formation has been identified as Barbara Ledeen, the adviser's wife. Mrs. Ledeen has been identified by The SPOTLIGHT's intelligence sources as a Defense Department consultant employed by Perle and Bryen.

"This means that the Pentagon penetration under Perle and Bryen and the White House honeycomb under Ledeen are integral parts of a larger Israeli operation," explained a federal security administrator familiar with the details of an FBI probe (SPOTLIGHT, Sept. 23).

On September 16, The SPOTLIGHT reported exclusively that a foreign agent, Franciso Pazienza, had broken silence and made embarrassing revelations about closely guarded secrets, including the complicity of American officials in the operations of the Mossad. Among those named was Michael Ledeen, who, Pazienza revealed, was also on the payroll of Italian military intelligence. **JOSEPH CHURBA**

A powerful "inside" dual loyalist, Joseph Churba is one of the leaders of an attack on President Ronald Reagan and his staff as "bungling amateurs" and as "straw men" who must be replaced by "better leaders."

On September 2, The SPOTLIGHT reported that "there is mounting concern in the White House about the onslaught, led by Michael Ledeen, Joseph Churba and Edward Lettwak, three senior policy advisers long identified in FBI counterintelligence reports as suspected assets of the Mossad."

Churba is believed to be one of the men who helped wreck Jimmy Carter's political career in 1978-79 when the Democratic president was thought to have become insufficiently supportive of Israel.

At the time of the Lebanon conquest, the Begin government had the ability to "change the face of the Middle East as it wants to," Churba said. Angerly accusing several of Reagan's top aides of "leaning toward the Arabs," Churba singled out Presidential Counselor Edwin Meese, Deputy Chief of Staff Michael Deaver and National Security Adviser William Clark as opponents of Israel's further expansion.

Churba, a close friend of journalist John Rees, was once favorably featured in "Review of the News," published by the John Birch Society.

JOHN REES

Perhaps one of the most enigmatic figures on the Washington scene, John Rees is suspected of being connected to foreign intelligence services.

In the early 1970s, he publicly and loudly repudiated his longtime ties to the radical left. On September 7, 1981, The SPOTLIGHT said of this move:

"His abandoning of the ultraliberal ship was so skillfully timed and orchestrated that he achieved the seemingly impossible coup of becoming something of a hero to conservatives by leading them to believe that he had always served their cause."

Rees found two powerful patrons, the late Rep. Larry McDonald (D-Ga.) and the late Robert Welch, head of the John Birch Society.

Rees was born in England (probably London) in 1926. Virtually nothing is known about his years in England, although there have been rumors he had connections to the British intelligence agency MI-6 and/or that he may have been a journalist.

The first "solid and documentable" reference to John Rees dates back only to 1962, when, at the age of 36, he allegedly left Britain to make his home in the United States. However, some intelligence sources, which have monitored Rees's activities, have him arriving in this country in 1963.

He quickly gained notoriety through a connection to the author Grace Metalious, whose best-selling novel "Peyton Place" made her the undisputed queen of porn. Rees was named sole heir to her estate, but renounced his legacy quickly when he learned that it consisted of approximately \$200,000 in debts.

Rees's next public and documentable appearance was in Newark, New Jersey, in the wake of the extensive rioting that broke out there in the wake of Martin Luther King's assassination in 1968. It was at this time that Rees first emerged as the expert information gatherer he unquestionably is and as a public ally of left-wing dissident groups that he later claimed to have been "infiltrating."

In his book "No Cause for Indictment: An Autopsy of Newark," author Ron Pinambo reports that in the wake

of King's murder Rees suddenly came on the scene as a mediator between the Newark officials, including police Capt. Charles Kinsey (who headed the Newark Police Department's subversion squad) and no less a personage than Black nationalist LeRoi Jones, who had been operating the Black Arts Repertory Theater in Harlem with a \$40,000 federal grant.

It was later discovered that the "theater" was a front for training apprentice Black terrorists. A police raid in the 1960s uncovered a large arsenal of weapons.

Many people have heard of Western Cook, but few realize that it sprang from an organization founded in 1968 by Rees called National Cook Inc. Although the organization (founded, it formed the basis for another Rees project known as the "Information Digest," a newsletter that to this day is disseminated to local law enforcement agencies and is supposedly dedicated to providing intelligence on left-wing groups. Rees collaborates with syndicated journalist Jack Anderson and disinformation specialist Irwin Sull, of the Anti-Defamation League.

During the 1960s, Rees and his wife came to Washington, becoming involved in and with various left-wing causes and groups, including gaining leadership positions at the Rockefeller-connected Institute for Policy Studies and the Washington National Lawyers Guild, a controversial association.

In 1973 Rees publicly repudiated his left-wing connections and testified before the Senate Internal Security Subcommittee on his leftist activities and those of his associates. It is at this time that John and Louis Rees donned the mantle of "conservatives" and allied themselves closely with McDonald and through him with the JBS.

One thread connects Rees's activities, regardless of where he purports to be on the political spectrum: the welfare of the state of Israel. The SPOTLIGHT reported (March 30, 1980) one incident in which Rees and his friend, Herb Romerstein, deliberately set out to disrupt a symposium on terrorism put together by the Washington Press Club Post of the American Legion.

One longtime follower of Rees's career told The SPOTLIGHT (Sept. 14, 1981): "Rees collects and trades information the way some people collect and trade stamps. It's both a hobby and a career with him. It's virtually his whole life."

The information, however, is not always accurate. A case in point involved the relationship between and among Liberty Lobby, the Washington-based populist institution and former publisher of The SPOTLIGHT, renowned security and counterintelligence expert Mitchell L. WerBell III and former U.S. Labor Party presidential candidate Lyndon H. LaRouche Jr.

In reporting in August, 1977 on WerBell's decision to oversee the physical safety and security of LaRouche, whose name had surfaced on a Baader-Meinhof "hit list," "Information Digest"—Rees's vehicle for disseminating his suspect intelligence information—asserted that WerBell had first come into contact with the former Marxist USLP leader through a Liberty Lobby official, an old friend of WerBell's who had supposedly vouched for the group as a responsible one.

When Liberty Lobby contacted Rees to explain that the facts had been reversed, and that it was WerBell who introduced Liberty Lobby to LaRouche, Rees refused to make a correction. Even efforts by WerBell, a constituent and supporter of McDonald, to obtain a retraction of the false information proved fruitless. McDonald, in fact, refused to use his good offices with Rees when so requested by his constituent.

What Rees did during the period from 1955 until he surfaced in the United States in 1962 remains unknown. His false assertions that he had been a writer for the London "Daily Mirror" were refuted by that paper in the early 1960s.

Because of false and malicious statements by Rees, he is currently being sued for libel by Liberty Lobby. His responses to questions in deposition have been so evasive a federal magistrate had to order him to answer questions.

Evidence Indicting Libya Forged?

A secret report revealing that the "evidence" used by administration officials to indict Libya as a "terrorist state" may have been fabricated—almost certainly without President Ronald Reagan's knowledge—has stirred sharp behind-the-scenes disputes among White House aides and congressional leaders.

The SPOTLIGHT has learned that the Joint Chiefs of Staff have, on urgent White House orders, drawn up final operational plans for three alternative "surgical strikes" against Libya.

Each scenario involves naval-air strikes against "terrorist" training camps, military installations and other strategic facilities on Libyan territory.

Late in the evening of Monday, April 7, Reagan reportedly approved one of the three blueprints and issued orders to prepare for attack. The action is based largely on the Libyan government's own microwave messages, relayed by satellite among Tripoli, Libya and other foreign

capitals. Intercepted and decoded by U.S. intelligence, these messages supposedly provide proof of Libyan strongman Col. Muammar el-Qaddafi's complicity in terrorist activities.

But The SPOTLIGHT has learned that the Mossad, Israel's secret service, has acquired the technological capability to alter the message traffic flowing through the worldwide satellite relay system. The system uses microwave beams to transmit confidential diplomatic and corporate texts.

The satellite channel has been regarded as tamperproof by security experts.

But two key intelligence specialists who specialize in electronic intelligence and signal intelligence technology have told The SPOTLIGHT that five years ago the CIA funded a closely guarded research project aimed at finding a way to "edit" these microwave transmissions.

TAMPERING DEVICE

Given a special top-secret code word classification and known only to a handful of intelligence officials, the program came up with a design for a gun diode microwave transmitter.

The crucial form and function of this complex device are not difficult to explain. According to The SPOTLIGHT's sources, it consists of a portable microwave transmitter-receiver, miniaturized to a weight of about 95 pounds. The transmitter is packed into what appear, superficially, to be two trunks.

room, set it on its stand, plug it into a wall socket, open the window and aim it at one of the familiar, large, rooftop dish microwave relay stations. And— presto—it works," said a source who has spent more than two decades on some of the U.S. government's most highly classified electronic research projects.

How does it work? "It's simple," said this source: "You are looking through your window at a satellite relay dish,

right? Now suppose it is, at that very moment, transmitting a coded message from the Libyan ambassador at UN headquarters in New York, back to his boss [Qaddafi] in Libya. The report deals with nothing more exciting than the latest trade negotiations with France. But now you aim your gun diode transmitter at this same rooftop relay dish, and you insert your own coded message.

"That message may be very different."

It may say: 'Bombing mission accomplished; four dead.'"
FOOLING WHITE HOUSE

But what happens next? And what if these transmissions are intercepted by U.S. intelligence—by the National Security Agency (NSA), which spends billions yearly eavesdropping on just such messages?

"That's just the beauty of it. That's why this gun diode transmitter is such an electronic marvel," explained this source. "The NSA does intercept every message sent by the Libyans, and it breaks the code, and then sends the clear-text intercept to the White House.

"Now, if you have made proper use of that little gun diode transmitter in your hotel window, you will have inserted your message into the official communication sent by the Libyan ambassador. The words, 'Bombing mission accomplished; four dead,' will appear on the NSA intercept as if they were part of the embassy message. That is how President Reagan will read it.

"There is no trace in the final clear text that an electronic 'editor' has inserted some words into the communica-



tion. No wonder Reagan gets angry and says, 'Retaliate.'

"He has no idea the intercept has been doctored."

Is the CIA falsifying the electronic messages of the Libyan government? "We don't think so," agreed both sources. "What troubles us—and should trouble the American people—is that the CIA has made this super-secret technology available to the Mossad.

"There is no question about it; the Mossad now buys its spare parts and maintenance from the same U.S. contractors that built this device for the CIA."

The Mossad is known for a long his-

tory of disinformation operations aimed at driving a wedge between America and the nations of Islam. During the mid-1960s, Israeli secret agents staged a series of "terrorist" raids on U.S. offices, libraries and other facilities in Egypt, in order to fuel a conflict between that nation and the United States, much as the tension with Libya is now being fueled by reports of terrorist incidents (see related story, pages 4 and 5).
MOSSAD MIMATES BRITS

The penchant of foreign espionage services to tamper with the communications of other nations in order to lure the United States into war has even older antecedents: During the early years of World War II, the New York bureau of the British Secret Intelligence Service regularly intercepted all air mail flown by "clipper" between the United States and continental Europe.

It forged, altered and fabricated key items of correspondence sent by the German government and major German corporations to their representatives in the United States. As Sir William Stephenson, one of the agents in charge of this criminal enterprise, related it decades later, the operation was simple:

The British knew the FBI would also monitor all mail from Germany after it arrived in New York. By planting forged evidence and fabricated clues into this correspondence, the British deceived the FBI—and ultimately, American public opinion—into the belief that Germans was a hostile power, involved in plans against U.S. interests.

Is the same operation now being re-

peated by the Mossad, using the latest electronic microwave technology for falsifying satellite communications? Only an objective investigation, conducted in public, can provide an answer.

Recognizing that mounting international violence is a serious problem, anti-terrorist experts have recommended a number of urgent security measures to the White House. First priority, in the view of these specialists, should go to reinforcing the leaky U.S. borders, where armed thugs can infiltrate at will—not to hitting Libya (see page 10).

By the attached teletype dated 4/7/85, the Portland Office advised as follows:

On 4/6/85, Federal search warrants were executed at two residences of SPC members. In one residence, a rifle, a handgun and an illegal sawed-off shotgun were seized. In the other residence, a gun safe was seized, along with several thousand rounds of .45 caliber ammunition.

The gun safe was opened and one semiautomatic MAC-10 and 11 rifles were seized. There were also some silver bars and coins in the safe.

The automobile of an SPC member was searched and a gallon can of gasoline, several glass bottles, and a map pinpointing targeted judges' residences were seized along with the vehicle.

Interviews of SPC members were attempted during above searches, but were unproductive. Investigation is continuing, and the Assistant United States Attorney will present information developed during searches to a Federal grand jury for the purpose of obtaining indictments against some of the SPC members.

The search warrants were executed on April 6, 1985, at approximately 6:00 a.m. A sawed-off shotgun was found at the [redacted] residence, along with other rifles and handguns. Numerous handguns and rifles, including a semi-automatic Ingram with thousands of rounds of ammunition, thousands of dollars worth of silver and money, was removed from the residence.

FBI Agents attempted to interview [redacted] at the [redacted] residence and were apprised of the "Advice of Rights." They refused to sign the waiver form and although [redacted] was verbally abusive during the entire time, none of the three made any statements as to their involvement in the planning of the firebombings. [redacted] was interviewed at his residence and denied any knowledge of a plan to firebomb the residences of local Judges. [redacted] was also interviewed at the same residence concurrently and refused even to acknowledge whether she understood her legal rights after agents administered them to her. [redacted] was subsequently interviewed on three separate occasions and denied knowing of any plan to firebomb the residences of Judges homes.

On April 6, 1985, [REDACTED] of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI), returned to the residence of [REDACTED]

About 15 minutes before returning, the agents had completed their interview of [REDACTED]. After leaving [REDACTED] the agents were instructed on the two-way radio, to seize the [REDACTED] Chevrolet located at [REDACTED] residence.

Upon returning, it was observed that the keys to the Chevrolet were in the ignition switch, and all the doors were locked. From observation, a book map of Portland could be seen in plain view on the rear shelf of the Chevrolet.

While endeavoring to unlock the door to the vehicle with a coat hanger [REDACTED] was approached by [REDACTED] who accused [REDACTED] of having been inside the vehicle. [REDACTED] said, "I saw you, you were in the car." "I saw you, you broke in." "You were in there, I saw you." [REDACTED] explained that he had not yet been inside the vehicle, but was endeavoring to do so. After several minutes of effort, the door on the passenger side was opened. [REDACTED] got into the driver's seat and started the car. [REDACTED] was told that the agents were seizing the vehicle based on probable cause and the seizure had been authorized by the United States Attorney.

[REDACTED] insisted that he wanted names of the agents and authorities in charge on paper. He attempted to take a piece of paper from the rear seat of the Chevrolet and [REDACTED] still seated in the car, took the paper from [REDACTED] hand and returned it to the back seat. [REDACTED] attempted to reach across [REDACTED] for the keys, which were in the ignition. [REDACTED] pushed [REDACTED] back out of the car. [REDACTED] was cautioned by [REDACTED] that his conduct might subject him to arrest for interfering.

The Chevrolet was then driven by [REDACTED] away from the house and west on [REDACTED]. After getting a reasonable distance from [REDACTED] the car was parked on the shoulder of the highway. Information had been received during a telephone conversation with the Portland Office of the FBI, that there was gasoline being stored in the trunk of the Chevrolet. In

order to provide for the safety of _____ and other motorists, the trunk of the vehicle was opened. In the trunk was found, among other things, a five gallon gasoline can, which appeared to be full of liquid. The top of the can appeared to be closed tightly. _____ noted that according to the fuel gage in the car, the vehicle gasoline tank was full.

Other items observed in plain view when the trunk was opened for inspection, were four glass containers with lids, which appeared to be approximately one gallon containers. A funnel was observed.

In the back seat of the Chevrolet, there was a light blue suitcase and assorted other items. None of the contents of the Chevrolet interior or trunk were examined, except the gasoline tank, which was checked to see if it was full and sealed.

Pursuant to a search warrant issued April 5, 1985, by Chief U.S. District Judge OWEN M. PANNER, Portland, Oregon, contact was made at the residence located at [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] knocked on the front door of the residence and a woman who later identified herself as [REDACTED] answered. [REDACTED] identified himself as a Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation and stated that U. S. District Judge OWEN M. PANNER had issued a warrant to search the residence. The white male was asked by [redacted] if he was [redacted] and he in fact acknowledged to [redacted] that he was, and the white female asked what was going on, and was again advised by [redacted] that a search warrant had been issued for the residence.

She was asked by [redacted] if she was [redacted] but made no response to that question, and at that time [redacted] advised [redacted] that she in fact was [redacted]

Subsequent to the initial entry into the residence, [redacted] both viewed a copy of the search warrant for the residence which was furnished to them by [redacted] on at least two or three occasions, asked [redacted] what was going on and "what is this all about?"

[redacted] was told by [redacted] to read the copy of the search warrant as it named the articles being sought, and after reading it he then asked [redacted] what plastic explosives were, and was advised by [redacted] that they were explosives of the C4 type.

They were further advised by [REDACTED] that following the completion of the search of the residence a copy of the search warrant and all items seized would be left at the residence or left in their possession.

During the course of the contact between [REDACTED] [REDACTED] after [REDACTED] was dressed and as she was getting off of the fold-down couch she started to pick up a yellow pad of paper and she was advised by [REDACTED] that she could not remove the pad and to leave it in its position.

She then advised that she only wanted to remove a piece of paper from the pad and was allowed to remove a clean piece of paper from the pad at which time she then started to ask the identity of the Agents.

[REDACTED] were advised by [REDACTED] that all the people present were federal Agents, further that the individual Agents were not going to give either of them their names, as a copy of the search warrant would be left with them, and further that the Agents in charge of the search would be leaving their names on the receipt for any items that they seized during the subsequent search.

[REDACTED] were advised [REDACTED] that both of them had initially been exhibited [REDACTED] FBI credentials upon entry into the residence, and that many of the Agents would be departing from the residence as they were not going to be involved in the search of the residence.

At this time [REDACTED] [REDACTED] exited the residence.







[REDACTED] During course of the investigation, search warrants were served on two of the member's residences resulting in the seizure of numerous rifles, handguns, and one sawed-off shotgun.

Subsequent follow-up investigation failed to substantiate the alleged conspiracy to firebomb judges' residence.

On June 18, 1985, a Federal Grand Jury in Portland, Oregon, indicted one of the posse members, [REDACTED] for possession of a sawed-off shotgun, violation of Title 26, United States Code, Sections 5845, 5861(D), and 5871.

On June 20, 1985, initial trial date was set before United States District Judge Redden for July 30, 1985. The trial date was delayed a number of times due to [REDACTED]

On January 22, 1986, United States District Court Judge Helen Frye ordered [REDACTED] to have a medical checkup on January 30, 1986, by his own physician to determine if he was mentally and physically capable of standing trial.

On February 28, 1986, Assistant United States Attorney (AUSA) Kenneth C. Bauman, Portland, Oregon, advised that [REDACTED] was scheduled for a psychiatric examination on March 10, 1986, by a court-appointed physician. The court ordered
