STUDENTS FOR A DEMOCRATIC SOCIETY

A source has advised that the Students for a Democratic Society (SDS), as it is known today, came into being at a founding convention held at Port Huron, Michigan, in June, 1962. From an initial ideological posture of "participatory democracy," the current line of the national leadership reveals an adherence to Marxism-Leninism. Michael Klonsky, National Secretary, in March, 1969, called for the building of a revolutionary Marxist-Leninist movement. The program of SDS has moved from involvement in civil rights struggles to an anti-Vietnam war position and finally to its present advocacy of an anti-imperialist line, linking up the oppressed peoples of Asia, Africa and Latin America with the black liberation movement in the United States. China, Vietnam and Cuba are regarded as countries which are leading the world-wide struggles against United States imperialism. On the other hand, SDS regards the Soviet Union as an imperialist power and does not support the policies of that country.

SDS maintains a National Office in Room 206, 160 West Madison Street, Chicago, Illinois. Its official paper "New Left Notes" reflects the line of the national leaders and program adopted at meetings of the National Council or National Interim Committee (NIC). Three national officers and a NIC of eleven members are elected each year during a June National Convention.

SDS Regional Offices and university and college chapters elect delegates to National Council meetings where program and ideology are debated, but each Region and chapter is autonomous in nature and is free to carry out independent policy and programs reflective of local conditions.

From information determined by NYO and WFO, it would not appear that [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] are without the taint of racism and Nazism. During July, 1969, ACORD and MCMAHON appeared on the Barry Farber Show, WOR, NYC, whereon MCMAHON admitted buying, early in 1969, Nazi relics, swastica armband, Nazi party pins, and record albums of German War songs. MCMAHON also admitted writing certain letters which he signed in a manner connoting either neo-nazism or a high degree of emotional immaturity.

ACORD on the above show practically endorsed the book Imperium, so-called bible of the NYA, and alleged treatise on Nazism or Fascism, but requested not to be quoted in this respect, "...right now, I'm condemning CARTO."

With respect to guidelines set out in MI, Section 122, it can be said that the NYA has not at this time actually or allegedly committed acts of violence to deny others their rights under the constitution. It is not apparent at this time that the NYA has adopted a policy or has allegedly adopted a policy of advocating, condoning or inciting the use of force or violence to deny others their rights.

From the above, it would appear that questions of physical violence, racism or Nazism could better be related to investigation of particular individuals involved or under NSWPP caption rather than risk possible embarrassment to the Bureau by conducting an active investigation of the NYA at this time.

Further, investigation of the National Socialist White Peoples Party, aka The American Nazi Party, and information determined from sources familiar with the NSWPP and other White Hate groups in the WDC area has indicated no information that the NSWPP is even aware of the existence of the NYA.

The cartoon on page eight is a take off on the Black Panthers; peace movements generally, hippies, and the SDS, which in this case stands for "Sick Dirty Stupid".

The above publication was obtained by Springfield Division stenographer [redacted] at an informal neighborhood gathering from [redacted]

[redacted] who identified himself to [redacted] as a member of the JOHN BIRCH Society, Springfield, Illinois Chapter.

Also distributed by [redacted] were copies of "Through To Victory", edited by Reverend PAUL C. NEIPP at Ridgecrest, California, "Sput", reprinted from The San Diego Union and written by ROBERT BETTS, Copley News Service, "Sex Education in the Schools?" from The Movement To Restore Decency (MOTOREDE), sponsored by the JOHN BIRCH Society and "That Music", by GARY ALLEN, which is a reprint from the American Opinion, edited by ROBERT WELCH, and also, a bumper sticker stating "The O.E.O. has got to go!" and since these publications appear to be commonly available, they are not being submitted to the Bureau.

[redacted] expressed an interest in knowing whether or not the SDS is active at the Lincoln Land Community College, a recently inaugurated school in Springfield, Illinois, and stated that if SDS is active there, the JOHN BIRCH Society contemplates formulation of the National Youth Alliance to counteract the SDS.

While the SDS is active in several institutions of higher education in the Springfield, Illinois Division, thus far Springfield Division has had no information indicating it is active at the Lincoln Land Community College.

The above information is submitted for the information of the Bureau. No active investigation is contemplated concerning the National Youth Alliance or the JOHN BIRCH Society in the Springfield Division UACB.

Rightist Group Opens Organizing Effort Here

The National Youth Alliance, a rightist group which espouses racial inequity and proposes the destruction of radical left movements, opened its first organizing effort here Thursday.

"We believe that inequality functions consistently throughout the universe. Equality creates gigantic mediocrity," said Louis T. Byers, national organizer of the alliance.

Many totalitarians in the world have used the myth of equality to support totalitarianism, according to Byers.

The organization meeting at the Los Angeles Hilton, is attempting to mobilize rightist students on many campuses to exert pressure to stop radical student action.

A press release quoted John Hayes, described as the student spokesman of NYA at UCLA, as saying he and other students "are tired of creeps and black agitators bringing guns and violence to the college campuses across the nation.

"We will meet force with force and violence with violence."

The organization, with headquarters in Washington, D.C., uses as its bible a 619-paged book titled "Imperium" by Francis Parker Yockey.

The book defines Negroes, Jews, Indians and other minorities as "parasites" and "distorters" in Western civilization.

Conservative Youths Back School's Stand

Members of the National Youth Alliance (NYA) of Pomona High School have gathered 500 signatures from the student body supporting action taken by school administrators for their action against the Black Students Union last week.

When asked if he felt black would join the NYA, Boyd said that there are conservative Negroes on campus but that they would probably be afraid to join for fear of persecution from other more militant Negroes.

Principal John Cook suspended the BSU until such a time as the administration felt the organization would again cooperate with the student body and administrators. Douglas Boyd, vice president of the NYA, said.

Boyd said that he felt some BSU members are quite militant and have threatened other student on campus, including himself.

Boyd said he gave the petition with the signatures to Cook Friday afternoon.

Although the NYA has not been officially approved by the student council as a sanctioned on-campus organization, Boyd felt the acceptance of his organization is imminent. There are currently 12 active mem-



NYA: Alive and Well Here

The National Youth Alliance—a hard-right group that believes in get-tough tactics against campus radicals and preaches the superiority of white “Western culture”—is alive and well in Washington.

Formed last spring as a post-election outgrowth of the Youth for Wallace movement, the NYA has grown from a one-man, mailing-list operation to a booming, solvent, tightly-knit network of chapters across the country.

Louis T. Byers, 38-year-old national organizer of NYA, cites these signs of the organization's health:

- Mailing list membership has doubled since last spring from 2,000 to 4,000. Names are collated by computer.

- Revenue is pouring in at about \$300 a day, mostly in contributions, membership fees and sales of Western culture literature.

- NYA this fall put out a first issue of its newspaper, Attack, with a circulation of 25,000.

- A monthly newsletter called Action circulates among the 4,000 mailing list members.

- About 20 NYA chapters or “units” with 5 to 20 activist members each have been established, mostly on college campuses.

- Numerous “right power” rallies have been staged in urban centers.

- Some 250,000 copies of “After 50 Years,” an address by NYA mentor Revilo P. Oliver bemoaning the ruination of “Western culture” by “scabrous aliens,” have been distributed.

- A 37-minute, 16-millimeter film of Oliver giving the address is used at “right power” rallies and other NYA functions. The film cost \$6,600 to make.

- Byers' former one-man headquarters operation here now has four full-time salaried employees.

The headquarters, a cluttered eighth floor office room at 1346 Connecticut Ave. NW is strewn with pamphlets, envelopes, mailing lists, ZIP code maps and computer print-out sheets containing the names of NYA members.

During a reporter's recent visit, a postman delivered NYA's morning mail, amounting to approximately 50 letters. Most contained contributions or membership fees ranging from \$3 to \$15.

Byers is the office chief and gives himself a monthly salary of \$750. Articulate and well-read, he never attended college but achieved a two-year college equivalency in the Army's General Education Development program.

Byers was an area coordinator in western Pennsylvania and New York for the John Birch Society but was purged from the organization last year, he said, because of his "publicly racist" views.

He was a principal organizer of the George C. Wallace campaign in Pennsylvania last fall and personally selected all Wallace electors for the state, he says.

"Western Destiny"

The three persons working in Byers' office share his "same world view — we're all Western destiny oriented," as he puts it.

There is Carey Winters, 22, a recent dean's list graduate of Carnegie-Mellon University in Pittsburgh. She is NYA's national secretary and spends much of her energy writing NYA position papers.

Michael D. Russell, 27, as director of field activities, is on the road frequently organizing rallies and establishing NYA direct action units.

A New York state Wallace elector in 1968, Russell was turned down when he once attempted to join the Buffalo, N.Y. police force. He says the rejection was political because of his rightist views.

The fourth and most recent member of the office is Robert Johnston, 32, an ex-Navy serviceman and former special policeman on the Buffalo force. He is NYA's instructor of "preparedness and self-defense."

"Street Fighting"

"We were going to call him director of martial arts," said Byers, "but that sounded too tough." Instruction under Johnston includes "street fighting," judo, self-defense and "relationships with the police," Byers said.

Central to Johnston's role is the training and mobilization of cadres of rightist students to curb radical left action such as the seizure of campus buildings.

If persuasion fails, the cadres will physically eject recalcitrant students, Byers said. Preparation for such direct action is still in a formative stage, he added, and no major campus confrontations have been held.

The organizational structure of NYA is simple and authoritarian. All decisions

and policies are formulated in Byers' headquarters. Unit leaders are hand-picked by Byers and Russell. Democratic procedures are considered inefficient.

No Dissension

"We shall not tolerate dissension," says the NYA June newsletter. "NYA is a fighting movement, not a talking one or a money-

raising one, and therefore it is structured like an army.

Individual advancement (of members) will be on the strict basis of individual effectiveness and ability, not conspiratorial scheming, parliamentary maneuvering or adhesion to the the right clique.

"... Another great advantage to an authoritarian structure is that the danger

of infiltration and sabotage is greatly lessened."

Byers stresses that NYA wants not only to crush radical student and black power movements but also to assert positive values of "Western destiny."

The Western destiny and culture concepts stem from a book by Francis Parker Yockey entitled "Imperium" a 619-page philosophical

tract extolling the virtues of northern European civilization and warning against its adulteration by Jews, Negroes, Orientals and other "culture distorters."

As the basic handbook of NYA, Imperium is pushed heavily in NYA publicity. Byers claim that 11,000 copies (\$2.50) each in paperback have been sold since last spring.

SUMMARY OF INFORMATION

SYNOPSIS: (C) National Youth Alliance (NYA) is a rightist, campus based youth group with an alleged membership of 3,000. Led by Patrick Tifer of Detroit, Michigan, NYA has since inception failed to achieve ITS avowed goal of countering the programs of "New Left" organizations due to cleavage and reported infiltration and financing by Neo-Nazi sympathizers. The organization was originally composed of former Youth For Wallace members, but since then has not achieved solidarity behind the themes of anti-leftist, anti-Black Power and anti-narcotics.

DETAILS:

1. (C) The NATIONAL YOUTH ALLIANCE (NYA) is a conservative student group headquartered in Washington, D.C. NYA, composed largely of right-leaning youth between the ages of 13 and 29, has been riven with factional disputes since ITS establishment immediately after the 1968 presidential campaign. Chaired by Patrick Tifer of Detroit, Michigan, NYA claims a current membership in excess of 3,000.
2. (C) NYA was organized by members of Youth For Wallace (YFW), an organization set up to further former Governor Wallace's presidential hopes in the 1968 campaign. It was felt at the time that a conservative youth group with national prominence was needed to combat the increasing popularity of campus "New Left" sentiment. While YFW was active in 1968, a donation of \$40,000 was made by Willis Allison Carto, who controls Liberty Lobby (LL), a conservative organization whose public organ, "Liberty Letter," is devoted to the dissemination of conservative political thought. The donation was to prove a major factor in the factionalization of NYA and ITS subsequent impotence in dominating young conservative movements.
3. (C) The first record of NYA is a flyer distributed in early 1969 by SUBJECT which outlined the following organizational positions:
 1. Oppose narcotics both on and off campus.
 2. Neutralize and overcome current "Black Power" movements with an "American Power" movement.
 3. Restore law and order to college campuses. Eliminate anarchist student groups such as Students for a Democratic Society (SDS).
 4. Bring peace to the world. Resist involvement in "no-win" wars.

The flyer also labelled the Republican and Democratic Parties as proponents of big business, crushing taxation, and compromise with the enemies of the US. NYA appealed

in the leaflet to Americans to support US servicemen once they are committed in an armed conflict. The third of the above NYA goals was further defined when in May, 1969, a source stated that NYA is a "coalition of conservative youth organizations whose purpose was to eject certain campus based groups, such as SDS...."

4. (C) The rifts which have neutralized the NYA since ITS inception began soon after former representatives of SUBJECT accused Carto, the major NYA financial source, of attempting to mold the organization into a Neo-Nazi, "brownshirt" group. The nazi infiltration movement is called the "Francis Parker Yockey Movement." John Patrick Acord, early National Director, received a sizeable donation from Carto (who allegedly receives a working annual budget of \$1,000,000 from LL) to further YFW campaign efforts. Carto has since Wallace's defeat insisted on repayment of the donation in amounts of \$1,000 per month. Acord refused, claiming the donation was a political contribution and not a loan, and on 24 Mar 69 relinquished his fight for control of NYA and severed all organizational ties. Acord was the founder of the American Southern Africa Council. He had earlier stated in an interview that NYA was a segregationist organization - a statement for which he was later censored as national spokesman. Another public admission was made on 15 Aug 69 by NYA representative Mike Russell on a Baltimore, Maryland television broadcast. Russell stated that NYA members must sign an oath pledging loyalty to the constitutional republic of the US. He also advised that NYA was contemplating the circulation of petitions on college campuses urging university administrations to ban SDS. No evidence of said petitions has become available to date.

5. (C) NYA meetings have been sparse but geographically widespread. Early 1969 meetings were held in Chicago; Pittsburgh; Provo, Utah; Los Angeles; Atlanta and New Orleans. A 16 Jul 69 NYA-sponsored rally at the University of California at Los Angeles attracted 500 individuals including SDS members.

7. (C) The NYA has during ITS brief history attempted to combine anti-left groups on campus under one central banner. Failure in this respect has resulted from hindering factionalization and Neo-Nazi influence. It is doubtful that SUBJECT in the future will pose a security threat to campuses where "New Left" organizations have gained prominence.

The National Youth Alliance (NYA) was reportedly formed in Washington, D. C., in November, 1968, as a successor organization to the Youth For Wallace group which was active during the presidential campaign of George Wallace. NYA has its headquarters at Washington, D. C. The Bureau has not actively investigated NYA, but has followed its activities through public source material, and established sources. Allegations have been made that the current leadership of NYA has Nazi-type leanings.

To assist the Bureau in making a proper evaluation as to whether an active investigation of NYA is warranted as a white extremist organization, WFO should prepare a summary report bringing the activities of this organization up-to-date. Follow the format outlined in Manual of Instructions, Section . This report should be submitted within 45 days of receipt of this communication. WFO should submit with this report its recommendations as to whether additional active investigation is warranted.



We have, however, received some information concerning the stated purposes and aims of the organization which for his guidance is the successor organization to the Youth for Wallace group, which was an organization of students supporting the presidential campaign of Governor George Wallace. National Youth Alliance (NYA) has publicly stated its position as being in opposition to the use of narcotics, in favor of the neutralization of "Black Power," for the restoration of law and order on the campuses, and the bringing of peace to the world.

EOWSA { The Pittsburgh Office has advised they are in receipt of a letter from the USA, Pittsburgh in which he requests that an investigation be conducted regarding the NYA. Basis of USA's request is a letter he received from an employee of the Pittsburgh Board of Education, Division of School Community Affairs requesting information concerning NYA. The School Board employee brought out in his letter to USA that NYA has increased its activities in several neighborhoods and requests information since the School Board monitors the community for "...influences that may have results within the school."

We have not actively investigated the NYA but we have followed their activities through established sources and public source material. The NYA, a conservative student group, is the successor organization to the Youth For Wallace group which was an organization of students supporting the presidential campaign of George Wallace. The NYA has publicly stated its positions as opposing narcotics, neutralizing "Black Power," restoration of law and order to campuses and bringing peace to the world. There has been factionalism within the NYA since its formation and early leaders of NYA who were replaced have made public allegations of Nazi-type leanings of current leadership. To date, their activities have not been such as to warrant active investigation as a hate-type organization; however, it is time to take a hard look at the activities of this organization since its' inception and accordingly, by separate communication, we are directing WFO-office of origin - to prepare summary report on NYA after which a determination will be made as to any further action necessary.

Pittsburgh Office has recommended a rather lengthy letter to the USA advising him we are not investigating NYA and that there does not appear to be a basis for investigation at this time. Their proposed letter also mentions information concerning subversive organizations which is extraneous to the USA's request for investigation of the NYA and need not be mentioned. It appears this matter could be better handled through personal contact with the USA and accordingly Pittsburgh is being instructed to handle this matter in that fashion.

the NYA employs four full-time salaried employees. These employees including BYERS are CAREY J. WINTERS, 22, National Secretary, a recent Dean's List graduate of Carnegie-Mellon University, Pittsburgh; MICHAEL D. RUSSELL, 27, Director of Field Activities, who was described as "on the road" frequently organizing rallies and establishing NYA units. RUSSELL was further described as having been turned down as an applicant by the Buffalo, New York police force because of "his rightist views." The fourth and most recent employee was ROBERT JOHNSON (believed to be ROBERT JOHNSTON), 32, an ex-Navy serviceman and former special policeman on the Buffalo police force. He was also described as NYA's instructor of "preparedness and self-defense." According to BYERS, JOHNSTON's instruction assignments included "street fighting, judo, self-defense, and relationships with the police."

A brief survey of certain financial aspects of NYA's activities by WFO determined that [redacted] apparently receives regular remuneration from NYA.

[redacted] was also noted to receive regular remuneration from NYA.

The captioned issue of "Playboy" magazine has been reviewed for matters of interest to the Bureau.

The only reference to the FBI is contained in an article by George Fox entitled "Counter-Revolution." The Bureau is mentioned in passing with respect to the actions of a conservative youth group which is allegedly allied with the "Liberty Lobby." One of the supposed leaders of the National Youth Alliance is quoted as saying he requested the Bureau and the House Committee on Internal Security to investigate the actions of "Liberty Lobby" in attempting to run its affairs. Bufiles contain no information identifiable with this action which, of course, would not have been within Bureau jurisdiction. In another reference to the Bureau a volunteer underground worker who allegedly has penetrated student youth movements claimed he turned the information he obtained over to the FBI. No identifying information is provided in the article concerning this activity.

B. National Headquarters

An article appeared in the "Washington Post" newspaper dated Monday, December 22, 1969, page A3 entitled "NYA: Alive and Well." This article noted that the National Headquarters of the NYA was located on the 8th floor of 1346 Connecticut Avenue, N.W.

On March 29, 1969 the records of the District of Columbia Recorder's Office, WDC were reviewed by a Special Agent of the FBI concerning the NYA and related matters. It was determined that the NYA was incorporated on March 5, 1969 as the National Youth Alliance, Incorporated, a non-profit corporation. The address given for this organization was shown as 319 3rd Street, S.E., WDC. The incorporation officers were shown as GERALD E. DUNN, CAROL M. DUNN and ANNE N. DABNEY.

On [REDACTED] 1968, [REDACTED] Liberty Lobby, 319 3rd Street, S.E. was contacted by Special Agents of the FBI in relation to another matter and at that time she volunteered no information pertaining to the NYA.

C. National Officers

An article appeared in the "Washington Post and Times Herald" dated May 25, 1969, page A9 entitled "The Student Right: Racist, Martial, Insular." This article noted that LOUIS T. BYERS, 37, was the organizer of the "2000 strong NYA, a post-election holdover of the YFW movement." An article appeared in the "Post" as set out above on December 22, 1969 which noted that BYERS, national organizer of the NYA, stated that the NYA, which was formerly a one man operation, now employs four full time salaried employees. He stated that the Headquarters was located on the 8th floor of 1346 Connecticut Avenue, N.W., WDC. He stated that the national officers are MICHAEL D. RUSSELL, 27, Director of Field Activities and who was formerly a New York State WALLACE elector during the 1968 presidential election; ROBERT JOHNSTON, 32, an ex-Navy

man was NYA instructor of "preparedness and self-defense." The National Secretary is CAREY WINTERS, 22, a graduate of Carnegie Mellon University in Pittsburgh. In addition to her duties as National Secretary, she also writes NYA "position papers."

D. Membership

According to the above "Washington Post" article dated December 22, 1969, BYERS was reported to have stated that the mailing list of membership has doubled since last Spring from 2000 to 4000 names. According to this article, he advised that there are about twenty NYA chapters or "units" with five to twenty members who are established "mostly on college campuses. In this article BYERS was indicated to have been formerly a area coordinator in western Pennsylvania and New York for the JBS and that he claimed to be a principal organizer of the GEORGE C. WALLACE 1968 Presidential Campaign in Pennsylvania.

E. Organization Policy

The above article appearing in the "Washington Post" December 22, attributed BYERS to stating that the "NYA is a fighting movement and not a talking one or a money raising one and therefore is structured like an army." He further indicated "individual advancement of members will be on a basis of individual effectiveness and ability, not conspiratorial scheming, parliamentary maneuver, or adhesion to the right clique. Another great advantage to authoritarian structure is that the danger of infiltration and sabotage is greatly lessened." BYERS stressed that the NYA develops to counter the radical student movements and black power movements but also to assert positive values of "western destiny." The article indicated that the western destiny and culture concepts stem from a book by FRANCIS PARKER YOCKEY entitled "Imperium," a 61 page philosophical tract extolling the virtues of a northern European civilization and warning against its adulteration by Jews, Negroes, Orientals and other "culture distorters."

This article set forth that "Imperium" was the basic handbook of NYA and is pushed heavily in NYA publicity. BYERS

claimed that 11,000 copies at \$2.50 each in paperback have been sold by NYA since last Spring.

With respect to possible resort to violence by the NYA the above article noted that BYERS indicated that if persuasion fails in countering radical campus groups, the NYA might resort to physically ejecting recalcitrant students. BYERS said that preparation for such direct action is still in the formulative stage; he added that no major campus confrontations have been he With respect to NYA policy this article noted that the organization structure of the NYA is simple and authoritarian. All decisions and policies are formulated in BYERS' Headquarters. Unit leader are hand picked by BYERS and RUSSELL. Democratic procedures in these matters are considered inefficient.

F. Publications

According to the above "Washington Post" article dated December 22, LOUIS BYERS advised that the NYA in the Fall of 196 put out the first issue of its publication entitled "Attack" with a circulation of 25,000 copies. He further indicated that a monthly news letter called "Action" circulates among the 4000 mailing list members.




"Progress Bulletin", a publication in Pomona, California, issue dated March 30, 1969.

MEMBER OF STUDENT ORGANIZATION

This issue contained an article headlined "Conservative Youths Back School's Stand". According to the article, members of the National Youth Alliance (NYA) of Pomona High School had gathered signatures from the student body supporting action taken by school administrators for their action against the Black Student Union the previous week. DOUGLAS BOYD was identified as vice-president of the NYA. Although the NYA had not been officially approved by the student council as a sanctioned on-campus organization, BOYD felt the acceptance of his organization was eminent. There were currently 12 active members.

When asked if he felt blacks would join the NYA, BOYD said that there were conservative Negroes on campus, but that they would probably be afraid to join for fear of persecution from other more militant Negroes.

The Black Student Union is a student black nationalist organization.

The April-May 1969 issue identified "Statecraft" as an affiliation of American patriotic action groups and open to all productive Americans willing to stand up and fight against the wave of destruction engulfing the nation.

Liberty Lobby is publicly recognized as a conservative organization which published "Liberty Letter" an organ devoted to conservative political opinion.

The July 11, 1969, issue of this publication contained the following information:

The NYA, a rightist group which espoused racial inequity and proposed the destruction of radical left movements, opened its first organizing effort here Thursday. The organization, meeting at the Los Angeles Hilton, was attempting to mobilize "rightist" students on many campuses to exert pressure to stop radical student action.

A press release quoted JOHN HAYES, described as the student spokesman of NYA at UCLA as saying that he and other students "are tired of creeps and black agitators bringing guns and violence to the college campuses across the nation. We will meet force with force and violence with violence".

"We believe that inequality functions consistently throughout the universe. Equality creates gigantic mediocrity", said LOUIS T. BYERS, National Organizer of the Alliance.

Many totalitarians in the world have used the myth of equality to support totalitarianism, according to BYERS.

The organization with headquarters at Washington, D.C., used as its bible, a 619 page book, titled "Imperium" by FRANCIS PARKER YOCKEY. The book defines Negroes, Jews, Indians, and other minorities as "parasites" and "distorters" in Western Civilization.

A leaflet distributed at the NYA sponsored rally held on July 16, 1969, at the UCLA campus headed "Lost and Alone" contained the following information:

"The NYA is a dynamic new productive youth movement dedicated to the protection of your rights as a student and as an American citizen.

NYA is an organization that has the guts to fight Black Power and the New Left gangsters on the campus. NYA is a coalition of American youth who are dedicated to action for America against red anarchy. NYA will take positive and decisive action against those elements that are destroying this right to aggregation, your right to free speech and your right to a normal life".

The leaflet advised that "... Your history professor tells you that the three greatest men in life are Karl Marx, Fidel Castro, and Eldridge Cleaver. Your sociology teacher spends most of his time defending homosexuality and decrying American fighting men in Vietnam...You are amazed to find your school is filled with black scholarship students who are getting away with murder-both academically and politically".

"The black militants have the run of the campus. Your girl friend has been insulted by blacks.

Your best friend was beat up in the school cafeteria because he refused to surrender his seat to a black activist. One day you find your school closed. The SDS has occupied the Administration Building and instead of getting education....you must be content to shuffle around the campus past tables full of revolting New Left literature and communist propaganda".

"...You flunk but the black students who hardly ever show up for class, never hand in reports, and flunk the tests get top grades".

"One day a fellow student who feels as you do says that a bunch of students are meeting tonight to try to combat the Left on campus. ...A local NYA field coordinator will speak to you and your friends. Now you have somewhere to turn. Now you can fight!"

The leaflet gave the NYA address as 130 3rd Street, Southeast, Washington, D.C.
