The following systems are available for New Office Space which would permit dialing of other telephones in the Office and direct dialing of outside calls from appropriate extensions.

1. Call Director System. This system has the advantage that outside calls can be answered from any extension position, which factor would be important in handling incoming calls during non-business hours, however, it has certain limitations in its adaptability to "conference calls". It is also the most expensive system and it is not believed its features warrant this cost. The installation charge would be approximately \$1,041.50 with a monthly charge of about \$485.00. There would be a termination agreement of \$3,960.00 for a period of 18 months.

2. The new compact Dial PBX is the most versatile permitting arrangements for answering of incoming calls from various points in the office and the routing of this call to the proper extension. This feature is most desirable for use during non-working hours. The connection charge for that system would be \$212.00 and the monthly charge approximately \$442.00. There is a termination agreement in the amount of \$1,400.00 for one year on this equipment.

A stand-by battery to permit operation of this equipment during a power failure is available for an extra charge of \$60.00 per month, however, it is expected that an emergency power system would be provided by the

sound agent in this office at very little cost and thereby saving practically all of this \$60.00 per month.

3. The Conventional Type Switchboard with dial equipment would have an installation charge of \$252.00 and an approximate cost of \$340.00 per month. This equipment requires a five year termination agreement in the amount of \$5,700.00. The size and complexity of this equipment requires an equipment room measuring 9 X 12 feet with a 9 foot ceiling. The telephone company has pointed out that the equipment room provided at our new office space is not nearly large enough for this equipment. The equipment has the added disadvantage of being cumbersome in the proper routing of incoming calls during non-business hours when the board is not manned by an operator.

The Bureau is requested to approve the Compact Dial PBX for our new office space. The telephone company has requested as much notice as possible as to the type of equipment desired so that this equipment can be ordered and installed before we occupy the new space.

The Telecommunications Division of the General Services Administration (GSA), Washington, D. C., has advised that GSA will install in the new Federal Building a consolidated Government switchboard. The consolidated Government switchboard in the new building will be of the type whereby operators do not handle the incoming and outgoing telephone calls since these calls are all dialed exclusively.

It is desired that you contact and discuss with the local GSA representatives the possibility of having your telephone service off the new consolidated switchboard in the new building since it is felt that your telephone needs can be served satisfactorily from one of the newer-type GSA switchboards at a substantial saving to the Bureau.

Report your findings to the Bureau together with a comparison of the cost of the GSA telephone service with your current fixed monthly cost and the fixed monthly cost of the most economical system proposed by the telephone company for the new space. Set forth the number of trunks you have in service and the number of telephone extensions together with any anticipated need for additional telephone trunk or extension capacity you will need over the next five years.

Agency telephones for pertinent period are as shown
below:

The above figures reflect an average savings of
approximately \$90.00 per month on intrastate telephone calls
through the use of Wats. This includes savings on resident
agency costs and effected by calling each resident agency
on wats at least once each day on a scheduled basis. At this
time, or a later time by appointment, these resident agencies
in the Western District of Oklahoma, can also handle these
telephone calls on business with the U. S. Attorney's Office
in Oklahoma City through conference jacks on the switchboard.
Other emergency calls from resident agencies and road trip
agents are limited to the minimum charge by calling the
agent back on the wats line.

During the last month this office has had an
extremely large number of Departmental and Bureau Applicant
cases, all with short deadlines requiring handling by
telephone both as to setting out leads and in some cases
dictation of reports by telephone. Also during this period,
extensive investigation was conducted on a car ring case in

Your total intrastate long-distance telephone costs should be examined each month to determine whether the WATS line is affording a saving in these costs. Any doubt as to whether or not the WATS line is continuing to afford a saving should be resolved by keeping a log of essential calls made over the WATS line to determine what the cost of these calls would have been if made over long-distance toll circuits.

The intrastate long-distance calls not made by WATS in the amount of \$177.00 appear to be excessive in view of your procedure of calling each resident agency by WATS at least once each day on a scheduled basis. Make every effort to reduce to the very minimum necessary the number of such calls.

[REDACTED] has now appeared at [REDACTED] seeking employment. [REDACTED] stated he does not wish to hire [REDACTED] if he is a fugitive, but he desires to cooperate with the FBI. [REDACTED] stated he would employ [REDACTED] until such time as he was contacted by the FBI with information as to whether or not [REDACTED] location is still sought. *(b)(7)(c)-1*

ACTION TAKEN

SUBJECT: [redacted] ASTORIA, LONG ISLAND, NEW YORK

By referral from the Director's office on 7-14-61, captioned individual was telephonically interviewed by SA John M. Reed, Crime Research Section.

[redacted] had a rambling story concerning an attack by two unknown young males on two of her daughters, ages 13 and 15. She related how the attack was physical rather than sexual but felt that it would have resulted in the rape of one, if not both, of her daughters if her 19-year-old son had not seen what was going on and prevented any further trouble. She said the attack in which both of her daughters were fairly well beaten up took place right in front of their house. She described the area in which she lives as a "jungle."

When queried as to the purpose of her call to the FBI, [redacted] advised she wanted the 14th Precinct of the New York City Police Department investigated because she felt that they were not conducting an unbiased investigation. She said she is of Irish descent and the investigating officers appeared to be of Jewish extraction and from what her children have told her, the boys that committed the attack were also Jewish; therefore, her comments about the unbiased investigation.

It was explained to her the Bureau could be of no assistance with her complaint, as this was an investigation of a purely local matter. This did not deter [redacted] who continued on for an additional five or ten minutes, during which time she made derogatory statements about local courts, in New York, her ancestors, her relatives that fought in World War I and World War II, and the fact that she is studying judo to protect her children. She abruptly terminated the conversation.

A woman who identified herself as Miss Mary Martin telephoned the Bureau on July 27, 1961, and spoke to SA John W. O'Beirne of the Crime Research Section on referral from the Director's Office.

She said that she wished most urgently to talk to the Director and when advised that the Director was unavailable an effort was made to determine the purpose of her call. She at first persistently refused to divulge her reason for calling. After a lengthy conversation in which she expounded upon her loyalty to the United States Government, it was deviously ascertained that Miss Martin lives with another woman and her daughter and that this woman has been distraught because of the actions being taken against her by "communists" in her neighborhood. The caller said that she feels that some Special Agents of the FBI and members of the police forces are disloyal to the United States. When pressed for details concerning this allegation, she could not be specific and stated that something must be wrong because the communists are making so much headway in the world. As an example of the "communist" persecution to which she and her friend with whom she resides are subjected, she cited an instance wherein one of her neighbors deliberately left the keys to their mailbox in place on two occasions. She said this was "obviously" an effort to frame her and her friend.

She continued to refuse to divulge her identity saying she is employed in the United States Government and feels that her complaint would operate against her if she revealed her identity.

Bufiles could not be searched due to the paucity of information concerning the identity of the caller. She admitted that the name Mary Martin was fictitious.

He further stated that he thought the Company was wasting Government funds by not having hardware needed by the men in their work readily available.

It was explained to [redacted] that the matters of which he spoke were not within the jurisdiction of the Bureau, but he desired that his call be made a matter of record here.

He indicated he had been working for some 15 years on determining the operations of the underworld in Las Vegas and that his information dealt with an article published in the "Reader's Digest" during 1959. At no time did McLean make any definite statement regarding information about criminal activities and his comments degenerated into nothing more than a jumble of meaningless words.

There are numerous references in Bufiles on the name William McLean, none of which could be positively identified with the call.

RECOMMENDATION:

That an appropriate notation be made in the Crime Records Division regarding McLean.

He related that he had been in a place of "pleasure" namely the Jefferson Bowling Alley coffee shop in Culver City where he had been waited on by two women and did not like the way they talked. It was, in his opinion, adverse and against America and he considered them the type of people, "who would subjugate themselves to the point of overthrowing the Government."

He described the first as a white female, five feet seven to eight inches tall, dark hair, in her forties who appeared to have a "smirk" but was cordial. He described the second woman as a white female, twenty to thirty years old, about five feet four inches tall with dark hair.

When questioned as to specifics he could think of nothing other than insisting that in his own mind they ought to be investigated and in his opinion their conversation was adverse.

When asked if he had attempted to make his complaint to our Los Angeles Division he claimed that the reason he called the Bureau was because he could get no satisfaction from the Agent on duty there. All he got was "static" and that the Agent on duty attempted to "push words in my mouth."

Brown stated he has been told that his Indian name is Jack A. Brown and that he is supposed to have money coming to him from the Bureau of Indian Affairs. He alleged an "authoritative source" had told him there is several hundred thousand dollars deposited in his name at the Whitney National Bank in New Orleans but bank officials refuse to confirm this. He stated he wanted the Director to promptly verify his Indian name so that he could collect immediately a few thousand dollars. He was informed that this matter is not within our jurisdiction.

She stated she was contacting your office because at one time she was employed in the National Park Service and had known your brother. [REDACTED] appeared to be quite excited, stating that recently she had been getting a number of phone calls at her residence telephone and when she answered the telephone nobody replied on the other end. These calls were quite numerous and occurred throughout the evening and during the night. She stated she was contacting the FBI because she felt that this was a matter that the FBI would handle.

It was carefully explained to [REDACTED] that this was not a matter over which the FBI would have jurisdiction. She was told that it was a matter that would appear to be within the jurisdiction of the local law enforcement agencies. She was also told that, of course, it might be advisable to contact the telephone company concerning the possibility of getting a new telephone number if she so desires. She said she had contacted the telephone company business office and was unable to get much satisfaction and because of business reasons did not at this time wish to change her telephone number at home. At the conclusion of the conversation, she clearly understood that this Bureau did not have jurisdiction in such matters and would not be in a position to take any action.

Captioned individual telephoned the extra duty agent and without introduction launched into a monolog concerning the M-14 rifle. He was asked to furnish his name and refused to do so claiming he had already made this information known to the operator. He was told that the agent had not received this information and he was again asked to give his name. He became indignant and abusive whereupon he was told that unless he wished to identify himself or hold the line while the agent checked with the operator, there was no point in continuing the conversation. The caller hung up.

By checking with the operator the agent ascertained the information set forth in the caption as well as the fact that [REDACTED] said he was staying at the [REDACTED]. The operator also advised that [REDACTED] was then talking to SA Paul F. Shea on duty in the Investigative Division.

SA Shea advised that he talked to [REDACTED] who told him that as a result of a conversation with a Marine Corps Officer he met that night he was inquiring as to whether the M-14 rifle was classified by the U. S. Government. He was told that the Bureau did not decide data of this type, and he was referred to the Marine Corps for assistance.

[REDACTED] impressed both the writer and SA Shea as being slightly intoxicated at the time of his call.

Bureau files were checked and no record of previous calls from [REDACTED] was indicated. He may be identical with a person of the same name who was subject of a White Slave complaint lodged by the mother of his 17 year old paramour in 1941. Prosecution was declined since there was no evidence of commercialism. (31-61192)
