This is to advise of allegations made that captioned group, a newly formed anticommunist organization, will use violence, if necessary, to combat disruptions on college campuses and to advise that this matter will be followed closely.

BACKGROUND:

We have received information that the NYA, whose headquarters are in Washington, D. C., was recently formed by youthful conservatives as an aftermath of the George Wallace Presidential campaign and looking toward the backing of a conservative candidate in 1972. At a recent meeting of this group in New York, the aims and purposes were stated as "the opposing of the use of drugs on college campuses; the neutralization of black power; the preserving of western civilization and the expulsion of communists from college campuses."

In view of the possibility that violence could take place as a result of the activities of this organization, instructions are being furnished pertinent offices to discreetly follow the activities of the group until this matter is resolved. Based on available information, Bureau indices fail to disclose that any of the national officers are members of known white hate groups. Information developed is being furnished pertinent military agencies, Secret Service, the Civil Rights Division, Criminal Division and Internal Security Division of the Department.

We are conducting discreet inquiry to determine whether the group warrants investigation as a white hate group. The charges [REDACTED] refers to apparently arose out of a recent syndicated column by Drew Pearson and Jack Anderson regarding the activities of the Liberty Lobby. [REDACTED] not being addressed as National Chairman of National Youth Alliance as there may be controversy over its leadership.






AU Rally

New Group Vows SDS Battle

A newly formed student group, the National Youth Alliance, yesterday pledged here to defend university campuses against Students for a Democratic Society and black power advocates.

Louis T. Byers, who said he was a former John Birch Society coordinator, told a press conference that the group was drawing members from the ranks of the Youth for Wallace movement. He said the Youth Alliance would oust SDS members from occupied buildings and would intervene physically if black power groups sought to block class attendance.

Earlier, a short rally by the New AU, a coalition of student groups, to protest a restraining order against campus disorder attracted less than 100 listeners. However, New AU spokesman Alex Alay drew the most attention when he repeated what had been rumored for several days — the removal today of Jerry Rubin and fellow Yippies for a nude-in at the college quad.

And last night at American University there was a brief scuffle when supporters sought to prevent hecklers from interrupting conservative editor William F. Buckley Jr.'s speech. After student body president Luis Simmons restored order, Mr. Buckley, unsuccessful candidate for New York City mayor, argued that SDS should be confronted by other viewpoints on campus.

Meanwhile, two class boycotts at Howard University continued without signs of a letup.

The sociology and anthropology students, who occupied the department offices Monday, moved into the temporary office of department chairman G. Franklin Edwards yesterday. Graduate students in Howard's School of Social Work also maintained their strike.

Both groups are seeking more courses about poverty in the ghetto, more black professors and an equal voice in decision-making.

I doubt very seriously that [REDACTED] has any information of substance. It is also doubtful that the above-mentioned calls represent matters within FBI jurisdiction. Nevertheless, I recall quite vividly the calls that [REDACTED] made to us in the recent [REDACTED] case wherein we immediately referred the matter to the Department of Justice and the Department took no action for a long time. Considering the facts, I recommend that we have the young men in question interviewed for record purposes. We then can go on record with a letter to the Department following the interviews.



For information concerning the National Youth Alliance, refer to Bureau letter, May 5, 1969, to Washington Field, with copy to New York Office, captioned "National Youth Alliance (NYA), Racial Matters - White Hate Groups."

The New York and Washington Field Offices should arrange immediate interviews with the above-named individuals to determine if they have any information concerning possible extortion matters or any facts regarding subversive organizations wherein investigation would be within our jurisdiction. Results of interviews should be submitted by letterhead memorandum and no investigation, other than the initial interview, should be conducted without specific instruction from the Bureau.

NOTE: This is based on memorandum Mr. DeLoach to Mr. Tolson, dated 5-1-69. Data concerning the National Youth Alliance is contained in 157-12589. This organization, headquartered in Washington, D. C., allegedly has as its aims and purposes "the opposing of the use of drugs on college campuses; the neutralization of Black Power; the preserving of Western civilization; and the expulsion of communists from college campuses." Bureau letter dated March 5, 1969, instructed activities of the National Youth Alliance be followed through established sources only.

The Liberty Lobby, mentioned in referenced memorandum, has never been investigated by the FBI, and it is self-described as "a pressure group for patriotism--the only lobby registered with Congress which is wholly dedicated to the advancement of governmental policies based on our Constitution and conservative principles." The Friday, May 2, 1969, edition of "The Washington Post," page D-15, contained an article written by Jack Anderson and Drew Pearson entitled, "Campus Extremists Worry Nixon," which referred in part to the NYA. This article noted that John Acord, Dennis McMahon and Louis Andrews had been forced out of the NYA by Carto, and that Pat Tifer, a Wayne University student, had been elected to head NYA.

According to this article, Tifer wrote a letter to Carto stating that his election to NYA clearly showed that NYA would not accept a "Philosophy of Nazism." Also, Tifer stated that he was ordering a halt to the distribution of the book, "Imperium." This article concluded by noting that Carto had "his stooges" in NYA send Tifer a telegram declaring that Tifer had been ousted.

W.E.B. DuBOIS CLUBS OF AMERICA

A source advised that on October 26-27, 1963, a conference of members of the Communist Party, USA (CPUSA), including national functionaries, met in Chicago, Illinois, for the purpose of setting in motion forces for the establishment of a new national Marxist-oriented youth organization which would hunt for the most peaceful transition to socialism. The delegates were told that it would be reasonable to assume that the young socialists attracted into this new organization would eventually pass into the CP itself.

A second source has advised that the founding convention for the new youth organization was held from June 19-21, 1964, at 150 Golden Gate Avenue, San Francisco, California, at which time the name W.E.B. DuBois Clubs of America (DCA) was adopted. Approximately 500 delegates from throughout the United States attended this convention.

The second source advised in September, 1966, that Mike Zagarell, CPUSA Youth Director, stated that in Negro communities the Party still supported the plan to build "left" socialist centers and to solidify the Party base through the DCA. This source also advised in September, 1966, that Daniel Rubin, CPUSA National Organizational Secretary, stated the Party believes the DCA should have a working class outlook and be a mass organization favorable to socialism, socialist countries and Marxism, and in April, 1967, Gus Hall, CPUSA General Secretary, indicated that the DCA primary emphasis should be on developing mass resistance to the draft.

A third source advised in September, 1967, that Jarvis Tyner was elected Chairman of the DCA on September 10, 1967, near the conclusion of the Third National Convention of the DCA held in New York, New York, from September 8-10, 1967.

A fourth source advised on July 26, 1968, that Jarvis Tyner continues in his position as Chairman of the DCA.

This fourth source also advised on July 26, 1968, that Jarvis Tyner is a member of the National Committee of the CPUSA.

This fourth source further advised on July 26, 1968, that the headquarters of the DCA is located at 34 West 17th Street, New York, New York.

INDIANA UNIVERSITY COMMITTEE TO END THE WAR IN VIETNAM (IUCEWV)

A source advised on June 9, 1967 that the Indiana University Committee to End the War in Vietnam (IUCEWV) was officially registered as a campus organization at Indiana University with fifteen members on March 17, 1966 by Stephen Michael Cagan, a graduate student of Indiana University. The source stated that the constitution of this Committee filed with the University stated, "We shall be represented on the National Coordinating Committee to End the War in Vietnam (NCCCEWVN) and shall work with any organizations or individuals sharing our goals. Excepting the National Coordinating Committee to End the War in Vietnam, we have no connection with any previously constituted political, religious, educational, or social group."

A second source advised on July 10, 1967 that Stephen Michael Cagan was the organizer and secretary of the Indiana University Chapter of the W. E. B. Du Bois Clubs of American (IU DCA), when registered at Indiana University on February 7, 1966. CAGAN subsequently left his position as secretary of the IU DCA in order to organize the IU CEWV. Cagan stated that IU CEWV will be used as a "front organization" for the IUSCA for the purpose of holding demonstrations without organizational involvement of this organization. Activity continues at the present time.

The second source advised on September 20, 1967 that Cagan left IU in August, 1967 and Russell Lloyd Block was elected chairman of the IU CEWV on September 19, 1967. Block was assisted by Mark Eldon Ritchey as a full-time worker for the IU CEWV.

The second source advised on July 24, 1968 that Block and Ritchey had become interested in the Young Socialist Alliance (YSA) and the Socialist Workers Party (SWP). Block and Ritchey swung the influence of the IU CEWV from the W. E. B. Du Bois Clubs of American and the Communist Party, USA, over to the Trotskyite influence of the YSA and the SWP in the second semester of the 1967-68 academic year at IU. Even though new officers were elected on February 6, 1968, Block and Ritchey still run the IU CEWV from "behind the scenes."

APPENDIX

INDIANA UNIVERSITY CHAPTER W. E. B. DU BOIS CLUBS OF AMERICA (IU-DCA)

A source advised on April 11, 1966 that the Indiana University Chapter, W. E. B. Du Bois Clubs of America (IU-DCA), was officially registered at Indiana University on February 7, 1966 with fifteen members.

Source advised that Gaylord King, Chairman, on February 1, 1966, made application for registration, at which time he made available an official written statement to the Director of Student Activities, Indiana University, as follows:

"The Indiana University Chapter is a full chapter affiliate of the national organization — the W. E. B. Du Bois Clubs of America. We can initiate our own action or decide not to carry out a particular action project of the national, but are bound by national policy. Statements of the National Executive Committee are also statements of policy for us."

The above source further advised that although Gaylord King, Chairman, applied for University recognition of the IU-DCA, Stephen Cagan was actually the organizer and secretary of this group. Cagan subsequently resigned this position from the IU-DCA in order to organize the Indiana University Committee to End the War in Vietnam.

A second source advised on May 3, 1966 that the IU-DCA sponsored the appearance at Indiana University on March 10, 1966, of Hugo Sterling Fowler, National Chairman of the W. E. B. Du Bois Clubs of America. In addition, this group sponsored the appearance of Herbert Aptheker, leading CP functionary and CP theoretician, at Indiana University on May 3, 1966.

This second source advised on February 20, 1968 that the IU-DCA had no significant organizational activity at Indiana University and became defunct at Indiana University on February 11, 1968.

A third source advised on April 25, 1968 that the IU-DCA became defunct at Indiana University on February 11, 1968 and the former leaders of the IU-DCA joined the Communist Party, USA and formed a CP Club at Indiana University on April 23, 1968.

A third source advised on December 12, 1967 that Ritchey and Block both said that they would actively support the campaign of the SWP during the 1968 Presidential campaign. This source further advised on March 13, 1968 that Russell Lloyd Block joined the YSA as a member-at-large at IU.

APPENDIX

STUDENTS FOR A DEMOCRATIC SOCIETY

The Students for a Democratic Society (SDS), as it is known today, came into being at a founding convention held at Port Huron, Michigan, in June, 1962. The SDS is an association of young people on the left and has a current program of protesting the draft, promoting a campaign for youth to develop a conscientious objector status, denouncing United States intervention in the war in Vietnam, and to "radically transform" the university community, and provide for its complete control by students. Gus Hall, General Secretary, Communist Party, USA, when interviewed by a representative of United Press International in San Francisco, California, on May 14, 1965, described the SDS as a part of the "responsible left" which the Party has "going for us." At the June, 1965, SDS National Convention, an anticommunist proviso was removed from the SDS constitution. In the October 7, 1966, issue of "New Left Notes," the official publication of SDS, an SDS spokesman stated that there are some communists in SDS and they are welcome. The national headquarters of this organization as of July 24, 1968, was located in Room 206, 1608 West Madison Street, Chicago, Illinois.

Any information received concerning Nazi-type activities or information indicating student agitation should be furnished the Bureau and WFO in form suitable for dissemination.

NOTE:

The NYA is the successor organization to the "Youth for Wallace" (YFW), a group of students active during the presidential campaign of George Wallace. Membership has been estimated at anywhere from 1,000 to 10,000. This matter was originally looked into in view of allegations that this right-wing group intended to motivate violence on campuses. No active investigation was conducted and no incidents of violence or reaction to violence by leftists noted.

We have never received information that [REDACTED] is a believer in Nazi dogma. He has been extremely active in right-wing causes for many years and has been attacked by [REDACTED] many times. It is not felt that active investigation should be conducted at this time in view of the lack of corroborating information that the NYA is in fact a violence-prone neo-Nazi group. We are, therefore, instructing offices possessing chapters within their territories to remain alert for any information indicating such activities, but to conduct no investigation concerning the group without prior Bureau authority. These instructions are a continuation of previously issued instructions.



NATIONAL RENAISSANCE PARTY

On May 29, 1968, a source advised that the National Renaissance Party (NRP) was founded in 1949, by JAMES H. MADOLE, who continues to serve as its National Director and is in complete control of the NRP.

The source further stated that the NRP has its headquarters in the residence of JAMES H. MADOLE at 10 West 90th Street, New York, New York. Weekly meetings are held at this location on Thursday evenings.

The source described the NRP as an anti-Negro, anti-Semitic and neo-Fascist organization.

This source stated on July 28, 1966, that JAMES H. MADOLE, as of October, 1965, distributed a printed "program of the NRP", which program had as its announced purpose the establishment of a "Racial Nationalist State". According to the program, this would be accomplished by calling a Constitutional Convention to ratify the necessary amendments to the United States Constitution in order to carry out the NRP program for the establishment of a "Racial Nationalist State".

This source further advised that as of May 29, 1968, this "program of the NRP" remains in effect and that the anti-Negro and anti-Semitic nature of the NRP is exemplified by the following excerpts from this program:

1. Enact and rigidly enforce legislation to restrict the benefits of American citizenship to mentally and genetically sound members of the Caucasian race.
2. Enact legislation to prohibit intermarriage between white and non-white.
3. The Jewish race shall be deprived by suitable legislation of their American citizenship and shall henceforth be prohibited from holding any professional, political or educational posts within the Racial Nationalist State. The Jew constitutes an alien virus in our national bloodstream and, as such, he must be purged from our cultural, economic, and political life.
4. Enact legislation to hasten the repatriation of American Negroes to the newly independent black nations on the African continent under the auspices and guidance of black nationalist leadership in the United States.

NATIONAL RENAISSANCE PARTY

5. The establishment of a selective immigration policy whose primary purpose is to attract the best European racial stock to the North American Continent in order to utilize their vast energy and talent in the task of creating a dynamic, expanding White Empire capable of withstanding the encroachments of the primitive, colored world led by the Oriental colossus, Red China.

STUDENTS FOR A DEMOCRATIC SOCIETY

The Students for a Democratic Society (SDS), as it is known today, came into being at a founding convention held at Port Huron, Michigan, in June, 1962. The SDS is an association of young people on the left and has a current program of protesting the draft, promoting a campaign for youth to develop a conscientious objector status, denouncing United States intervention in the war in Vietnam, and to "radically transform" the university community, and provide for its complete control by students. GUS HALL, General Secretary, Communist Party, USA, when interviewed by a representative of United Press International in San Francisco, California, on May 14, 1965, described the SDS as a part of the "responsible left" which the Party has "going for us". At the June, 1965, SDS National Convention, an anticommunist proviso was removed from the SDS constitution. In the October 7, 1966, issue of "New Left Notes", the official publication of SDS, an SDS spokesman stated that there are some Communists in SDS and they are welcome. The national headquarters of this organization as of July 24, 1968, was located in Room 206, 1608 West Madison Street, Chicago, Illinois.

The Student Right:

Racist, Martial, Insular

Behind the perpetually locked door of a Connecticut Avenue office sits a large affable man who is organizing to meet campus violence with counter-violence.

His offensive is rooted in a complex philosophy, propelled by a number of contemporary rightist authors, that "Western civilization" is imperiled and must be preserved from alien influence. That means mostly Jews, Negroes and other non-northern European minorities.

"On the campus, there's too much education and not enough action," summarizes Louis T. Byers, 37, energetic organizer of the 2000-strong National Youth Alliance, post-election holdover of the Youth for Wallace movement.

Byers' plan: to mobilize cadres of rightist students to crush radical left action such as the seizure of buildings. This will be done first by applying pressure on college administrations, alumni and police to stop the action. If that fails, the cadres will physically intervene themselves.

The cadres will be trained in the "martial arts," he says, meaning karate, judo, wrestling and boxing.

"We intend to be a permanent force on the American scene," Byers said in an interview. He envisions not only a continuous NYA surveillance of campus life but also a network of public relations programs, electioneering and "white studies" curriculums at major universities.

Courses in white studies will include, he says, genetics, eugenics, ethnology, biology and anthropology.

"The purpose of these will be to demonstrate the nature of mankind," he says.

"The equality myth will be exploded forever."

Byers' inspiration: the 619-page book "Imperium," by Francis Parker Yockey, a philosophical treatise extolling the virtues of Western civilization, particularly as manifested in northern Europe. It defines Jews, Negroes, Indians and other assorted minorities as "parasites and "distorters" in the Western body and calls for fulfillment of the West's "cultural imperative" to remain pure, separate and dominant.

"Imperium is a great book," says Byers. "I read it once a year."

The philosophy of the hard right appears different from that of the conventional conservative right in three fundamental ways:

- It is overtly and unashamedly racist.
- It believes in centralized authoritarian economics, not laissez faire.
- It disapproves of involvement in foreign wars or territorial expansion, especially when they result in racial or ethnic admixtures between the conquerers and the vanquished.

center for organizing and expanding NYA, but also a disseminating point for a large stock of Yockeyist "Western culture" literature.

He has ordered 35,000 paperback copies of "Imperium" from Noontide Press in Torrance, Calif., and hopes to offer other books by anthropologists, economists and philosophers with sympathetic views.

He says he is now recruiting new NYA members through a 15,000-person mailing list of former Youth for Wallace campaigners. Annual dues range from \$3 to \$10. Members wear an "inequality" button displaying the mathematical symbol for "unequal."

Additional financial support comes from appeals to persons on a second mailing list of 200,000 adults, he says, as well as the residue of some \$45,000 left over from the Youth for Wallace campaign last fall.

"We have no angels, no big money supporting us," he says. "We consider \$20 a big contribution."

Byers, a fast talking, articulate Philadelphian, acquired the Youth for Wallace mailing lists and funds through his work in the campaign for George C. Wallace in Pennsylvania last fall.

"I was an adviser to Dale Milford (Wallace's field operations man in the western sector of that state) and worked with the Youth for Wallace groups there," Byers explains.

Immediately after the November elections, he says, "The Youth for Wallace people came to Washington, and we set up the National Youth Alliance.

"We wanted a continuum in the leadership and the financing," he says.

Four-Point Program

At the first organizational meeting, NYA's four-point program was established: to oppose dangerous drugs and "run those who push them off the campus, physically if necessary" to "neutralize and overcome black power";

An article in the current issue of the American Mercury by Dennis C. McMahon, listed as NYA vice president, is more explicit:

... destruction and annihilation of the campus red front has been sorely needed for many years . . . The NYA will meet violence with violence . . . Tar and feathers will be our answer to the pot pusher . . . The left will be forced to cower in the sewers underground as they hear the marching steps of the NYA above them."

American Mercury is now a quarterly magazine published by Noontide Press, specializing in Yockeyist writings and stern anti-communism.

Adult Advisers

Byers also handpicked a five-member adult advisory board to lend NYA stature. Byers calls the members "hard-core patriots."

The anti-Defamation League of B'nai B'rith and Group Research, Inc., both of which maintain files on right wing personalities, describe them as strongly racist, anti-Semitic or both. The five are:

• Revilo P. Oliver, 59, Urbana, Ill., professor of classical languages, University of Illinois, former John Birch Society figure and associate editor of the society's magazine, American Opinion.

• Richard B. Cotten, 50, Bakersfield, Calif., broadcaster and editor-publisher; his radio commentary and monthly publication are called "Conservative Viewpoint."

• John G. Crommelin, 66, Wetumpka, Ala., retired Navy rear admiral, who was an unsuccessful candidate for U.S. President in 1960 under the National States Rights Party and unsuccessful Democratic candidate for U.S. Senate in 1962.

• Pedro A. Del Valle, 75, Annapolis, retired, Marine lieutenant-general, who was

headed a post-war organization called the Federation of American Citizens of German Descent.

Disciple of Oliver

Byers said he deliberately sought "professors and military men" as advisers to the youth movement. He is a personal disciple of Oliver and studied under him for several years.

In selecting the five, Byers said he was concerned about "smear attacks" on them.

"Yeah, I know, people say they're anti-semitic," he commented. "Well, the kids on the campus aren't going to be bothered by that.

"... I wouldn't say they're anti-Semitic — maybe anti-Zionist. There's a difference, you know . . . I don't care if some of them are anti-Zionist."

He defined anti-Zionism as a movement against creation of an "artificial Jewish state to be used as a geopolitical base for international control of the free world."

The five adult advisers have frequently gone on record in a number of racial and political issues.

Crommelin, the most strident of the group, repeatedly named the "Communist-Jewish conspiracy" as the cause of racial integration and the source of U.S. governmental control during his campaign for the Senate in 1962.

Del Valle, a career Marine, wrote the book "Roman Eagles Over Ethiopia," praising the "sagacious leadership of the Fascist dictator" in the Italian invasion of that country in the 1930s.

Both Cotten and App are contributing editors of American Mercury. Crommelin has been a stockholder and Del Valle is currently an officer of the Christian Educational Association that publishes the overtly anti-Semitic, 40,000-circulation news sheet, "Common Sense," in Union, N.J.

Quit John Birch

Cotten and Oliver both

... He came to Washington where he had friends, among them Willis H. Carter, founder of the ultra right wing Liberty Lobby and author of the introduction to Yockey's Imperium.

"I'm a personal friend of Willis Carter and we are distributing books from Noontide Press," in which Carter has a financial interest, Byers says.

Imperium, the primer of NYA, contains a combination of esoteric intellectualisms and crystal clear denunciations of the "distorting" influences in Western civilization.

Despite their "economic utility," says Yockey, Negro slaves in America were a "large, prolific and totally alien parasitic body."

"Anti-Semitism," he says, "is precisely analogous in culture pathology to the formation of anti-bodies in the bloodstream in human pathology. In both cases, the organism is resisting the alien life."

The American population, he concludes, consists "of a bare majority that is indisputably American racially, spiritually, nationally. The other half consists of Negroes, Jews, unassimilated southeastern Europeans, Mexicans, Chinese, Japanese, Siamese, Levantines, Slavs and Indians."

Yockey, an American lawyer, wrote Imperium in Ireland in 1948 after becoming disgruntled with his assignment at the Nuremberg war trials. He died in a San Francisco jail cell in 1960, shortly after he was arrested on a passport violation.

The NYA has been involved in an internal fight over leadership. Carto has apparently won this fight and is the new leader. Several former leaders have made claims of Nazi-type activity by Carto and this group. These claims received extensive publicity. The activities of the NYA are being followed through established sources only.

BLACK PANTHER PARTY (BPP)

According to its official newspaper, the Black Panther Party (BPP) was started during December, 1966, in Oakland, California, to organize black people so they can take control of the life, politics, and the destiny of the black community. It was organized by BOBBY GEORGE SEALE, BPP Chairman, and HUEY P. NEWTON, BPP Minister of Defense. NEWTON is presently serving a sentence of 2 to 15 years on a conviction of manslaughter in connection with the killing of an Oakland Police Officer.

The official newspaper, "The Black Panther", which further describes itself as the "Black Community News Service", states that the BPP advocates the use of guns and guerrilla tactics in its revolutionary program to end oppression of the black people. Residents of the black community are urged to arm themselves against the police who are consistently referred to in the publication as "pigs" who should be killed.

"The Black Panther" issue of September 7, 1968, contains an editorial by BPP Minister of Education GEORGE MASON MURRAY, which ends with the following:

"Black men. Black people, colored persons of America, revolt everywhere! Arm yourselves. The only culture worth keeping is a revolutionary culture. Change. Freedom everywhere. Dynamite! Black Power. Use the gun. Kill the pigs everywhere."

Included in the introduction to an article appearing in the October 5, 1968, edition of "The Black Panther" is the statement, "...we will not dissent from American Government. We will overthrow it."

Issues of "The Black Panther" regularly contain quotations from the writings of Chairman MAO Tse-Tung of the People's Republic of China and feature MAO's statement that "political power grows out of the barrel of a gun."

APPENDIX

"MINUTEMEN"

The "Minutemen" was organized in June, 1960. Its present headquarters are Norborne, Missouri. Robert B. DePugh, Norborne, Missouri, has been publicly identified as the founder and National Coordinator of the organization since its inception. Membership of the "Minutemen" is claimed by DePugh to be in excess of 35,000 members; however, confidential sources state this figure is greatly exaggerated and that a more true estimate would be between 500 and 1,000 members. Statements by DePugh and literature distributed by the organization indicate its purpose to be the resistance to, and exposure of, the spread of Communist influence within the United States; for the formation of a guerrilla or underground organization to combat the troops of any foreign powers which might eventually occupy this country; to resist passage of laws which would regulate private ownership of firearms.

In April, 1966, DePugh stated the "Minutemen" organization was then dividing itself into two bodies: one group to be members who have been able to maintain their identity in complete secrecy from the public and government investigative agencies, and the other group to be made up of members who have been publicly identified and who will become active in the Patriotic Party. National Conventions of the Patriotic Party were held in July, 1966, at Kansas City, Missouri, and July, 1967, at Kansas City, Kansas.

Members of the "Minutemen" organization, including Robert B. DePugh and his close associate, Walter F. Peyson, have been arrested in the past on charges of violation of the Federal Firearms Act, Bank Robbery - Conspiracy, Illegal Possession of Firearms and Conspiracy to Commit Arson. They have also engaged in maneuvers utilizing guerrilla tactics wherein machine guns, mortars, grenades, and other firearms were employed.

STUDENTS FOR A DEMOCRATIC SOCIETY

The Students for a Democratic Society (SDS), as it is known today, came into being at a founding convention held at Port Huron, Michigan, in June, 1962. The SDS is an association of young people on the left and has a current program of protesting the draft, promoting a campaign for youth to develop a conscientious objector status, denouncing United States intervention in the war in Vietnam, and to "radically transform" the university community, and provide for its complete control by students. GUS HALL, General Secretary, Communist Party, USA, when interviewed by a representative of United Press International in San Francisco, California, on May 14, 1965, described the SDS as a part of the "responsible left" which the Party has "going for us." At the June, 1965, SDS National Convention, an anti-communist proviso was removed from the SDS constitution. In the October 7, 1966, issue of "New Left Notes", the official publication of SDS, an SDS spokesman stated that there are some communists in SDS and they are welcome. The national headquarters of this organization as of July 24, 1968, was located in Room 206, 1608 West Madison Street, Chicago, Illinois.

"BREAKTHROUGH"

"Breakthrough" came into prominence in May, 1965, and is described as an ultra-conservative anti-Communist organization, confined for the most part to the greater Detroit, Michigan, area. DONALD JOSEPH LOBSINGER is Chairman and EDWARD KELLY is Project Director. LOBSINGER's residence, 591 Drexel Street, is considered to be the headquarters and Post Office Box 3061, Detroit, Michigan, is considered to be its mailing address. "Breakthrough", since 1965, has passed and mailed out numerous leaflets and participated in numerous demonstrations as well as counter-demonstrations against organizations and groups considered Communist, as well as individuals "Breakthrough" considers are against the best interests of the United States. "Battle-Line" is the official publication of "Breakthrough" and its Managing Editor is RAY PIPER. According to sources, "Breakthrough" holds no regular meetings and collects no dues, but is financed by donations from individuals in sympathy with its aims.



Local Group Is Organizing to Fight College Militants

By TOM TIEDE

If any students try to take over a college building next year, it'll be the last building they'll ever take over.

Or so, in essence, says Louis T. Byers, a "fed-up American" who is organizing a vigilante backlash movement on the nation's campuses.

Mr. Byers is a disciple of "law and order," a defender of what he views "the American way," and asserts he has dedicated himself to "ridding our schools of pinkos, Marxists and black and white gangsters."

"If it comes to it, we will meet violence with violence. We don't intend to be pushed around any more by Bolshevik conspiracy. We aren't opposed to physical force. And we are

preparing to win any fight we enter."

NYA

By "we" he means the members of National Youth Alliance, a new organization headquartered here in the capital. The Alliance, formed from the youthful residue of the Goerge Wallace for President campaign, is aggressively conservative in staff and structure.

Right now, Mr. Byers says, the NYA has less than 2,500 members, mostly loosely assembled. But he adds that "as word of our purpose gets out, we should grow by many thousands" until, by next school year, he expects to have affiliated cells of support in every college community.

These cells, he explains, will be made up of "dedicated

young people, supervised on a national level, who will be able to handle any leftist Marxist-anarchist activity which takes place in their areas."

Mr. Byers emphasizes "any" activity:

"Let's say the following happens — some communistic SDS members (Students for a Democratic Society) take over a student union building somewhere. Well, then, right away our people will meet to react.

"At first we will do everything possible, peaceably, to get the rowdies evicted. We will apply pressure on the administration, the local community, and the police — to try to get a general uprising.

"But if nothing happens this way, then we'll have to resort to final means. We'll organize enough people and enough force to physically enter the building — and toss the militants out ourselves."

Ironically, the "business of education" is not a subject which Louis Byers is overly familiar with. He's 37, for one thing, well past the age of student ties. Moreover, he says he has never been formally schooled in his life. He's the product of a split home, was never enrolled in any classroom and therefore refers to himself as "self-educated."



PROGRESSIVE LABOR PARTY (PLP)

The "New York Times" city edition Tuesday, April 20, 1965, page 27, reported that a new party of "revolutionary socialism" was formally founded on April 18, 1965, under the name of the PLP, which had been known as the Progressive Labor Movement.

According to the article, "The Progressive Labor Movement was founded in 1962, by Milton Rosen and Mortimer Scheer after they were expelled from the Communist Party of the United States for assertedly following the Chinese Communist line."

A source advised on June 3, 1968, that the PLP held its Second National Convention in New York City May 31 to June 2, 1968, at which time the PLP reasserted its objective of the establishment of a militant working class movement based on Marxism-Leninism. This is to be accomplished through the Party's overall revolutionary strategy of raising the consciousness of the people and helping to provide ideological leadership in the working class struggle for state power.

The source also advised that at the Second National Convention Milton Rosen was unanimously re-elected National Chairman of the PLP and Levi Laub, Fred Jerome, Jared Israel, William Epton, Jacob Rosen, Jeffrey Gordon and Walter Linder were elected as the National Committee to lead the PLP until the next convention.

The PLP publishes "Progressive Labor," a bimonthly magazine; "World Revolution," a quarterly periodical; and "Challenge-Desafio," a monthly newspaper.

The August, 1968, issue of "Challenge-Desafio" sets forth that "above all, this paper is dedicated to the fight for a new way of life - where the working men and women own and control their homes, factories, the police, courts, and the entire Government on every level."

The source advised on June 3, 1968, that the PLP utilizes an address of General Post Office Box 808, Brooklyn, New York, and also utilizes an office in Room 617, 1 Union Square West, New York, New York.

APPENDIX

STUDENTS FOR A DEMOCRATIC SOCIETY

A source has advised that the Students for a Democratic Society (SDS), as it is known today, came into being at a founding convention held at Port Huron, Michigan, in June, 1962. From an initial ideological posture of "participatory democracy," the current line of the national leadership reveals an adherence to Marxism-Leninism. Michael Klonsky, National Secretary, in March, 1969, called for the building of a revolutionary Marxist-Leninist movement. The program of SDS has moved from involvement in civil rights struggles to an anti-Vietnam war position and finally to its present advocacy of an anti-imperialist line, linking up the oppressed peoples of Asia, Africa and Latin America with the black liberation movement in the United States. China, Vietnam and Cuba are regarded as countries which are leading the world-wide struggles against United States imperialism. On the other hand, SDS regards the Soviet Union as an imperialist power and does not support the policies of that country.

SDS maintains a National Office in Room 206, 1608 West Madison Street, Chicago, Illinois. Its official paper "New Left Notes" reflects the line of the national leadership and program adopted at meetings of the National Council and National Interim Committee (NIC). Three national officers and a NIC of eleven members are elected each year during a June National Convention.

SDS Regional Offices and university and college chapters elect delegates to National Council meetings wherein program and ideology are debated, but each Region and chapter is autonomous in nature and is free to carry out independent policy and programs reflective of local conditions.

"Minutemen"

The "Minutemen" was organized in June, 1960. Its present headquarters are Norborne, Missouri. ROBERT B. DE PUGH, Norborne, Missouri, has been publicly identified as the founder and National Coordinator of the organization since its inception. Membership of the "Minutemen" is claimed by DE PUGH to be in excess of 35,000 members; however, confidential sources state this figure is greatly exaggerated and that a more true estimate would be between 500 and 1,000 members. Statement by DE PUGH and literature distributed by the organization indicate its purpose to be the resistance to, and exposure of, the spread of Communist influence within the United States; for the formation of a guerrilla or underground organization to combat the troops of any foreign powers which might eventually occupy this country; to resist passage of laws which would regulate private ownership of firearms.

In April, 1966, DE PUGH stated the "Minutemen" organization was then dividing itself into two bodies: one group to be members who have been able to maintain their identity in complete secrecy from the public and government investigative agencies, and the other group to be made up of members who have been publicly identified and who will become active in the Patriotic Party. National conventions of the Patriotic Party were held in July, 1966, at Kansas City, Missouri, and July, 1967, at Kansas City, Kansas.

Members of the "Minutemen" organization, including ROBERT B. DE PUGH and his close associate, WALTER P. PEYSON, have been arrested in the past on charges of violation of the Federal Firearms Act, Bank Robbery - Conspiracy, Illegal Possession of Firearms and Conspiracy to Commit Arson. They have also engaged in maneuvers utilizing guerrilla tactics wherein machine guns, mortars, grenades, and other firearms were employed.

Duncan (R-Tennessee) with whom our relations have been limited, has furnished copy of a letter from Tennessee, requesting information as to whether the National Youth Alliance is communist or anticommunist. Bufiles contain no identifiable information regarding The National Youth Alliance is a recently formed militant anticommunist right-wing organization which allegedly intends to use violence to combat the Students for a Democratic Society (SDS). It is the subject of a current Racial Matter - White Hate Groups inquiry to determine whether this group warrants investigation as a white hate group.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

1. That attached letter advising Congressman Duncan of the confidential nature of our files be approved and thereafter be delivered by someone in your (Mr. Bishop's) office.
2. That at time of delivery, Congressman Duncan or his Administrative Assistant be confidentially advised that the National Youth Alliance is a recently formed militant anticommunist right-wing organization which allegedly intends to use violence to combat the SDS.

On 7/2/69 DENNIS C. MC MAHON, JOHN ACORD, LOUIS BYERS, MIKE RUSSELL, BERTRAM ZWEIBON and DAVID KAPLAN (PH) appeared on the Barry Farber Discussion Show, WOR radio, New York, New York.

MC MAHON and ACORD identified themselves as former officials of the National Youth Alliance (NYA). BYERS and RUSSELL identified themselves as the National Organizer and the Field Director of the NYA respectively. ZWEIBON identified himself as General Counsel of the Jewish Defense League (JDL) while KAPLAN stated he was a volunteer attorney for the JDL.

BYERS stated his only purpose for appearing on the show was to let the audience know where to buy "Imperium" which was described by FARBER as the alleged later day "Mein Kampf". BYERS denied "Imperium" is neo-Nazi or a later day "Mein Kampf". He described it as a philosophical treatise.

MC MAHON stated he and ACORD were appearing on the show to discuss a movement they feel is neo-Nazi, "which has attacked us, threatened our lives and is exceedingly dangerous to the American democratic system."

MC MAHON and ACORD stated they resigned from the NYA when they saw the neo-Nazi takeover by WILLIS CARTO of Liberty Lobby and the Francis Parker Yockey (FPY) movement.

MC MAHON alleged that the takeover of the NYA by the neo-Nazi FPY movement occurred at a NYA meeting which took place at a Monroeville, Pennsylvania, motel, during January 1969.

MIKE RUSSELL of Buffalo, N.Y. stated that he delivered a speech at the motel before the Francis Parker Yockey Society (FPYS) which RUSSELL described as a philosophical organization which RUSSELL denied is neo-Nazi.

RUSSELL stated his speech entitled, "Plato A Reappraisal" as a comparison of five philosophers. RUSSELL stated the only Nazis in the audience were MC MAHON and ACORD.

MC MAHON after having been accused by RUSSELL of buying Nazi relics from a Buffalo, N.Y. dealer at the meeting admitted he purchased a swastika armband, a Nazi party pin and a record album of German war songs.

To further assert that MC MAHON is a neo-Nazi, BYERS stated that he had copies of letters which MC MAHON had sent which prove MC MAHON is a neo-Nazi. One letter was sent to DOUG CLEE on 4/18/68 which reflected in part "... Burn after reading," "... The Jews are really after me," "... this letter could ruin me politically." The letter reflected it was from "Storm Troop Battalion #1."

A second letter sent to "Statecraft" during 2/69 was signed "Revolutionary Storm Trooper."

MC MAHON admitted that he had written the letters but explained his actions by stating that he also made phone calls and speeches because he had "infiltrated the movement to expose it as neo-Nazi". BYERS replied MC MAHON was a traitor to the movement.

BYERS stated that although ACORD claimed that he is now opposed to "Imperium" he indicated on his NYA application form which was in ACORD'S handwriting that his beliefs were summarized in "Imperium."

BYERS stated that a tape of a telephone conversation between ACORD and an unidentified individual which was made after the expose' of the NYA by DREW PEARSON, ACORD stated the following concerning "Imperium":

"Regardless of whether or not you agree with it, it is a damn interesting book. Something you should read and study very closely. Well written. Philosophically sound. Whether you agree with it or not it definitely holds together. Now don't quote me on this please. I've been running around condemning the damn thing. Right now I'm condemning CARTO."

ACORD acknowledged that he did at one time endorse "Imperium" but stated "he regards it as a great personal mistake."

BYERS was questioned about a NYA lapel pin he was wearing and stated the symbol on the pin was a mathematical sign meaning "does not equal." BYERS stated he does not believe in equality "as equality in nature does not exist under the sun."

KAPLAN asked BYERS if he believed people should have equal opportunity in the economic and political field. BYERS replied, "We oppose the superimposition of standards which provide certain sacrosanct minority groups with special considerations. We think this is prejudicial."

BYERS stated that he is opposed to any sort of totalitarianism whether from the left or right. He stated, "We are against Democracy. Democracy is the worst system known to man. A Republican form of government is much superior to "mobocracy."

BYERS stated that although ACORD resigned from the NYA on 3/24/69 as late as 6/69 he was sending out a "pitch" letter which BYERS stated he turned over to postal authorities for possible prosecution of ACORD for mail fraud. He also stated that Internal Revenue Agents had interviewed him about ACORD'S affairs.

BYERS stated that although ACORD had received thousands of dollars through his American Southern Africa Council he only turned over \$150 to appropriate Rhodesian officials. ACORD did not refute this allegation but stated certain procedures had been implemented to correct any false implication previously portrayed by the appeals he presented on behalf of Rhodesia.

At one point BYERS referred to ACORD as a "profiteer" and MC MAHON as a "psychopathic liar."

BYERS admitted that he does possess firearms and ammunition but stated it is because he is a member of the National Rifle Association (NRA), a sportsman and member of shooting clubs in the Pittsburgh area.

BYERS and RUSSELL both denied they were Nazis.

Neither the objectives nor future activities of the NYA or the FPY movement were discussed during the program. The primary emphasis by MC MAHON and ACORD appeared to be to discredit WILLIS CARTO, of the Liberty Lobby, and any organization with which he is associated.

BYERS and RUSSELL attempted to defend CARTO, and prove MC MAHON and ACORD are neo-Nazi.

CR + RAM ^{*David*} ZWEIBON and ^{*Ally*} KAPLAN stated their purpose was to determine who the real Nazis are.

The NYO will continue to follow the activities of the NYA through established sources.

COUNTERVIOLENCE

Rightist Claims Cure for College Violence

BY PAUL W. VALENTINE

WASHINGTON — Behind the perpetually locked door of a downtown office sits a large affable man who is getting ready to meet campus violence with counterviolence.

His offensive is rooted in a complex philosophy, influenced by a number of contemporary rightist authors, that "Western Civilization" is imperiled and must be preserved from alien influence. That means mostly Jews, Negroes and other non-Northern European minorities.

"On the campus, there's too much education and not enough action," summarized Louis T. Byers, 37, energetic organizer of the 2,000-strong National Youth Alliance, a post election holdover of the Youth for Wallace movement.

Byers' plan: to mobilize cadres of rightist students to crush radical left action such as the seizure of buildings. This will be done first by applying pressure on college administrations, alumni and police to stop the action. If that fails, the cadres will intervene physically themselves.

The Martial Arts
The cadres will be trained in the martial arts," he says, meaning karate, judo, wrestling and boxing.

"We intend to be a permanent force on the American scene," Byers said in an interview. He envisions not only a continuous NYA surveillance of campus life but also a network of public relations programs, electioneering and "white studies" curriculums at major universities.

Courses in white studies will include, he says, genetics, eugenics, ethnology, biology and anthropology.

"The purpose of these will be to demonstrate the nature of mankind," he says.

"The equality myth will be exploded forever."

'Pure and Dominant'
Byers' inspiration is the 619-page book "Imperium" by Francis Parker Yockey, a philosophical treatise extolling the virtues of Western Civilization, particularly as manifested in Northern Europe. It defines Jews, Negroes, Indians and other assorted minorities as "parasites" and "distorters" in the Western body and calls for fulfillment of the West's "cultural imperative" to remain pure, separate and dominant.

"Imperium" is a great book," says Byers. "I read it once a year."

The philosophy of the hard right appears different from that of the conventional conservative right in three fundamental ways:

—It is overtly and unashamedly racist.

—It believes in centralized, authoritarian economics, not laissez-faire.

—It disapproves of involvement in foreign wars or territorial expansion, especially when they result in racial or ethnic admixtures between the conquerors and the vanquished.

The Nerve Center

Byers' office is intended to become not only the nerve center for organizing and expanding NYA, but also a disseminating point for a large stock of Yockeyist "Western culture" literature.

He has ordered 25,000 paperback copies of "Imperium" from Noontide Press in Torrance, Calif., and hopes to offer other

books by anthropologists, economists and philosophers with sympathetic views.

He says he is now recruiting new NYA members through a 15,000-person mailing list of former Youth for Wallace campaigners. Annual dues range from \$3 to \$10. Members wear an "inequality" button displaying the mathematical symbol of "unequal."

Additional financial support comes through appeals to persons on a second mailing list of 200,000 adults, he says, as well as the residue of some \$15,000 left over from the Youth for Wallace campaign last fall.

"No Angels"

"We have no angels, no big money supporting us," he says. "We consider \$20 a big contribution."

Byers, a fast-talking, articulate Philadelphian, acquired the Youth for Wallace mailing lists and funds through his work in the campaign for George C. Wallace in Pennsylvania last fall.

"I was an adviser to Dale Milford (Wallace's field operations man in the western sector of that state) and worked with the Youth for Wallace groups there," Byers explains.

Immediately after the November elections, he says, "the Youth for Wallace people came to Washington, and we set up the National Youth Alliance."

"We wanted a continuum in the leadership and the financing," he says.

4-Point Program

At the first organizational meeting, NYA's four-point program was established: to oppose dangerous drugs and "run those who push them off the campus, physically if necessary;" to "neutralize and overcome Black Power;" to "stamp out anarchist groups" on campus by "forcible expulsion" when necessary, and to "bring peace to America by resisting any attempt to involve us in foreign wars."

An article in the current issue of the American Mercury by Dennis C. Mahan, listed as NYA vice president, is more explicit:

"... Destruction and annihilation of the campus Red front has been sorely needed for many years ... The NYA will meet violence with violence ... tar and feathers will be our answer to the pot pusher ... the left will be forced to cower in the sewers underground as they hear the marching drums of the NYA above

American Mercury is now a quarterly magazine published by Noontide Press, specializing in Yockeyist writings and stern anti-communism.

Byers also hand-picked a five-member adult advisory board to lend NYA stature. Byers calls the members "hard-core patriots."

The 5 'Patriots'

The Anti-Defamation League of B'nai B'rith and Group Research, Inc., both of which maintain files on right wing personalities, describe them as strongly racist, anti-Semitic or both. The five are:

—Revalo P. Oliver, 59, Urbana, Ill., professor of classical languages, University of Illinois, former John Birch Society figure and associate editor of the society's magazine, American Opinion.

—Richard B. Cotten, 50, Bakersfield, Calif., broadcaster and editor-publisher; his radio commentary and monthly publication are called "Conservative Viewpoint."

—John G. Crommelin, 66, Welumpka, Va., retired Navy rear admiral, who was an unsuccessful candidate for U.S. President in 1960 under the National States Rights Party and unsuccessful Democratic candidate for U.S. Senate in 1962.

—Pedro A. Del Valle, 75, Annapolis, Md., retired Marine lieutenant general, who was an unsuccessful candidate for Maryland governor in 1954.

—Austin J. App, Takoma Park, Md., former English professor at LaSalle College, Philadelphia, who has headed a postwar organization called the Federation of American Citizens of German Descent.

Byers said he deliberately sought "professors and military men" as advisers to the youth movement. He is a personal disciple of Oliver and succeeded under him for several years.

Those 'Smear Attacks'

In selecting the five, Byers said he was concerned about "smear attacks" on them.

"Yeah, I know, people say they're anti-Semitic," he commented. "Well, the kids on the campus aren't going to be bothered by that."

"... I wouldn't say they're anti-Semitic — maybe anti-Zionist. There's a difference, you know ... I don't care if some of them are anti-Zionist."

He defined anti-Zionist as a movement against creation of an "artificial Jewish state to be used as a geopolitical base for international control of the Free World."

The five adult advisers frequently have gone on record in a number of racial and political issues.

Crommelin, the most strident of the group, repeatedly named the "Communist-Jewish conspiracy" as the cause of racial integration and the source of U.S. governmental control during his campaign for the Senate in 1962.

'Roman Eagles'

Del Valle, a career Marine, wrote the book "Roman Eagles Over Ethiopia," praising the "sagacious leadership of the fascist dictator" in the Italian invasion of that country in the 1930s.

Both Cotten and App are contributing editors of American Mercury. Crommelin has been a stockholder and Del Valle is currently an officer of the

Christian Educational Assn. that publishes the overtly anti-Semitic, 40,000-circulation news sheet, "Common Sense" in Union, N.C.

Cotten and Oliver both quit the right wing John Birch Society some time ago because, as Byers put it, "they raised the racist issue and the John Birch Society doesn't feel that racial differences count."

Byers himself was a coordinator for the society in western Pennsylvania, New York and West Virginia until NYA was formed last November. He came to Washington where he has friends, among them Willis A. Carto, founder of the ultra right wing Liberty Lobby and author of the introduction to Yockey's Imperium.

"I'm a personal friend of Willis Carto and we are distributing books from Noontide Press" in which Carto has a financial interest, Byers says.

Esoteric Intellectual

Imperium, the primer of NYA, contains a combination of esoteric intellectualisms and crystal clear denunciations of the "distorting" influences in Western Civilization.

Despite their "economic utility," says Yockey, Negro slaves in America were a "large, prolific and totally alien parasitic body."

"Anti-Semitism," he says, "is precisely analogous in culture pathology to the formation of antibodies in the bloodstream in human pathology. In both cases, the organism is resisting the alien life."

The American population, he concludes, consists "of a bare majority that is indisputably American—racially, spiritually, nationally. The other half consists of Negroes, Jews, unassimilated southeastern Europeans, Mexicans, Chinese, Japanese, Siamese, Levantines, Slavs and Indians."

Yockey, an American lawyer, wrote Imperium in Ireland in 1948 after becoming disgruntled with his assignment at the Nuremberg war trials. He died in a San Francisco jail cell in 1960 shortly after he was arrested on a passport violation.

On the morning of 8/15/69, MIKE RUSSELL, representing the National Youth Alliance (NYA), and MARTY SOLITRIN, representing Students for a Democratic Society (SDS), appeared on WJZ-TV on a discussion and answer program "CONTACT," moderated by ARNOLD ZENKER (phonetic).

During the program, RUSSELL described the aims of NYA as opposition to dangerous drugs, opposition to SDS and militants on the campuses, opposition to Black Power and black militants, opposition to foreign wars; that is, no-win foreign wars.

RUSSELL made statements that the NYA is not a racist organization and has no connection with any other groups. He stated that members must sign a loyalty oath to the constitutional republic of the United States which would preclude any Neo-Nazis from joining. He referred to NYA as being isolationist in connection with the question of involvement in foreign wars.

RUSSELL stated with regard to combating SDS, that the NYA will, during the coming school semester, circulate petitions on campuses throughout the country and will demand of the administrations that SDS be banned from the campuses.

In reference to WILLIS CARTO, whom he described as a fine patriotic American, RUSSELL said that CARTO has

had no connection with the NYA since he originally set up the Youth for Wallace Organization. RUSSELL referred to LOUIS T. BYERS as a National Organizer for the NYA. *md*

RUSSELL made reference to the book "Imperium" by FRANCIS PARKER YOCKEY, which could be purchased for \$2.50 by writing to "National Youth Alliance, 813 DuPont Circle Building, Washington, D.C. 20036." RUSSELL stated that he is a married man with three children and is on leave of absence from both his job and school to organize for the NYA. He said he had been an elector for WALLACE in the State of New York and that he has no political motives in connection with his present work.

MARTY SOLITRIN, in attempting to counter statements of RUSSELL, made reference on several occasions to conditions in Philadelphia which would indicate that he could be from that area.

RUSSELL dominated the discussion part of the program and the questions by listeners were all directed to him.

On July 2, 1969 Dennis C. Mc Mahon, John Patrick Acord, Louis Byers, Mike Russell, Bertram Zweibon and David Kaplan (PH) appeared on the Barry Farber Discussion Show, WOR radio, New York, New York

Mc Mahon and Acord identified themselves as former officials of the National Youth Alliance (NYA). Byers and Russell identified themselves as the National Organizer and the Field Director of the NYA respectively. Zweibon identified himself as General Counsel of the Jewish Defense League (JDL) while Kaplan stated he was a volunteer attorney for the JDL.

Byers stated his only purpose for appearing on the show was to let the audience know where to buy "Imperium" which was described by Farber as the alleged later day "Mein Kampf". Byers denied "Imperium" is neo-Nazi or a later day "Mein Kampf". He described it as a philosophical treatise.

Mc Mahon stated he and Acord were appearing on the show to discuss a movement they feel is neo-Nazi, "which has attacked us, threatened our lives and is exceedingly dangerous to the American democratic system."

Mc Mahon and Acord stated they resigned from the NYA when they saw the neo-Nazi takeover by Willis Carto of Liberty Lobby and the Francis Parker Yockey (FPY) movement.

STUDENTS FOR A DEMOCRATIC SOCIETY

A source has advised that the Students for a Democratic Society (SDS), as it is known today, came into being at a founding convention held at Port Huron, Michigan, in June, 1962. From an initial ideological posture of "participatory democracy," the current line of the national leadership reveals an adherence to Marxism-Leninism. Michael Klonsky, National Secretary, in March, 1969, called for the building of a revolutionary Marxist-Leninist movement. The program of SDS has moved from involvement in civil rights struggles to an anti-Vietnam war position and finally to its present advocacy of an anti-imperialist line, linking up the oppressed peoples of Asia, Africa and Latin America with the black liberation movement in the United States. China, Vietnam and Cuba are regarded as countries which are leading the world-wide struggles against United States imperialism. On the other hand, SDS regards the Soviet Union as an imperialist power and does not support the policies of that country.

SDS maintains a National Office in Room 206, 1608 West Madison Street, Chicago, Illinois. Its official paper "New Left Notes" reflects the line of the national leadership and program adopted at meetings of the National Council and National Interim Committee (NIC). Three national officers and a NIC of eleven members are elected each year during a June National Convention.

SDS Regional Offices and university and college chapters elect delegates to National Council meetings wherein program and ideology are debated, but each Region and chapter is autonomous in nature and is free to carry out independent policy and programs reflective of local conditions.

STUDENTS FOR A DEMOCRATIC SOCIETY

A source has advised that the Students for a Democratic Society (SDS), as it is known today, came into being at a founding convention held at Port Huron, Michigan, in June, 1962. From an initial ideological posture of "participatory democracy," the current line of the national leadership reveals an adherence to Marxism-Leninism. Michael Klonsky, National Secretary, in March, 1969, called for the building of a revolutionary Marxist-Leninist movement. The program of SDS has moved from involvement in civil rights struggles to an anti-Vietnam war position and finally to its present advocacy of an anti-imperialist line, linking up the oppressed peoples of Asia, Africa and Latin America with the black liberation movement in the United States. China, Vietnam and Cuba are regarded as countries which are leading the worldwide struggles against United States imperialism. On the other hand, SDS regards the Soviet Union as an imperialist power and does not support the policies of that country.

SDS maintains a National Office in Room 206, 1608 West Madison Street, Chicago, Illinois. Its official paper "New Left Notes" reflects the line of the national leadership and program adopted at meetings of the National Council and National Interim Committee (NIC). Three national officers and a NIC of eleven members are elected each year during a June National Convention.

SDS Regional Offices and university and college chapters elect delegates to National Council meetings wherein program and ideology are debated, but each Region and chapter is autonomous in nature and is free to carry out independent policy and programs reflective of local conditions.
