

Reference is made to your request for information concerning the captioned individual subsequent to information furnished to you in 1959.

The "Daily Worker" for June 18, 1959, contained an article entitled "200 Notables Back International Workers Order Court Fight." This article revealed that 200 Americans from all parts of the United States had filed an Amicus Curiae brief with the New York Supreme Court asking dismissal of the New York Insurance Superintendent's petition to liquidate the International Workers Order. Among those reported as signers of the brief was Professor Rudolf Carnap.

The International Workers Order has been designated pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

The June 20, 1959, issue of the "St. Louis Post - Dispatch" contained an article entitled "We Join Black's Dissent." This article concerned a movement sponsored by the National Council of the Arts, Sciences and Professions supporting a rehearing in the case of communist leaders before the Supreme Court. Rudolf Carnap was listed as one of the signers of this statement. (100-435817-58)

The National Council of Arts, Sciences and Professions has been cited as a communist front by the Committee on Un-American Activities, House Report Number 1954, dated April 19, 1949. EX-100 REC-23 100-410122-2

On September 5, 1961, a confidential informant who has furnished reliable information in the past made available a letter and list of sponsors of the National Assembly for Democratic Rights. The list of sponsors included the name of "Rudolf Carnap, 11645 Chenault Street, Los Angeles 49, California." The Committee on Un-American Activities, House

REPORT NUMBER 1282, dated October 3, 1961, stated as follows  
from the files of the National Assembly for Democratic Rights, "On  
the basis of its investigations and hearings to date, the  
Committee concludes that the National Assembly for Democratic  
Rights and a coordinating and organizing group in support  
thereof, entitled the 'Citizens Committee for Constitutional  
Liberties,' are communist fronts." (100-435817-12)

On February 13, 1962, a confidential informant  
who has furnished reliable information in the past provided  
a copy of a Petition for Clemency to the President of the  
United States on behalf of Carl Braden and Frank Wilkinson.  
This petition contained the names of approximately 3,000  
individuals who supported executive clemency for Braden and  
Wilkinson whose appeals to the Supreme Court of the United  
States were denied on February 27, 1961, following conviction  
and sentence for contempt of Congress. Among the signatures  
listed in this document was that of "Rudolf Carnap, UCLA,  
California."

In April, 1962, a confidential informant who has  
furnished reliable information in the past provided a copy  
of a petition addressed to the President of the United States  
protesting the prosecution of the Communist Party under the  
Internal Security Act of 1950 and the application of the act  
to other organizations. This was accompanied by a letter  
soliciting signatures on the petition. This letter stated  
that 200 persons acting as "initiators" had earlier signed a  
similar petition. Among the names listed as one of the  
"initiators" was "Professor Rudolf Carnap, Los Angeles  
California, Professor of Philosophy, University of California,
