DETAILS:

The title of this case was formerly STERLING HAYDEN with aliases Lieutenant John Hamilton, Sterling Hamilton, Kirk, Bird. The additions reflect Subject's present legal name, JOHN HAMILTON, the original christened name of STERLING WALTERS and "adopted" name STIRLING HAYDEN.

Pursuant to referenced letter from the Director, the present character of this case is a change from Security Matter-C as carried in reference report.

New York Journal American dated December 11, 1944, a column by Louis Sobol entitled, "New York Cavalcade" characterized STIRLING HAYDEN as a self exile from Hollywood and reflected further that he was in the thick of the Pacific fracas reportedly on one of the cargo boats working for the Canadian Government.

New York Herald Tribune and Greenwich Connecticut Press dated July 1, 1942, in which it was recorded under the dateline Nassau, Bahama, June 30, 1942 (U.P.) -- STIRLING HAYDEN announced his marriage to MADELEINE CARROLL which occurred at an undisclosed New England town three months prior. They resided at the Hotel Rozelda, while HAYDEN's schooner was overhauled. In this article HAYDEN was described as an experienced seaman who had achieved quick success in Hollywood as a leading man and then suddenly tossed his acting career aside several months prior to that and returned to the sea.

Miss CARROLL and HAYDEN appeared together in two movies, "Virginia" and "Bahama Passage". She is a native of West Bromwich, near Birmingham, England, is thirty-two years of age and obtained a divorce in December, 1939, from Captain PHILLIP ASTLEY, a London real estate broker and sportsman to whom she was married in 1931. HAYDEN, a sailor who is said to have journeyed more than ninety thousand miles on sea trips, lived at Gloucester, Mass. for several years and shipped out of that port aboard a fishing fleet, is a native of Montclair, New Jersey, and is twenty-six years of age.

He shipped out as First Mate aboard the schooner "Yankee" which completed, in 1938, a thirty-five thousand mile cruise of eighteen months duration. Subsequently, he was skipper of the Brigantine Florence C. Robinson and took the craft on a seven thousand mile trip to Tahiti in the International Seaman's Race in 1938. Mr. HAYDEN served as navigator aboard the Gloucester Schooner "Gertrude L. Thebaud".

The New York Daily Mirror, October 20, 1942, reflected STERLING HAYDEN had enlisted in the U. S. Marines and was to report for duty at an unspecified location on October 24, 1942.



The New York Sunday News, January 24, 1943, reflects STERLING HAYDEN as being a Private in the U. S. Marine Corps and that his early life and boyhood days had been spent near Montclair, New Jersey and that he loved the sea. The article further reflects that he has weighed anchor in almost every harbor of the North Atlantic, the Caribbean and the South Seas. This was done after his widowed mother had induced him to take shore leave long enough for a few studies. The article states he had one romance with an American girl in Tahiti which broke up and that he has never stayed in the place long enough to take anything seriously.

While he was in Bahama in 1939 a roving camera man took his picture which was later published in a national magazine and after observation by a talent scout was soon in Hollywood. He met MADELEINE CARROLL upon being called to appear in one of her pictures, "Virginia".

The New York Daily News and the New York Sun dated June 26, 1943, reflected that MADELEINE CARROLL and husband STIRLING HAYDEN had petitioned the Superior Court, Bridgeport, Connecticut, to approve the change of their names to Mr. and Mrs. JOHN HAMILTON. The Court, through Judge CHARLES J. MC LAUGHLIN approved the petition on June 25, 1943. The articles stated that permission was sought on the grounds that the Marine Corps had an aversion to publicity which stemmed from embarrassing publicity and requests for autographs from HAYDEN. HAYDEN advised the Court, through Attorney HUGH M. ALCORN, that he was a Second Lieutenant in the Marines and desired to escape this publicity which might hamper his advancement in the Marine Corps.

A deposition was placed before the Court and it was learned that STIRLING was not the actor's true name. He was born "WALTERS" and christened STERLING. Years later his father, GEORGE WALTERS died and his mother married a man named HAYDEN. The actor then took the name HAYDEN and changed the spelling of STERLING to STIRLING. These articles did not disclose the reason JOHN HAMILTON was chosen. Miss CARROLL was reflected as ten years his senior.

Special Agent [REDACTED] consulted the records of the Superior Court that city and under Docket No. 67021 ascertained the information as set forth previously concerning the change of Subject's name to JOHN HAMILTON to be correct as reflected from the petition on file. However, there was no deposition from HAYDEN recorded and it appeared the Subject was present at the hearing on June 25, 1943. Notes of his testimony, though brief, were taken by a court stenographer but were not typed.

In addition, MADELEINE had advised she was born in Birmingham, England, February 26, 1906, was naturalized on February 26, 1943 under Petition No. 36251 and Certificate of Naturalization No. 5434659 had been issued her. The place of her naturalization was not shown. The Subject had advised their marriage occurred on March 14, 1942, at Concord, New Hampshire. It will be noted this is at variance with the date and place furnished by [REDACTED]. The date and place of birth, however, was identical with that previously set forth.
