Reference is made to recent instructions emanating from the Bureau requesting employees to furnish the Bureau with interesting cases or incidents which might be appropriate for publicity purposes if the Bureau deemed advisable.

Special Agent EUGENE GALEN COOMBS of this office desires to call the Bureau's attention to an incident which is reported in the case entitled [REDACTED] Milwaukee origin.

[REDACTED] information received by letter from a woman in Milwaukee, Wisconsin. The information furnished [REDACTED] by this woman was to the effect that the German Zeppelin HINDENBURG would be destroyed in its crossing of the Atlantic Ocean from Germany to the United States. This letter, it will be noted, was dated prior to the Lakehurst disaster, when the giant Zeppelin HINDENBURG was destroyed as it was attempting to land at its airport at Lakehurst.

The correspondence in [REDACTED] possession indicated that he had called on a woman who furnished the information and whose name is contained in the Milwaukee Field Division file of this case, and that she admitted to [REDACTED] that she was a Spiritualist and that she and another Spiritualist had had a vision at one of their Spiritualist meetings. She stated that the vision which they had experienced indicated to them very clearly that the HINDENBURG Zeppelin would be destroyed on its next crossing of the Atlantic and she felt it her duty to warn the German authorities immediately.

When [REDACTED] reported that the woman and man who had the vision were Spiritualists, [REDACTED] gave no further consideration to the matter and felt the report was unreliable.

The correspondence in [redacted] possession reflects that immediately following the Lakehurst disaster, [redacted] was instructed by telegraph or telephone to immediately recontact the informants for any additional information concerning the disaster that they might be able to furnish. The file further reflects that at the time [redacted] recontacted the woman informant in this matter, as he had been instructed to do, it was so soon after the destruction of the Zeppelin HINDENBURG that the informants had not learned of the disaster through either radio broadcasts or the newspapers.

[redacted] in contacting the informants made the mistake of immediately advising them that the Zeppelin HINDENBURG had been destroyed. The woman who originally furnished the information relative to her vision, and the man spiritualist who had the vision with her, both became immediately hilariously exuberant over the fact that their visions had come true. The correspondence in [redacted] possession reflects that they were both so pleased that they worked themselves up to such an emotional state they lost consciousness (passed out), and [redacted] attempted for approximately two hours to bring them back to consciousness in order that he might interview them further relative to this disaster. [redacted] was unable to arouse them, and finally left the woman informant's residence without obtaining the desired additional information.

It will be recalled that the destruction of the Zeppelin HINDENBURG at Lakehurst, New Jersey, was one of the greatest news stories which occurred in the United States prior to the outbreak of the present war. It is believed that this instance might furnish information upon which a very interesting newspaper feature story might be based.

It is respectfully suggested that the Bureau consider the advisability of furnishing this information to one of the Milwaukee newspapers in order that they might base a feature story on this if they so desire.

### BACKGROUND:

We have received from Little, Brown and Company Publishers, a set of bound galley proofs of captioned book. The book is on the subject of the disaster which befell the dirigible "Hindenburg" at Lakehurst, New Jersey, in 1937.

### INFORMATION IN BUFILES:

Bufiles disclose that on 7-28-60, the author of the book, A. A. Hoehling, called the Bureau and spoke to Mr. Leinbaugh. Hoehling requested any help the Bureau could give in connection with his book. Mr. Hoehling was advised that the Bureau did not investigate the Hindenburg disaster but did establish liaison with the Navy and Commerce Departments who did investigate the crash. (62-48190)

### EXAMINATION OF GALLEYS:

The bound galleys of Mr. Hoehling's book disclose a number of references to the FBI, none of which are derogatory.

The book is a fictionalized, blow-by-blow account of the last flight of the Zeppelin Hindenburg. It put forth the theory that the giant dirigible was sabotaged by exploding a photographic flashbulb inside a hydrogen gas cell. This conclusion, however, is pure speculation. The book contains nothing to prove any such occurrence.

### OBSERVATION:

Since this work puts forth a speculative, unproven theory concerning the Hindenburg disaster and since we furnished relatively little assistance to the author, it would be most unwise for the Bureau to comment in any way concerning this book.

### RECOMMENDATION:

That the attached innocuous letter, acknowledging receipt of the bound galleys, be sent to Little, Brown and Company.





In this connection, may I again point out that I am by no means interested in any political backgrounds this case may involve, but - according to the endeavors of our review - solely in the work of your Bureau and the judgement of US criminologists.

Highly esteeming your personality and the police work performed by your Bureau I hardly need to add that any other reports, articles or photos are always welcome.
