hoodlums. On October 8, 1963, Joseph Valachi in public testimony before the Permanent Subcommittee on Investigations of the Committee on Government Operations, United States Senate, stated that Carlo Gambino was the "boss" of one of the New York "families" of "La Cosa Nostra."



# BUSINESS LEADERS USED MAFIA FIRM

## Gambino Has Third Share in Labor Relations Concern

By CHARLES GRUTZNER

A new investigation of the dealings of Carlo (Don Carlos) Gambino, head of a major Mafia group here, has found that some industrial and business companies are clients of a labor relations firm of which Gambino owns a third.

The other partners in S.G.S. Associates, Inc., which operates out of a small office at 141 East 44th Street, are Henry H. Saltzstein, a convicted burglar and bookmaker, and George Schiller, about whom little is known.

Among the clients and former clients are Wellington Associates, owners of the Chrysler Building and the largest acquirers of real estate in the metropolitan area in recent years; William J. Levitt, most of whose massive building operations have been with non-union labor; Flower and Fifth Avenue Hospitals, Howard Clothes, Bond Clothes, and the Concord Hotel at Lake Kiamasha, N. Y.

Other clients here and in New Jersey, Pennsylvania and other parts of the East have brought S.G.S. billings to an estimated \$500,000 a year.

The current investigation of S.G.S. Associates by the Federal Bureau of Investigation is an outgrowth of two continuing inquiries by United States Attorney Robert M. Morgenthau. Two Federal grand juries are questioning witnesses about the five local Mafia, or Cosa Nostra, families here. A

is delving into labor-management racketeering.

Several S.G.S. clients, who confirmed that they had been questioned by F.B.I. agents recently, said they had been unaware that the G. in the firm name stood for Gambino. They said they had ended their contracts, or were about to do so, after learning of the Mafia connection.

Most of those interviewed said they had dealt with Saltzstein. Some described his role as "adviser on labor policy," and said he had negotiated with unions when strikes occurred or were imminent.

Mr. Morgenthau, asked about the new inquiry, said only that he was "continuing to explore all phases of Mafia activity and of labor racketeering by management or unions." He declined to comment on the specifics of the S.G.S. investigation.

There have been at least five investigations of S.G.S. by Federal, state and local agencies in recent years, none of which resulted in criminal charges against the corporation or its principals.


Investigations were conducted by District Attorney Frank S. Hogan, the F.B.I., the Senate rackets investigating committee headed by John L. McClellan, Democrat of Arkansas; by former United States Attorney Paul W. Williams, and by the New York-New Jersey Waterfront Commission.

### Gambino Expected to Quit

The renewed Federal interest, including an investigation by the Internal Revenue Service, is understood to be one reason for the expected early resignation of Gambino as a partner and treasurer of S.G.S.

The other reason is the worsening of Gambino's heart ailment, which has brought him a succession of delays in deportation proceedings.

Born in Palermo, Sicily, in 1902, Gambino entered the United States illegally as a stow-away in 1921. The Government

began deportation proceedings in 1957 after Gambino achieved national notoriety as a delegate to the convention of underworld leaders at Apalachin, N.Y.

The latest report on Gambino's health was received this week by the Immigration and Naturalization Service from the United States Public Health Service Hospital at Stapleton, S.I., where the gang chieftain underwent examinations and observation from March 29 to April 9.

Sol Marks, deputy district director of the immigration service, said the hospital report said Gambino's life would be endangered if he had to attend deportation hearings.

"The decision is not to go ahead with hearings at this time," said Mr. Marks. Another medical examination may be required in about six months.

#### Anastasia's Successor

Some police officials expressed the belief that the Mafia boss, who will be 63 on Aug. 24, broken in health and tired of repeated investigations, would retire also from active leadership of the crime family he inherited from Albert Anastasia, his predecessor, in 1957.

Yesterday the name "Carlo Gambino" remained in gold letters between those of Mr. Schiller and Saltzstein under the legend "S.G.S. Associates Public & Labor Relations" on the door of Room 1002 at 141 East 44th Street. The office was closed all day.

William Levitt, the builder, said through a spokesman: "We learned about a month ago that the 'G.' in the firm name was Carlo Gambino. We have since been informed that Mr. Gambino will sever his relationship in the very near future."

Mr. Levitt, one of the best-paying customers of S.G.S., has been dealing with Saltzstein since 1952 and reportedly is paying \$7,000 a month. Mr. Levitt once said in an interview: "I'm not against unions, I just think we can build houses faster without them."

Alfred S. Levitt, a brother, who operates separately, is a former client of S.G.S. Morton Wexler, vice president of Levitt House, Inc., Alfred Levitt's latest development in Central Islip, L. I., said his company had first hired S.G.S. as labor consultant during construction of the original Levitt House (since sold and renamed Le Havre) in Beechhurst, Queens,

"because of dissatisfaction with a plastering contractor."

"They helped us change to an excellent plastering contractor," Mr. Wexler reported. For the Beechhurst project, Mr. Levitt gave the glasswork contract to the Whitestone Construction Company, in whose ownership S.G.S. has a half interest.

The new owners of the Chrysler Building, Sol Goldman and Alex DiLorenzo, called in S.G.S. when they were hit by a strike of service and maintenance employes on May 19, 1960, 18 days after taking title.

Union representatives complained that "goons" with guns in holsters arrived in Cadillacs and took over elevator operations. The building owners, denying this, said the elevator operators were management executives. The strike was settled the same day with the help of the Mayor's office and the complaint about alleged "goons" was forgotten.

Mr. Goldman and Mr. DiLor-

enzo were so satisfied with S.G.S. that they kept them in their budget through 1963. They were paying an annual rate of \$13,500. Mr. Goldman said he did not become aware of Gambino's connection until 1963 when a Dun & Bradstreet report showed Gambino as a partner. He said it was decided then to drop S.G.S. because of the "bad association."

Dr. Ralph E. Snyder, president of Flower and Fifth Avenue Hospital, told F. B. I. agents who called on him that the hospital had become involved with S. G. S. in 1962 when Local 1199, Drug & Hospital Employees Union, struck because the hospital decided to farm out its dietary and house-keeping work. There were 10 days of picketing and several strikers were arrested for alleged disturbances.

#### Saltzstein Arbitrates

"We didn't know what to do," Dr. Snyder explained in an interview. "One of our doctors said he had a patient who was a labor-relations expert and might help us. It was Mr. Saltzstein. He came in and took part in talks with the strikers and the Mayor's office."

Dr. Snyder said that with settlement of the strike, hospital management and the union agreed on Saltzstein as impartial arbitrator of the contract.

"Since learning about Gambino," he said, "I think we ought to eliminate Mr. Saltzstein as impartial arbitrator when the contract expires at the end of this year."

Mr. Schiller and Saltzstein formed a partnership for labor relations work in 1952. It became S.G.S. Associates in 1954, the "G." being Sylvester J. Garmella, a lawyer. Mr. Garmella was replaced by Gambino in April, 1955. Conveniently, this did not require a change in the firm name. In April, it became a corporation, with 99 shares split three ways.

Although Gambino has been named in official hearings as involved in gambling, narcotics, loan sharking and other rackets, his only conviction has been for bootlegging, in 1939.

**HISTORY:**

This 62 year old white male was admitted for medical evaluation at the request of the Immigration Service. Patient has a long history of arteriosclerotic heart disease with anginal episodes since 1948. Myocardial infarctions have occurred in 1949, 1954, 1955, 1958, and 1963. In 1957, the patient had an internal mammary artery ligation for relief of his anginal symptoms while at the Flower Fifth Avenue Hospital. Since that time, the patient has had several episodes of documented congestive heart failure with severe angina. He was first evaluated in this hospital in August 1960. In 1962, while at this hospital, his medications included diabetic oral hypoglycemic agents, in addition to his digitalis and diuretic therapy. The patient's anginal symptoms increased in 1963 with symptoms appearing after walking 1/2 block. In addition, the patient stated at that time he had frequent nocturnal angina. This pain was associated with shortness of breath and bilateral arm radiation and was relieved by nitroglycerin tablets. During the patient's last hospitalization in Sept. of 1963, he developed precordial chest pain while waiting for an EKG to be taken. This was followed by EKG evidence of currents of injury with transaminase elevations occurring one week later. Impression of suspected acute myocardial infarction was made at that time, although there were no Q wave changes. Patient states that he presently has anginal symptoms occurring after walking and nocturnally. Patient has symptoms after eating a meal, at which time he is unable to walk for approximately 1-1 1/2 hours. Anginal pains also occur nocturnally and after the patient walks several blocks slowly unassociated with meals. Some intermittent ankle edema has been noted. At present, the patient is taking approximately 10-15 nitroglycerin tablets per 24-hour period, with relief of his symptomatology.

**PHYSICAL EXAMINATION:**

Well nourished, well hydrated white male in no acute distress. The patient is noted to ambulate slowly. Blood pressure 130/70; pulse 86 per minute, regular; respirations 16 per minute. H.E.E.N.T. - Pupils equal and respond to light and accommodation. Sclerae were clear. No lid lag or nystagmus was present. Fundi were physiologic with minimal AV nicking present. The thyroid was not enlarged. There was no cervical vein distention or cervical adenopathy present. Lungs were clear to auscultation and percussion, except for some decreased breath sounds in the left base posteriorly. Heart revealed a regular sinus rhythm. A Grade I/VI ejection systolic murmur was present at the aortic area with no radiation. The PMI was not palpable. There was no cardiomegaly to percussion. Heart sounds were generally decreased. A2 was greater than P2. Abdominal examination

was physiologic with no masses or visceromegaly apparent. Bilateral flank scars were noted. There was no CVA tenderness on examination of the back. Genitalia examination was normal. Extremities revealed good radial and dorsalis pedis pulses bilaterally. Posterior tibial pulses were fair bilaterally. There was no pretibial edema, clubbing, or varicosities present. Neurologic examination was physiologic, except for some decrease in vibratory sensation over both lower extremities.

**LAB AND X-RAY EXAMINATIONS:**

Hematocrit 47, WBC 10,900, sedimentation rate 11. Serum electrolytes included a CO<sub>2</sub> of 34.5 meq/L. Chlorides 95, sodium 140, potassium 3.8, calcium 10.2, phosphorus 2.9, and uric acid 6.7. Urinalysis was unremarkable. Serology was non-reactive. Serum cholesterol was reported as 301 mg/dl. Liver function studies were essentially normal. Chest x-ray was unchanged from previous admission. EKG was essentially unchanged from previous tracing taken at this hospital on 2/7/64. The present EKG showed evidence of a right bundle branch block with old anterior myocardial infarction. In addition, a first degree AV block was present. Non-specific ST and T wave changes of ischemia and/or digitalis effect were also apparent.

**COURSE IN HOSPITAL:**

The patient continued to have recurring episodes of angina, requiring approximately 10-20 nitroglycerin tablets per day. At no time during the hospitalization did he appear to be in acute distress. The patient did state on one occasion experiencing moderate anginal pain shortly after another patient on the ward had suffered from an acute myocardial infarction with cardiac arrest. During that episode, patient was present while the other patient was having external cardiac massage and resuscitation attempted. All the other patients, including Mr. Gambino, were asked to leave the ward at that time. It was only later in the day that the patient stated he had experienced precordial chest pain during the episode. It was felt that the patient had reached maximum evaluation at this time and was fit for discharge.

**FINAL DIAGNOSES:**

1. Arteriosclerotic heart disease.
2. Anginal syndrome, secondary to #1.
3. Diabetes mellitus.
4. Chronic congestive heart failure, compensated.



Mr. Carlo Gambino was hospitalized at this facility from March 29, 1965 to April 2, 1965 for medical evaluation. A copy of the hospital summary will be forwarded under separate cover.

With regard to your request in letter dated February 2, 1965, as to "the precautions and safeguards that may be set up in order to permit the alien to testify with minimum danger to his life," the following recommendations are made:

- 1) Hearing time should be limited to one or two hours per week.
- 2) The hearings should be as informal as possible and interrogation should be carried out for no more than 20-30 minutes at a time, with rest periods between questioning.
- 3) The preliminary use of nitroglycerin by the patient is advised.
- 4) Oxygen should be available.
- 5) If the patient experiences symptoms during the proceedings, interrogation should be discontinued.
- 6) A physician should be in attendance during the hearings.

This is one of numerous admissions for this 63 year old male admitted for re-evaluation of his cardiac status at the request of Immigration Service.

He has a past history of arteriosclerotic heart disease since 1948, myocardial infarctions in 1948, 1949, 1954, 1955, 1958 and 1961. In 1957 he had a ligation of internal mammary artery performed for his angina and had an episode of congestive heart failure five days post-operatively. His medications consisted of digitalis leaf 0.1 gm. a day, calcium 50 mg. a day, caffeine 500 mg. a day, as well as peritrate and nitroglycerin. At present the patient uses 15 to 20 nitroglycerins daily for his many episodes of pressure type precordial chest pain, occurring with varying amounts of activity and occasionally radiating to the arms and shoulders. He sleeps with his head elevated on two to three pillows. He has occasional pretibial edema which decreases with elevation of the legs. The patient had dyspnea on exertion on climbing three to four stories and after walking one block on level ground. He also has anginal type pain when lying down but denies burning characteristic of the pain at this time.

**PHYSICAL EXAMINATION:**

The physical examination reveals a well developed, well nourished white male in no acute distress. Blood pressure 110/70. Pulse 76 and regular. Respirations 18 and regular. Examination of the head, eyes, ears, nose and throat revealed the head to be normocephalic, the neck was supple without neck vein distention, or thyromegaly. The thyroid carotid pulses were strong and equal. The pupils reacted equally to light and accommodation. There was Grade I Keith Wagner retinopathy noted. Examination of the ears, nose and throat was negative. Examination of the chest revealed no scars or masses. There was no supraclavicular node. The lungs revealed dullness to percussion, and decreased breath sounds, posteriorly at the left base. Otherwise the lungs were clear to percussion and auscultation. Examination of the heart revealed a regular rhythm. A2 was greater than P2. The PMI was not palpable. There was no regaly to percussion. There was a Grade II/VI soft systolic murmur at the apex without radiation. Examination of the abdomen revealed the liver which was down two fingerbreadths at the right costal margin but not enlarged to percussion. There was no spleen organomegaly or CVA tenderness. There were both right and left CVA scars noted. There were no tenderness or masses. Examination of the extremities revealed no cyanosis clubbing or edema. The peripheral pulses were full and equal bilaterally. The neurological examination revealed physiological deep tendon reflexes, negative Babinski's, and there was no gross muscle weakness or cranial deficit.

# BOSS GAMBINI USED MAFIA TITLES

## Gambino Has Third Share in Labor Relations Concern

By CHARLES BRITZNER

A new investigation of the dealings of Carlo (Doc) Santos) Gambino, head of a major Mafia group here, has found that some financial and business contacts are all parts of a labor relations firm of which Gambino owns a third.

The other parts of S.G.S. Associates, Inc., were set out of a small office at 117 East 44th Street, and Henry H. Schiller, about whom little is known.

Among the clients and former clients are Wellington Associates, owners of the Chrysler Building and the largest purchasers of real estate in the metropolitan area in recent years; William J. Levitt, most of whose skyscraper building operations have been with non-union labor; Flower and Fifth Avenue Hospitals, the Red Cross, Don's Clothes, and the Concord Hotel at Ramapo, Lake, N. Y.

Other clients here and in New Jersey, Pennsylvania and other parts of the East have raised S.G.S. billings to an estimated \$500,000 a year.

The current investigation of S.G.S. Associates by the Federal Bureau of Investigation is an outgrowth of two continuing inquiries by United States Attorney Robert M. Morgenthau. Two Federal grand juries are questioning witnesses about the five local Mafia, or Cosa Nostra, families here. A third

is delving into labor-management racketeering.

Several S.G.S. clients, who confirmed that they had been questioned by F.B.I. agents recently, said they had been unaware that the "G." in the firm name stood for Gambino. They said they had ended their contracts, or were about to do so, after learning of the Mafia connection.

Most of those interviewed said they had dealt with Saltzstein. Some described his role as "advisor on labor policy," and said he had negotiated with union when strikes occurred or were imminent.

Mr. Morgenthau, asked about the new inquiry, said only that he was "continuing to explore the role of Mafia activity and racketeering by management on unions." He did not comment on the speculation of the S.G.S. investigation.

There have been at least five investigations of S.G.S. by Federal, state and local agencies in recent years, none of which resulted in criminal charges against the corporation or its principals.

Investigations were conducted by District Attorney Frank S. Hogan, the F.B.I., the Senate rackets investigating committee headed by John L. McClellan, Democrat of Arkansas; by former United States Attorney Paul W. Williams, and by the New York-New Jersey Waterfront Commission.

### Gambino Expected to Quit

The renewed Federal interest, including an investigation by the Internal Revenue Service, is understood to be one reason for the expected early resignation of Gambino as a partner and treasurer of S.G.S.

The other reason is the worsening of Gambino's heart ailment, which has brought him a succession of delays in deportation proceedings.

Born in Palermo, Sicily, in 1902, Gambino entered the United States illegally as a stow-away in 1921. The Government began deportation proceedings in 1957 after Gambino achieved national notoriety as a delegate to the convention of underworld leaders at Atlantic City, N.Y.

The latest report on Gambino's health was received this week by the Immigration and Naturalization Service from the United States Public Health Service Hospital at Stapleton, S.F., where the gang chief has numerous operations and observation from March 25 to April 9.

Celler's deputy, district director of the immigration service, said the hospital report said Gambino's life would be endangered if he had to attend deportation hearings.

"The decision is not to go ahead with hearings at this time," said Mr. Marks. Another medical examination may be required in about six months.

### Anastasia's Successor

Some police officials expressed doubt that the Mafia boss, who will be 63 on Aug. 24, broken in health and tired of repeated investigations, would retire also from active leadership of the crime family he inherited from Albert Anastasia, his predecessor, in 1957.

Yesterday the name "Carlo Gambino" remained in gold letters between those of Mr. Schiller and Saltzstein under the name "S.G.S. Associates Public & Labor Relations" on the door of Room 1002 at 141 East 84th Street. The office was locked.

William Levitt, the builder, said through a spokesman: "We learned about a month ago that the 'G.' in the firm name was Carlo Gambino. We have since been informed that Mr. Gambino will sever his relationship in the very near future."

Mr. Levitt, one of the best-paying customers of S.G.S., has been dealing with Saltzstein since 1952 and reportedly is paying \$7,000 a month. Mr. Levitt once said in an interview: "I'm not against unions, I just think we can build houses faster without them."

Alfred S. Levitt, a brother who operates separately, is a former client of S.G.S. Morton Weiler, vice president of Levitt's company, Inc., Alfred Levitt's development in Central Islip, L. I., said his company had first hired S.G.S. as labor consultant during construction of the original Levitt House (since sold and renamed Le Havre) in Beechhurst, Queens,

"because of dissatisfaction with a plastering contractor."

"They helped us change to an excellent plastering contractor," Mr. Wexler reported. For the Beechhurst project, Mr. Levitt gave the glasswork contract to the Whitestone Construction Company, in whose ownership S.G.S. has a half interest.

The new owners of the Chrysler Building, Sol Goldman and Alex DiLorenzo, called in S.G.S. when they were hit by a strike of service and maintenance employes on May 19, 1960, 18 days after taking title.

Union representatives complained that "goons" with guns in holsters arrived in Cadillacs and took over elevator operations. The building owners, denying this, said the elevator operators were management executives. The strike was settled the same day with the help of the Mayor's office and the complaint about alleged "goons" was forgotten.

Mr. Goldman and Mr. DiLor-

enzo were so satisfied with S.G.S. that they kept them in their budget through 1963. They were paying an annual rate of \$12,500. Mr. Goldman said he had not become aware of Gambino's connection until 1963 when a firm of the street report showed Gambino as partner. He said he was ordered then to drop S.G.S. because of the "bad association."

Dr. Ralph M. Snyder, president of P. S. and 1200 Avenue Hospital, told F. B. I. agents the call on him that the hospital had become involved with S. G. S. in 1962 when Local 1199, Drug & Hospital Employees Union, struck because the hospital decided to farm out its delivery and house-keeping work. There were 10 days of picketing and several strikers were arrested for alleged disturbances.

**Saltzstein Arbitrates**

"We didn't know what to do," Dr. Snyder explained in an interview. "One of our doctors said he had a patient who was a labor-relations expert and might help us. It was Mr. Saltzstein. He came in and took part in talks with the strikers and the Mayor's office."

Dr. Snyder said that with settlement of the strike, hospital management and the union agreed on Saltzstein as impartial arbitrator of the contract.

"Since learning about Gambino," he said, "I think we ought to eliminate Mr. Saltzstein as impartial arbitrator when the contract expires at the end of this year."

Mr. Schiller and Saltzstein formed a partnership for labor relations work in 1952. It became S.G.S. Associates in 1954, the "G." being Sylvester J. Gammella, a lawyer. Mr. Gammella was replaced by Gambino in April, 1955. Conveniently, this did not require a change in the firm name. In April, it became a corporation, with 99 shares split three ways.

Although Gambino has been named in official hearings as involved in gambling, narcotics, loan sharking and other rackets, his only conviction has been for bootlegging, in 1933.

He is free on bail at the present time and deportation proceedings have been held up due to the state of Gambino's health.

He was examined by the United States Public Health Service Hospital, most recently on September 27-30, 1965, at which time his final diagnoses indicated arteriosclerotic heart disease, angina pectoris, diabetes mellitus, and chronic congestive heart failure.

He presently resides with his wife, Kathryn Gambino nee Castellano, at 2230 Ocean Parkway, Brooklyn, New York, but also maintains a residence which is used primarily in the summer months at 34 Club Drive, Massapequa, Long Island, New York. 
