With reference to the identity of [redacted] Special Agent [redacted] advised that [redacted]

[redacted] He was described as being more or less an associate of BEN SIEGEL and JACK DRAGNA and originally [redacted] was to be BEN SIEGEL's front man in the Flamingo Hotel, in view of his good name and reputation. [redacted]

stated that he believed that this incident occurred at the Del Mar Race Track, but it could have been Hollywood Park Race Track.

It was reported that on September 11, 1946 BEN SIEGEL conferred with JACK DRAGNA and generally inquired as to his business. SIEGEL also stated he had been in touch with "that kid" (believed to be [redacted] one of DRAGNA's assistants). DRAGNA related that they were to "come out" on the 25th (this is thought to refer to the new wire service in Los Angeles). SIEGEL inquired if DRAGNA had a shoot (hardball or run-down shoot) and DRAGNA answered in the affirmative and remarked that it could be so good without a shoot. DRAGNA then asked if SIEGEL's people had opened over their [wire service in Las Vegas] and SIEGEL indicated that they were willing to do the same in San Diego but had been stalling. [redacted]

[REDACTED] recently had an appointment to have the service in next week, DRAGNA inquired as to the kind of service they were getting from the tracks over here (California). SIEGEL asked whether DRAGNA was referring to "our people" (TRANS-AMERICAN) or the other people (CONTINENTAL NEWS) and DRAGNA indicated the former. SIEGEL informed him that they were getting good service. However, if anything came up and DRAGNA was not getting anything he could get it from SIEGEL. SIEGEL stated that if he got the wire and opened he would call DRAGNA.

At that time DRAGNA inquired as to what the little fellow, [REDACTED] had said and SIEGEL replied that DRAGNA knew what he wanted and that [REDACTED] had said that if anything happened they could get together. Further, [REDACTED] related that they would throw him out. However, BEN told him that they would not as they would take care of him. Also that he [REDACTED] would get any help that JACK or BEN could give. SIEGEL remarked that he had told [REDACTED] to keep expenses down. According to SIEGEL [REDACTED] had informed him that JACK had "five" and SIEGEL told him to try to work with it. SIEGEL thought [REDACTED] had been cooperating very well.

VIRGINIA HILL

As a result of spot surveillances conducted with reference to the activities of BEN SIEGEL, the following information was developed on September 10, and 11, 1946 through a surveillance conducted by Special Agents [redacted] and the writer.

On September 10, 1946, this surveillance was picked up at 9700 Wilshire Boulevard, which is the offices of [redacted] and others at approximately 3:30 P.M. It was ascertained that SIEGEL, VIRGINIA HILL and a third party who was unknown but later identified as possibly being [redacted] drove off in SIEGEL's car and they were surveilled to the Jules Park Dress Shop at the corner of Beverly Drive and Wilshire Boulevard. Thereafter, these individuals proceeded to Hollywood and subsequently parked in the vicinity of the Gables Apartment, 8250 Fountain Avenue, Hollywood. At that time SIEGEL and VIRGINIA HILL walked to a position near the Gables Apartment and pointed in the direction of one of the floors in the apartment building and thereafter returned to their car and drove away.

On September 11, 1946, surveillance was again picked up at [redacted] at 9700 Wilshire Boulevard, where [redacted] BEN SIEGEL and an individual believed to be [redacted] left the building and proceeded to a parking lot in the rear of this office building. [redacted] was observed to drive away in his car; however, SIEGEL and the other individual were not seen to depart from the parking lot. Thereafter VIRGINIA HILL was observed in SIEGEL's automobile with another individual in the vicinity of JERRY ROTHCHILD's Barber Shop, Beverly Drive near Wilshire Boulevard. At this time [redacted] approached the car and spoke to VIRGINIA HILL and the other individual. Shortly afterwards BEN SIEGEL and an individual thought to be [redacted] approached the car and these persons engaged in the conversation for approximately one-half hour. BEN SIEGEL, VIRGINIA HILL, and the third individual were surveilled to the Mission Village Motel, 5675 West Washington Boulevard. At this point SIEGEL, HILL and the other individual sat at a table in the coffee shop of the Motel and later SIEGEL and HILL were observed to depart after approximately one and one-half hours. The other individual remained in the Motel. SIEGEL and HILL drove to the apartment, located at 1325 North Gower and it was observed that SIEGEL was in conversation with three women at one time. The identity of the women were not known. SIEGEL then proceeded to [redacted] 721 North Doheny and the surveillance was discontinued as it appeared that SIEGEL was then proceeding to VIRGINIA HILL's apartment to retire for the evening.

On September 11, 1946, Special Agents [redacted] went to the Mission Village Motel and under pretext determined that the third party with SIEGEL and VIRGINIA HILL was [redacted] This information was

obtained from [redacted] who works in the coffee shop and who voluntarily advised that [redacted] had sprained her ankle and that [redacted] had been asked by VIRGINIA HILL to help her in moving into her new home. [redacted] also stated that [redacted] had left HILL in the coffee shop and had left for her living quarters in view of the pain she was suffering from her ankle, at that time no further information was obtainable. It was noted that the license indicated that the operator of the hotel was [redacted]. Agents [redacted] then proceeded to VIRGINIA HILL's residence, 10814 Wilshire Blvd., and it was ascertained that SIEGEL and HILL had apparently retired for the evening. b2

On September 12, 1946, a surveillance was made of VIRGINIA HILL's residence by Special Agents [redacted] and the writer; however, no unusual activities were noted for that day and there was no apparent contact by any individuals who would be interested in this investigation. Special Agents [redacted] made a contact with the local post office carrier, [redacted] who delivered mail to VIRGINIA HILL's apartment and arrangements were made through him to advise this office in the event that he received information regarding a forwarding address for VIRGINIA HILL. At the time of the interview the carrier had no information to indicate that HILL contemplated moving. b2

Under pretext Special Agent [redacted] telephonically ascertained through the manager of the apartment where VIRGINIA HILL resides that there would be a vacancy in that building beginning October 1, 1946. She further stated that she intended to move into the pent house which was being vacated. It is to be noted that VIRGINIA HILL resides in the pent house at 10814 Wilshire Boulevard. b2

Subsequent contact with this carrier by Special Agent [redacted] verified the fact that there would be a vacancy in the pent house beginning October 1, 1946 and the carrier has left forwarding address cards with the occupants. [redacted] b2

Efforts are being made to determine the new address at which VIRGINIA HILL will move in order to effect complete coverage of that address as BEN SIEGEL undoubtedly will stay with VIRGINIA HILL. It has been noted in the past by surveillance and confidential sources that SIEGEL has been living with HILL.

It has been noted through spot surveillances and through information furnished by [redacted] that [redacted] has been in very frequent contact with BEN SIEGEL and it is believed that [redacted] is an associate of SIEGEL's in a similar capacity as that of [redacted]. Further it has been noted that [redacted] has accompanied [redacted] on trips to Las Vegas and that when SIEGEL has been out of this city [redacted] has taken care of SIEGEL's personal automobile. During the course of the spot surveillance conducted by Special Agents [redacted] and the writer, it was noted on September 11, 1946 that VIRGINIA HILL was observed in a black Chrysler Convertible owned by SIEGEL on the street opposite JERRY ROECHILD's Barber Shop in Beverly Hills. At this time [redacted] was observed to proceed across the street and talk to VIRGINIA HILL and another individual in the car. Shortly thereafter BEN SIEGEL and another man with red hair who was thought to be [redacted] appeared and these individuals engaged in conversation which lasted approximately one-half hour. Thereafter [redacted] left this group and BEN SIEGEL, VIRGINIA HILL, and the unknown individual drove off in SIEGEL's car.

MEYER LANSKY

[redacted] reported that on August 29, 1946 an individual believed to be MEYER LANSKY called BEN SIEGEL from New York City at which time BEN complained of the difficulties which he was having in connection with the C.P.A. hearings regarding the hotel. Arrangements were made for SIEGEL to call LANSKY the next day at Cousin Dan's place at 1:00 P.M., New York time. LANSKY stated that he was at Danny's place at that time.

This source reported that on September 10, 1946, [redacted] New York City, placed a call for BEN SIEGEL; however, he was not at home and the call was not completed.

On September 11, 1946, [redacted] stated [redacted] called from New York and talked to [redacted]. After an exchange of greetings [redacted] then spoke to an individual whom she called MEYER and who is thought to be MEYER LANSKY. At this time arrangements were made for BEN to call LANSKY at the same place where BEN had talked to him two weeks previous or SIEGEL could reach him at Dan's that evening.

On September 13, 1946, [redacted] reported that [redacted] called for M. LANSKY at CHickering 4-5050, New York City. This call was not completed. CHickering 4-5050 is listed to the Embury Distributing Company, 525 West 53rd Street, New York City. MEYER LANSKY is an officer in the Embury Distributing Company which previously was known as the Manhattan Simplex Distributing Company.

Through [redacted] it was ascertained on September 16, 1946 that SIEGEL received a Western Union telegram [redacted] from MEYER at New York City as follows: "Called you this morning, will call you again tomorrow." The New York Field Office was requested on September 16, 1946 to determine the place from which MEYER LANSKY placed his calls and numbers to which the calls were placed.

The referenced report of Special Agent [redacted] dated September 3, 1946 at Los Angeles, reflects that information was received from [redacted] on August 28, 1946 that [redacted] intended to leave for Del Mar, California that weekend.

This same source reported that [redacted] returned to Los Angeles on September 4, 1946. Information regarding [redacted] activities in connection with JACK DRAGNA and MEYER LANSKY have been set forth under the respective headings of DRAGNA and LANSKY and is not being repeated here.

[redacted] stated on September 12, 1946 that [redacted] was in contact with [redacted] at the Hoffman Hotel, Portland, Oregon and [redacted] stated that he was in Portland to open up a place there and also was working on a deal in Spokane, Washington. It appeared from the discussion that these offices had to do with running race horse books at Portland and Spokane. [redacted] asked [redacted] to come to Portland and arrangements were made for [redacted] to come up to Portland during the week of September 16, 1946. [redacted] was to arrange for reservations at the Benson Hotel, Portland.

Since your discussion with Mr. Connelley, seven additional technical surveillances have been installed in the Chicago area. At the present time eight technical surveillances are being operated in Chicago; [REDACTED]

Mr. Ostholtzoff advised upon his arrival in Los Angeles, that two Agents were assigned to the handling of the technical surveillances in Las Vegas, Nevada. The Los Angeles Division by teletype has advised that Radio Commentator Drew Pearson in his broadcast on the evening of September 29, 1946 reported that work on the Flamingo Hotel was to be stopped on order of John D. Small. However, according to the Los Angeles Division, work on this project was continuing on the morning of September 30, 1946.

Los Angeles reports that this apparently refers to the CPA hearings in San Francisco.

On October 1, 1946 the Los Angeles Division advised that construction work on the Flamingo Hotel was continuing on that date. It was further stated that telegrams were reportedly sent from Las Vegas by a veterans organization and labor union to John Small requesting that he withdraw the stop order and allow the work on the hotel to continue. The Los Angeles Division is checking to determine whether these telegrams were actually sent and, if so, the nature of their contents.

Siegel, in a conversation with [REDACTED] one of his associates, indicated that he was having another "headache" and when [REDACTED] inquired if he was referring to the "thing on the air last night" believed to be the radio broadcast of Drew Pearson, Siegel replied in the affirmative, stating that he did not know who was giving "us the headaches". Siegel further stated that he had spoken to "Back East" and that [REDACTED] represents him and that he had instructed that efforts be made to find out "what the H--- it's all about". Upon [REDACTED] inquiry, Siegel indicated that he thought "it" would start something, but he did not know and indicated that if they were going to start "I am going to forget about the whole CD thing".

The Los Angeles Division has further advised that Siegel has reservations to depart via American Airlines from Los Angeles at 10:10 PM, October 3, 1946 for New York where he will arrive at 2:20 PM October 4. Siegel has indicated that he will contact his former wife, Esther Siegel. [REDACTED] Siegel's close associate and leg man, left Los Angeles for New York on September 30, 1946, and was to register at the Waldorf Astoria on October 1, 1946. He is expected to be in New York about three weeks.
