

For a comparatively short period in 1946, HAYDEN was a member of the Communist Party in 1946.

It will be noted that numerous of the reports furnished the Department in this matter contain no information which appears pertinent to the anticipated testimony of the witnesses in this matter and, therefore, do not appear to be subject to production under the Jencks law. Many of these reports make no reference whatever to the activities of captioned organization or the personnel associated with it. In addition, the reports contain many opinions and conclusions of the witnesses. The documents have been reviewed and comments, in addition to those contained in instant memorandum have been furnished the Department by my previous memoranda, identifying specific portions of certain of the documents which should be excised in the event the hearing officer orders them turned over to the defense counsel following the direct testimony of the witnesses.

In connection with the excising of material contained in various investigative reports referred to in my previous memoranda submitted in this matter, it is desired that all data be excised from such reports except that which is pertinent to the testimony of the witnesses involved.

This Bureau should be furnished with a complete list of the specific exhibits which the Department contemplates utilizing in this matter in order that the list can be furnished the Los Angeles Office as the hearing in this matter, if the pattern of previous hearings is followed, will undoubtedly be held in Los Angeles, California.

The title of this case is marked changed to show the name STERLING HAYDEN as that used by subject pursuant to Los Angeles Superior Court Order #693219, dated February 13, 1958, by which subject's name was changed from JOHN HAMILTON to STERLING HAYDEN.

Enclosed herewith for the Bureau are eight copies of a letterhead memorandum, setting forth pertinent information relating to captioned individual. In this regard, the Bureau has, in the past, been furnished with all pertinent information concerning subversive activities of the subject.

HAYDEN's name is not maintained in the Security Index; there is no indication of continued sympathy for the Communist movement on his part, and it is anticipated at this time that no further investigation will be conducted in this matter.

Concerning the subject's passport and travel, it is to be noted that in the past, subject has travelled over much of the world and, in connection with his employment, by a number of movie studios in the Los Angeles area, subject has done considerable travelling in the past, and probably will continue to do so in the future.

Concerning the voyage of subject aboard his schooner "Wanderer", on which he recently embarked, it would appear from newspaper articles, that his crew was selected from among some one thousand applicants and includes well known Hollywood photographers, a physician, a schoolteacher, and other individuals who might enjoy some prominence.



In April, 1951, HAYDEN testified as a cooperative witness before a public session of the House Committee on Un-American Activities in Washington, D.C., at which time he discussed his own membership in the Communist Party and furnished the identity of individuals, whom he had known therein as members.

Concerning HAYDEN's membership and activities in the Communist movement, it is to be noted that informants in the Los Angeles Office have furnished no information concerning HAYDEN subsequent to that set forth above.

In the Los Angeles "Times", dated January 25, 1959, there appeared a news item captioned "HAYDEN Defies Court, Sails For Tahiti With Children". Under this heading, there was

set out portions of a letter allegedly written by HAYDEN to the families of members of the crew of his schooner "Wanderer", of which HAYDEN is owner-master. This letter, dated January 17, 1959, stated in part, as follows:

"When and as you read this, we will be on our way with the oft-proposed voyage in spite of certain rulings of the court. I regret that such action is required, but the reasons are so obvious as to require no clarification.

"This is to assure you that there can be no legal problems for those other than myself. Mail should now be sent to "Wanderer", C/O General Post Office, Papeete, Tahiti, French Oceania."

This letter was signed with a "Hail and Farewell, STERLING HAYDEN."

This news item went on to say that HAYDEN's voyage was being made in defiance of a recent court order prohibiting HAYDEN from taking his four children on a film making round-the-world trip because of the vessel's age and frailty.

HAYDEN was also quoted as having said he planned to visit the Marqueses, Thursday Island, Bangkok and Hong Kong on the proposed voyage.

Another news item, which appeared in the Los Angeles "Times" on January 26, 1959, stated that Superior Court Judge EMIL GUMPERT on January 15, 1959, had awarded HAYDEN custody of his four children in a custody fight, following his divorce from his former wife, BETTY DE NOON HAYDEN. The Judge had ruled that Mrs. HAYDEN was not a fit and proper person to have the care and custody of these children. At the same time, he had ruled that HAYDEN's yacht "Wanderer" was not an appropriate vessel for the children to travel aboard and had prohibited any proposed trip.


This item went on to say that Mrs. HAYDEN, through her attorneys, threatened her former husband with further court action.

An item which appeared in the Los Angeles "Times" on January 28, 1959, stated that Mrs. HAYDEN had withdrawn a motion for contempt of court charges against her former husband, STERLING HAYDEN, and went on to say that Actor STERLING HAYDEN was apparently sailing blissfully toward Tahiti.

According to the Los Angeles "Times" on March 3, 1959, HAYDEN, aboard the "Wanderer" had arrived at Papeete, Tahiti.

A certain rumour has reached my attention that one of the
juvenile gangs, either in New York City, or Washington,
D. C., has renamed itself the "Sterling Hayden Gang".

I am trying to track down the truth of rumour.

In view of your numerous articles and lectures regarding the
subject of the duty of the parents to teach their children
obédience to law and order, I would appreciate it if you
would bring this letter to the attention of whatever party
in your organization might have some connection with the
problem of juvenile delinquency, and who might be able to
answer my question as to the truth of this rumour. I assume
that a considerable amount of attention is being paid by the
Bureau to the developing problem of juvenile delinquency, in
connection with the juveniles who very shortly will grow into
the adult criminal.



BOOKS

A wanderer in search of his own identity

WANDERER. By Sterling Hayden. New York: Alfred A. Knopf. \$6.95.

IF THE NAME Sterling Hayden means anything to you at all, it will probably bring up the following memories:

1. He has been a mediocre actor in almost 40 motion pictures;
2. During World War II he worked with the OSS in Yugoslavia, running supplies and men to Tito's partisans;
3. Before becoming a movie-actor he had been a sailor (in sail) from the age of 15;
4. After his return from the war he was a stoolpigeon before the Un-American Committee;
5. More recently he was engaged in a bitter custody fight over their children with his (second) former wife, during the course of which he "kidnapped" the kids and sailed them to Tahiti aboard his schooner, whose name supplies the title of this autobiography.
6. Most recently he has been active in opposition to nuclear testing and made a speech in San Francisco's Civic Center under the auspices of the Fair Play for Cuba Committee.

This book, which Hayden has long wanted to write, treats of all these aspects of his life — and it goes a great deal deeper than the surface aspects.

For it is an honest if somewhat self-conscious attempt on the part of a man who has never been much of a performer (or thinker) to think cogently, to find out who he was and is and where he is going, and to perform as a man in a world that does not suit him any more than it suits millions of people who have been less "fortunate" than Hayden.

BORN IN New Jersey, Hayden never received those gratifications in childhood or young manhood which — when they are present — help to develop a mature and stable personality. His natural father died young and there was no real contact between the two. His

step-father was an incompetent a man as you are likely to find anywhere at any time, living on borrowed money, moving his family about to avoid bill collectors and talking endlessly about the "big deal" he was about to consummate.

A stretch on an island off the coast of Maine confirmed the adolescent boy in the escape he was forced to make from something that was less than a life, and until very recently, he has been escaping ever since.

He escaped into sail, stuffed himself to the eyebrows with the romances and novels of Conrad, Melville and all the other sea-writers from Marco Polo down to Thor Heyerdahl (who wrote "Kon-Tiki"), and for many years he made a sort of living as a sailor, navigator and ship's captain, catching fish

or carrying cargo in most of the oceans of the world.

He went to Hollywood at the suggestion of a friend and they took him on because he was a "blond Viking god" who was six feet five inches tall — and appealed to women. He married Madeleine Carroll (for awhile); quit Hollywood to join the Marine Corps and the OSS and — in the Balkans — began to develop some understanding of what was going on in the world.

THAT UNDERSTANDING, apparently, was neither broad nor profound, for he joined the Communist party when a girl challenged him to get off the merry-go-round and do something; he withdrew from it within six months out of boredom and something close to fear; and when his film career (which he had hated from the word go) was jeopardized by discovery of his progressive ideas and activities, he caved in and sold out completely — going to the FBI with his Hollywood attorney, Martin Gang, then, under subpoena, to the House Un-American Committee.

In the FBI office he thinks: "This is my last chance. I wish I could rise, yawn once, and politely say: 'Gentlemen, thank you just the same.' I think of the Bosnian, Srecko Manola,

who racked up four straight years of torture. His fingers were broken across table edges — and rebroken while still unhealed. They clamped his testicles in vises, and yet he came out alive and fought again, without having compromised himself, let alone others."

Before the Un-Americans: "Counsel is all smiles. And why not? He is accustomed to facing non-collaborators who sit in the witness chair and chew him up and down. He is used to facing men and women who refuse to dance to his tune . . .

"Now counsel sounds his pitch pipe and I begin to sing. Once I begin, what follows is almost anti-climactic.

"Strange. In almost all countries a man who collaborates with those who would punish freedoms arouses the hatred of his countrymen. And yet today, in the United States of America, the way to loyalty is this — down the muddy informer's trail . . .

"I am well prepared. Few stoolies have played this hall who were better prepared than I. I have nine pages of neat notes typed out on filing cards. And on the tenth page is an index of dates, names, places, and an itemized list of donations to seditious causes dedicated to the liquidation of segregation and racial prejudice and other minor hatreds . . ."

THE COMMITTEE chairman and members praise him as a patriotic American citizen whose testimony is "courageous and forthright."

"Other voices mumble jingoistic drivel . . . And above this crowded room like a mirage stands a group of people who once were friends of mine. They look at me with grave and saddened faces. No one says a word. I think of Larry Parks, who not ten days ago sat in this very chair and by pleading with the Committee — by begging them not to make him crawl in the mud — consigned himself to oblivion. Well, I hadn't made that mistake. Not by a goddamned sight. I was a real daddy longlegs of a worm when it came to crawling."

As a writer Hayden is self-conscious and sometimes quite "arty" but he shows a distinct talent for narration and an ear for language that bodes well

for any future work in this genre.

And he has taken a step that no other man who has gone this route has ever done: he is trying to make amends for his betrayal of his friends; for his betrayal of himself. He abandoned a career he loathed, but which was bringing him an income of \$160,000 a year when he walked out and told the motion picture producers that they could force him to report for work, but no law could make him act.

In a telephone interview with Paul Speegle of The S. F. News-Call Bulletin (April 17, 1963), Hayden was quoted as saying:

"I messed myself up. I spent a lifetime selling out. I always hated acting but I kept on acting. I was a commuter on a tinsel train. I was a card-carrying Communist for a month — June of '46. I think I'm the only guy who ever bought a schooner and joined the Communist party in the same week.

"I left the party but named names to the Committee. I was a rat, a stoolie, and the names I named — some of these close friends — were blacklisted and deprived of their livelihood. It would be a different story with me and the Committee now . . ."

About this book, several months before publication, Hayden told Speegle: "The book's about the struggle of a tortured individual to be himself in a society which is hostile to breakaways from the herd. How much is you, how much is them? It's a rough question and you've got to keep asking it.

"If (it) has any use . . . it will show that it's possible to break the pattern. To grab yourself by the scruff of the neck and break your life in half — even though you're not sure where you're going.

"You might say that I don't have any answers, but I've started asking myself the right questions."

Hayden recently made a film in England ("Dr. Strangelove, or How I Learned to Stop Worrying and Love the Bomb") but it is a film of a different or-

der: it conforms to some of the ideas Hayden has developed and is still promoting.

He seems to be financially comfortable at the moment and his book will be a best-seller. But it is a book dedicated to "Warwick M. Tompkins and Rockwell Kent, sailormen, artists, radicals, who chose Cape Horn . . . By one who chose Tahiti."

It is the book of a man who proclaims himself a radical and a socialist today (in press, on radio and TV interviews and in public speeches) and who may yet choose the passage around the Horn himself.

The PW is a West Coast communist newspaper published weekly in San Francisco, California.

The "San Francisco News-Call Bulletin" in its issue of April 28, 1964, page 15, carried a story datelined Buffalo, New York. This article related that HAYDEN was in Buffalo, New York, as a prelude to hearings by a Subcommittee of the HCUA to be held in Buffalo. HAYDEN is quoted as charging that the HCUA "practically destroyed the Hollywood film industry." HAYDEN also stated in this article that the Communist Party has never been an effective force in American politics and he said he was too much of an individualist to be an active member in the organization. He stated that he had belonged to the CP for a period of six months.

The "San Francisco Examiner," a daily San Francisco newspaper, in its issue of June 17, 1964, carried an article relating that on June 16, 1964, HAYDEN had received a sentence of probation for one year and a \$220.00 fine for his participation in a sit-in demonstration on Van Ness Avenue, San Francisco, on April 11, 1964, after pleading nolo contendere. The article continued that HAYDEN, at the time of sentencing, asked the court's permission to go to Rome in July to make a movie and permission was granted by the court to HAYDEN.
