JOHN J. HANLEY signed the letter of JOHN J. HANLEY and JOHN J. HANLEY.
The letter was sent over the air on WJLB on August 11, 1943.

JOHN J. HANLEY, former announcer of Station WJLB, advised that on 8/20,
1943, he was called personally by Special Agent [redacted] at New York City. He
stated that he has been over Station WJLB since 1930 in New York City, every
day except Sunday, under the title of "WJLB Radio Station, 100
Madison Avenue". He stated that he spends about fifteen minutes per day in con-
versation concerning Mussolini and the Fascists in Italy, praising the
Government and promoting the sale of United States War Bonds, etc. He
stated that he receives about 100 letters per week, one to ten per cent of
which call for his withdrawal and criticize his attack on Mussolini and predict
his removal for him that befell CAROL B. BROWN.

JOHN J. HANLEY formerly announced the names of parties requesting various
selections over the air, but he ceased doing this because the requesting
parties generally received defamatory letters.

JOHN J. HANLEY stated that he had a radio program from 1933 to 1937 over
station WJLB, which program was paid for by commercial sponsors, and from
1937 to 1939, he appeared on station WJLB. He stated that he cannot get a
sponsor at present because of his anti-Fascist statements.

JOHN J. HANLEY advised that he has talked occasionally for the Anti-Nazi
League and has been paid \$20.00 for each one of his talks. He added that as
a result of his campaign over the air during the month of December, 1942, he
sold \$10,000 worth of United States War Bonds.

Letter to the Director

September 7, 1948

As personal background information, W. J. ... advised that he was born on March 19, 1876, at St. Lucia, Calabria, Italy. He came to the United States in 1912 on the SS CLYDE. He stated that he applied immediately for United States citizenship and was called for his final papers in 1914, at Boston, Massachusetts, but was in the hospital at that time and did not get his papers. W. J. ... has never returned to Italy and has four children, three of whom were born in his native country. He stated that all of his children are United States citizens and one is a soldier in the United States Army.

W. J. ... was a member of the ... and a member of the Italian Socialist Party in America. In addition, ... written for LA RIFORMA, the Italian Socialist newspaper. For years he has edited ... published, ... letters to the ... all of which were critical to Mussolini and the Fascist Government.

W. J. ... stated he had never received any threatening letters at LA RIFORMA and had not made any anti-Fascist statements in over the air until recently. W. J. ... had no idea as to the writers of the letters, other than the names which he later submitted, and which have previously been set forth herein.

In connection with W. J. ... visit to the New York Field Office, he left a number of letters which had been sent to him threatening his life. These letters were sent to the New York Field Division on May 13, 1948, to the FBI Laboratory for comparison with other writings of a similar nature in the national security file.

Information regarding ... was available in the files of the New York Field Division.

SECOND TRESKA SLAYING WITNESS
ARRESTED, HELD IN \$25,000 BAIL

A second material witness, said to have "vital information" relating to the murder of CARLO TRESKA, Italian-born anti-Fascist and radical editor, who was shot to death last Jan. 11, has been arrested and confined to the House of Detention, Third Avenue and 161st Street, the Bronx, under \$25,000 bail, the office of District Attorney Frank S. Hogan announced yesterday.

The witness, FRANK NUCCIO, twenty-four years old, of 265 Elizabeth Street, who has a record of four arrests as a small-time bootlegger, was taken into custody last Thursday night on the lower East Side by Detective Joseph Potter, of the 10th Squad, who is attached to the District Attorney's office.

CARMINE GILBERTI, a thirty-five-year-old gunman with a nineteen-year record of crime and imprisonment, who was seen, about two hours before Mr. TRESKA's assassination, getting into the car in which the killer later escaped, has been held as a material witness since two days after the slaying on a technical charge of parole violation.

NUCCIO was arraigned secretly before Judge Owen W. Rohan in General Sessions on Friday morning on an affidavit signed by Detective Potter. The detective asserted he had reason to believe that NUCCIO might not appear before the grand jury when required, although, he said, NUCCIO "had vital information in the matter of the killing of CARLO TRESKA on Jan. 11, 1943, at the northwest corner of Fifth Avenue and Fiftieth Street."

"Due to the character of the case and the people involved who are still at large", the affidavit continued, "this witness may be intimidated or otherwise prevented from appearing to testify."

The District Attorney's office refused to disclose further details concerning NUCCIO's connection with the TRESKA murder. Jacob Grumet, Assistant District Attorney in charge of the homicide bureau, said merely: "We believe that he has information that we can consider vital in the TRESKA murder case."

NUCCIO's record shows that he was arrested once in 1940 for the illegal sale of a gallon of wine at his home. He paid a \$25 fine in Magistrate's Court. In 1942 he was arrested by alcohol-tax agents on a charge of illegal possession of 145 barrels holding fifty gallons of wine each at 296 Elizabeth Street. On last April 27 he was arrested again by Federal agents in the illegal possession of 429 gallons of wine at his home, and on July 7 he was picked up in a raid on a 675-gallon still at 264 Elizabeth Street. He has been free under bail on the last three charges.

The identity of Mr. TRESKA's slayer has remained a mystery since the night the sixty-year-old editor was shot by a lone gunman, once in the head and once in the back, as he walked in the dimmed-out street with a friend, GIUSEPPE CALABI, of 415 Central Park West. It is generally believed that Mr. TRESKA, who, with Mr. CALABI, published the anti-Fascist newspaper "IL MARVELLO" at 2 West Fifteenth Street, was killed by underworld gangsters hired by Fascists or Communists, both hated by Mr. TRESKA.

Two weeks ago ETTORIO MANFREDI, sixty-one, of 35-05 Eighty-seventh Street, Jackson Heights, Queens, a frequent contributor of anti-Fascist articles to the Italian-language press, who was described as a friend of Mr. TRESKA, was stabbed while attending an anti-Fascist meeting at the Labor Temple Presbyterian, 222 East Fourteenth Street, at Second Avenue.

The District Attorney's office, however, denied any knowledge of a connection between the stabbing and the murder of Mr. TRESKA.

Confidential Informant [redacted] whose identity is known to the Bureau, advises that FRANK NUCCIO, who was recently apprehended as a material witness in connection with the murder of TRUSCA, may not have any definite information to offer the Police, but that the reason he was apprehended was so that an excuse could be furnished for still holding CARMINE GALANTE, who is suspected of being directly connected with the murderers.

This informant further advises that FRANK GAROFALO, who had been rumored to have left the United States for Mexico, actually never went to that country. From Florida, where he was last reported, he went to Colorado, and now has returned to New York, New York. The store at 176 Avenue A, where GAROFALO conducted his cheese business, is now occupied by a pipe fitter, evidently indicating that GAROFALO has discontinued his business.

Confidential Informant [redacted] has stated that he will obtain further information regarding the status of the TRUSCA case [redacted] and as soon as possible such information as it obtained will be furnished to the Bureau.



MEMORANDUM FOR MR. Tamm

Re: Carlo Tresca

BACKGROUND

You will recall that in the previous memoranda which have been prepared relative to the assassination of Carlo Tresca on January 11, 1943, the following facts were set forth:

1. Tresca, an Italian by birth, came to the United States in 1902, a political refugee, having been sentenced to a prison term of two years for creating political agitation in Italy.
2. From the time of his arrival in the United States, the subject was considered a fanatical anarchist.
3. He was an I.W.O. organizer in the famous Lawrence, Massachusetts, textile strikes in 1918.
4. He was a prominent member of the Peace-Venezuela Defense Committee.
5. He was likewise prominent in many labor strikes and had the reputation of being the only perpetual suspect in the files of the New York Police Department in so far as the placing and throwing of bombs was concerned.
6. He was the editor of "Il Martello", a rabidly anarchist and rabidly anti-Communist Italian publication.
7. He was a member of the American Committee to Defend Leon Trotsky in 1937 and 1938.

MURDER OF TRESCA

Tresca was killed on January 11, 1943, as he was leaving the offices of his newspaper, "Il Martello", 96 5th Avenue, New York City. Being a well-known figure, his case was given a tremendous amount of publicity. Although a great deal has been written concerning the case, the relevant material in the Bureau's possession at the present time may be summarized as follows:

1. Tresca's friends immediately charged that Communists were responsible for the murder; the Communists counteracted with the allegation that the agents of the O.V.R.A. (Italian Secret Police) had committed the crime. These charges and countercharges continued to be disseminated until

the various newspapers publishing such statements finally tired of their efforts.

2. Apparently from the outset, the New York Police Department and New York State District Attorney Frank Hogan have had only two good suspects: Jesus Terranova "Tucchi", alias Carlos Contreras, a known Communist and alleged C.P.U. agent in Mexico City; and Carmine Galante, an habitual criminal who evidently is concerned with no particular political belief.

2. Carmine Galante, 35, has a record of crime dating back nineteen years. This record reflects that he has been arrested on numerous occasions on charges including juvenile delinquency, assault, robbery, and homicide. According to newspaper reports, Galante was seen by two New York City parole officers one and one-half hours before the murder, in the car which is said to have been utilized by the person or persons who committed the crime. Galante was taken into custody immediately following the murder and has been retained in custody since that date, reportedly as a material witness.

RECORD OF OTHER OCCURRENCES

1. On September 15, 1941, one Frank Ruccio, 24, who is described in New York circles as a "potty bootlegger", was taken into custody as a second material witness in the slaying of Tresca.

2. On September 1, 1943, one Arturo Manfredi, Italian-born anti-Fascist radio commentator and friend of Tresca, was stabbed while attending a Socialist Party rally in New York City. Another Italian, Giuseppe Neri, according to the press releases, has admitted assaulting Manfredi, and the same press reports indicate that although Manfredi was a close associate of Tresca, the State District Attorney and the New York Police Department are of the opinion that there is no connection between the Manfredi assault and the Tresca assassination. (The possibility that the aforementioned opinion is ill-founded will be indicated hereinafter.)

3. A confidential informant, [REDACTED] 62,670 has advised that the New York police have nothing against Ruccio -- that he was apprehended in order that an excuse might be furnished for still holding the chief suspect in the case, Carmine Galante.

2. An examination of the information in the Bureau's files concerning Ettore Manfredi reflects the presence of a Censorship intercept which was prepared on the basis of a letter directed by an anonymous source in New York City to "Vittorio Vicali; Carlos J. Contreras, Mexico City", on February 23, 1948. This letter, which was condensed by the Censorship authorities, has been obtained for the purpose of documentary examination. In it, the anonymous source has advised Vicali, the Communist and alleged U.P.U. agent referred to above, that Ettore Manfredi, Carlo Tresca, and several other anti-Communist Italians in the New York area are "Fascist spies, loathsome, poisonous reptiles of the C.V.I.I." The letter continues, "The Director of the FBI, P. S. Foxworth. . . insisted on paying no attention to my writings and the criminal group continued undisturbed. . . . I looked out for them and I provoked disturbances in the family. . . . And the rotten carcass of Carlo Tresca has gone to the worms. . . This vermin-infested group, with protectors and accomplices, whose names I do not reveal because it is very dangerous for anyone to come into conflict with them. I don't want to take care of it." The writer then asks, "If, by any chance, they should make sacrifices of me, I suggest Alberto Cavalli." (Inasmuch as Manfredi and Tresca are "on the list" of individuals "to be taken care of" by the anonymous source, it would appear that there may be some connection between the Tresca murder and the Manfredi stabbing.)

It is to be noted that this correspondent is an affiliate of the Italian Communist and alleged U.P.U. agent, Jesus Sorrento Vicali; that he has endeavored to report to Vicali the status of certain Italians in the New York area who are rabidly anti-Communist in sentiment; and that he intimates that he has threatened the lives of these individuals in the past and that he alone "must take care" of those individuals who are still living. The original communication has been transmitted to the Document Section of the Laboratory for appropriate examination in the hope that the anonymous writer can be identified.

ACTION:

This memorandum has been prepared solely for informative purposes. As additional pertinent information is received relative to the Tresca case, it will be brought to your attention. At the same time, you will be apprised of the information resulting from the Document Section's examination, which is being conducted with respect to the anonymous communication referred to above.

signed "John Doe" was postmarked at the Grand Street Post Office
New York City at 12:30 p.m. on August 21, 1945, and was captured by
the Consular Office.

The original communication, which was received on August 21, 1945,
has been forwarded to the Office of Consular Affairs for their information and examination.
A copy of the entire letter and attached information is being furnished to
the Office of Consular Affairs of this Embassy and the Office of Consular
Affairs, New York City, for their information and action. The following individuals
will be kept advised of any further information received concerning the following individuals

It is noted that the original communication was received in New York
in the name of "John Doe" and concerning all of the names mentioned above and

It is noted that in the original communication the question of the
writer was stated "The Dir. of the S. I. P. A. records, ... in later years,

paragraph of the writer's communication, he states he looked out for them and I
provoked disturbances in the family...and the rotting brains of Carlo Tresca has

conflict with them. I alone must take care of it. If, by any chance, they should
make messages of me, I suggest Alberto Capelli."

Laboratory's file of writings pertaining to National Security as well as the Anonymous Letter File without effecting the writer's identification and without obtaining any additional specimens identical to the one in question. The Bureau's identification specialist, in examining this letter, has made the observation, however, that the spacing of the word "FALL" in the comment following the name of Alberto Mangiacapra suggests the possibility that the writer and the addressee may have some common additional knowledge concerning the "broken bones" to which the anonymous correspondent has made reference.

The following observations concerning the content of this communication are set forth for your information and guidance inasmuch as the Bureau is desirous of having expeditious, thorough and discreet inquiries conducted for the purpose of ascertaining the identity of the writer in question.

The original letter signed "O. V." was written by an individual who was apparently not too well educated, for the type of Italian language employed was both common and not entirely grammatical. In several instances the letter refers to the individuals named above as "Fascist spies", whereas, in reality, the majority of these persons are either Italian Socialists or Italian Communists and have never been identified as associating with Italian Fascists. This terminology, supplemented by the fact that the letter was intended for a known Communist, would give rise to the belief that the letter may have been written by one whose sentiments are in accord with Communist ideology. In view of the peculiar manner in which the writer was referred to the way in which Mangiacapra "fell in an elevator shaft" suffering broken bones, and inasmuch as the writer indicated that because Mangiacapra didn't die as a result of his fall, "my work remained incomplete", the possibility exists that the writer may have been responsible for Mangiacapra's mishap.

It will be noted that the first individual on the list of the anonymous writer is Ettore Manfredi, an Italian-born Socialist and friend of Tresca, who was stabbed on September 1, 1943, while attending a Socialist Party rally in New York City. Even though the New York Police Department has announced that the assault upon Manfredi was perpetrated by one Giuseppe Rudi and despite the fact that the District Attorney of New York County, who is handling the Tresca case, has announced to the press that there is no connection between the Tresca assassination and the Manfredi assault, the anonymous communication addressed to Vidali suggests the possibility that the reverse is true.

Immediately following the Manfredi assault, you were instructed to furnish the Bureau with a summarization of the information in your files concerning Ettore Manfredi. The desired information was furnished to the Bureau in your letter dated September 21, 1943, at which time you advised that your Office received an anonymous communication dated September 13, 1941, wherein it was alleged that Manfredi, Tresca, Valenti, Mangiacapra, and Cupelli were "Fascist spies". The probability exists that the anonymous communication of September 13, 1941, was prepared by the writer of the anonymous communication directed to Vidali and, accordingly, it should be sent to the Bureau for appropriate documentary examination.

It is further noted that in your letter of September 1, 1943, you advise that on February 20, 1943, Mantrell furnished your Office with a number of anonymous letters threatening all persons who were named therein that these threatening communications were sent to the Bureau for Laboratory examination under cover letter dated May 13, 1943. The Bureau has experienced difficulty in locating your letter of May 13, 1943, and in pursuance of this fact, you should advise by return mail or otherwise in writing if a letter was captioned in a way that appropriate handwriting comparison may be made by the Technical Laboratory.

Immediately following the receipt of the letter I desire that a thorough examination be made of all the references contained in the files of your Office on Carlo Tresca and on all the other individuals named in the aforementioned anonymous communication for the purpose of ascertaining whether there is any information contained therein which could aid in the identification of the author of the Vicini letter.

[redacted] In view of the fact that you have very recently on several occasions, it is suggested that you should be interviewed for the purpose of ascertaining any facts which may be helpful to the identification of the individual who sent the Vicini communication. Of course, no reference should be made in the course of your interview with [redacted] or with any other persons whom you may find it desirable to contact in this matter.

It will be apparent from a thorough reading of the facts contained in the communication that there is good cause to believe that the individual who sent the letter captioned as Vicini may have been responsible for, or co-conspirator in, the murder of Carlo Tresca. It is observed at the same time that the Bureau is extremely interested to learn of the identity of the individual who perpetrated this crime. Nonetheless, as you are aware, the Bureau has not inaugurated inquiries for the purpose of determining who is responsible for Tresca's murder nor should this communication be construed as indicating that the Bureau is at this time instituting an investigation for that purpose. In order to clarify any question that may arise, it is being specifically pointed out that it has been stated that Tresca's assassination was indeed a lawfully charged that Communist element were responsible for the murder; the Communist counteracted this allegation that the agents of the C.V.P. (Italian Secret Police) had committed the crime. Since the Bureau is interested in an intelligence plan that in its activities and operations, because of the various Italian Communist activities, he has been demanding, Squadra di ricerca, it is naturally interested in an effort to verify in it a similar any question which may arise in connection with these activities and procedures.

In pursuance of the foregoing the information should not be left with any person or persons that the Bureau is conducting any inquiries concerning the Tresca murder case and, accordingly, all persons interviewed by you concerning

this matter should be conducted in a discreet fashion. Reference should not be made to the Vinali communication mentioned here in reports at any time in the course of interviews had with outside individuals.

This matter is one in which I am personally interested and accordingly it should be given continuous attention. The report of your inquiries should be furnished to the Bureau without delay.

In 1919 Valenti was reported to have addressed a meeting sponsored by an anarchist group in Rochester, New York. His address is said to have been of an extremely radical nature. Among other things, he suggested that his listeners resort to anarchist tactics and hasten a revolution when so many people in the country are out of work and not satisfied with the conditions under which they are working. He added on that occasion, "The only thing we need to do is to train our special gangs all over the country so that when everything is ready and we want a job done here we can send one gang from some other city here to do it in order that all of you men will be able to go home then they very not near the place when the work was done. Likewise we can send one gang here in Chicago. For instance, we can send the gang from your city to do it..... We should be there to see if this gang is in order that when the strike our battle may be successful. Otherwise the government will laugh at us. Of course, if a revolution should break out now at any time it can give the government a pretty good fight but when we are better organized it will be sure to get them. We have men; we have money; and we have ammunition. The fight should not last more than three days. Then we can go to the jails and liberate our imprisoned brothers."

In 1919 an individual by the name of Valenti was said to be the editor of the socialist newspaper, "Avanti" which was printed in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, and which was edited up until 1917 by Carlo Tresca who was then an I.W.O. organizer and who has since become known as a leader of the Italian anarchist element in the United States.

Carlo Valenti is known to have taken an active part in many of the functions held by Italian socialists and Italian anarchist elements in the United States during the past twenty years. In addition he has been closely affiliated with numerous socialist periodicals which have been published in this country. For example, in October, 1921, while functioning as director of "La Parola del Popolo" of Chicago, Illinois, he attended an Italian socialist meeting held at the Board School, 7 East 15th Street, New York City. An excerpt concerning the purpose of this meeting is quoted hereinafter:

"Of having comrades here send to the comrades in Italy, who were compelled to put aside the wonderful and adored Red Flag, the news that they are working in America to raise this flag sky high and put enough men in the White House who will help crush the heads of the Fascisti and will also help to make what is known as international socialism to help rebuild Europe".

Acting in the capacity of organizer for the Federation of Socialists in the United States Valenti addressed a meeting held in Caroline Hall, Buffalo, New York, June 30, 1924. In the course of his address Valenti dwelt upon the international situation and made particular reference to the relationship between "the workers" and the Fascisti.

Information was also available that one Girolamo Valentini, editor of "La Stampa Libera", and chairman of the Italian Committee Against War and Fascism, was the principal speaker at a meeting held by this committee at Macca Temple, New York City. It was stated that the purpose of this meeting was to protest against the Italian invasion of Spain. It was reported that other speakers at this meeting were one I. Anter, who at that time was alleged to be the New York State Organizer of the Communist Party; one Amicus Most of the Socialist Party; and one Elizabeth Gurley Flynn, a famous textile strike leader and a person who has been reported on numerous occasions to be a member of the Communist Party in New York City. 61-7561-113

It was reported that on March 21, 1937, a meeting was held in New York City under the auspices of the Italian Committee Against War and Fascism, protesting the Italian invasion of Spain. One Girolamo Valentini is reported to have been chairman of this committee. During the course of the meeting, one of the speakers is alleged to have stated, "We must organize the workers for a decisive battle to overthrow Fascism in our own country." It was stated that just before this meeting adjourned, the "Internationale" was sung as well as an Italian song which, when translated, means "The Red Flag". From the information available, it could not be determined whether this meeting is the same as the one mentioned immediately above. 61-7561-60

It has also been stated that another meeting was held in New York City by the Spanish Loyalists to commemorate the fifth anniversary of the Spanish Loyalist Government. It was stated that one Valentini addressed this meeting and is reported to have raised the Internationale and the Garibaldi Brigade. Other speakers at this meeting were the Spanish Ambassador, Fernando de los Rios, and Sylvia Gonsky of Fleischman, whose husband is reported to have been killed fighting for the Loyalists in the recent Spanish Civil War.

According to an article appearing in the "Daily Worker" dated July 2, 1937, the Italian anti-Fascists held a meeting July 1, 1937, in Washington Square in New York City to protest Mussolini's attitude with reference to the Spanish Civil War. The following speakers are listed: Vito Marcantonio, described as an Italian-American progressive; one Samuel Stamer, Commander of the Abraham Lincoln Brigade; one Elizabeth Gurley Flynn, an alleged Communist Party official; and one Girolamo Valentini, editor of "La Stampa Libera." 61-7561-13647

According to the testimony of one Mr. Alsborg, given before the Special Committee to Investigate Un-American Activities, House of Representatives, one Girolamo Valentini is a member of the International Committee for Political Prisoners. DCr #4, p2897

The following information, which appears in the testimony of Walter Steele given before the Special Committee to Investigate Un-American Activities, House of Representatives, on August 17, 1937, relative to one Girolamo Valentini, is being quoted as follows:

"Valentini was born April 16, 1892 at Valguarnera, Italy. His father was the owner of a sulphur mine. He attended elementary school in Valguarnera, and high school and college at Catania, Italy. Valentini came to the United States in 1911. He organized the left-wing Italian Socialist Federation in New York City in 1913. He assisted in organizing the left-wing (C.I.O.) Amalgamated

"Clothing Workers of America (union). In 1917 - 1919 he was editor of the left-wing socialist publication, 'Avanti'. In 1919 he edited 'La Voce' and in 1921 edited 'La Parola del Popolo'. From 1922 to 1923 Valenti participated in a number of left-wing strikes in New York City. He was the author of 'Feds--A Political Prisoner' (1920), 'Third International' (1920), and 'Italian Socialist Labor Year Book' (1923 and 1924).

"On page 78 of the American Labor Year Book, Volume V, the following statement is made:

"The Convention of the Amalgamated and the Cap Makers in 1922 and 1923 went on record in favor of the formation of an inclusive Labor Party. The contributions of the needle workers to the radical organizations have been for the last two years as generous as any in their history, if not more. Besides that they contributed \$10,000,000 and European war sufferers. . . the Amalg, an Italian union daily, received close to \$10,000 up to the 1923 convention of the Amalgamated and the International, while the Furriers, during their strike, were given \$30,000. . . The needle trade unions in 1922 and 1923 again reaffirmed their demands for recognition of unity. . . The Amalgamated returned to the executive board a resolution calling for unity of the two internationals, the Amalgamated and the 'red'."

"On page 134 this statement is found:

"The Socialist Party collected up to October, 1920, 100 Russian relief funds, a total of \$6,453.18. . . The convention condemned the Fascist (of Italy) and endorsed the work of the Anti-Fascist Alliance of America. . ."

"On page 211 the following statement is made:

"On March 9 and 10, 1929, an International Anti-Fascist Bureau was founded at a congress in Berlin of about 250 representatives of anti-Fascist groups in some 20 countries. Henri Barbusse, French Communist writer, was made president."

"In 1930 Valenti was a member of the Committee for the Support of Il Nuovo Mondo, the campaign publication issued in behalf of Sacco-Vanzetti. This publication was financed by the 'Red' Garland Fund (American fund for public service). On this committee were Louis F. Budenz, now editor of the Midwest Communist daily; Dr. Charles Fane; Heywood Brown; Vito Marcantonio, Communist candidate for Congress, 1936; and A. J. Muste. Valenti has been a member of the International Committee for Political Prisoners."

"It has been announced recently through the New York Times news columns that Girolamo Valenti is arranging to launch another Italian language daily in New York City and that with him in the venture is Vito Marcantonio, head of the Communist International Labor Defense and who was in 1936 a candidate for Congress on the Communist Party ticket.

"Valenti is a member of the American League for Peace and Democracy and officiated at its last convention (1947)."

Information was received on August 2, 1941, that Girolamo Valenti, a New York City anti-Fascist newspaper man, and certain other individuals, constituted "a vicious group of anti-Fascists in New York City." According to the informant, the aforementioned men were political outcasts from Italy for the reason that their political philosophy was not that of Fascism, and that they came to this country strictly as refugees and not for any love of the United States and its democratic processes. Further information was received from the same source that Valenti and certain others were in sympathy with this country's present foreign policy only for one reason that it designated Fascism as a political philosophy at odds with the democratic processes. The source continued that these men, including Valenti, were trying to coerce a certain individual into surrendering the control of his newspaper into their hands so that they could foster an anti-Fascist theme which was even more pronounced than the one presently in vogue, and this strictly for the reason that if the present Fascist regime were overthrown in Italy, they could then go back to Italy and take over high positions in the Government.

According to other testimony given by Mr. Steele before this same Committee, one Girolamo Valenti is a member of the Resolutions Committee of the American League for Peace and Democracy. According to this information, this individual was reported as being rather friendly with the Communist movement.

Information received in August, 1941, advised that one Girolamo Valenti, Max Ascoli and Count Storma were political outcasts from Italy because they were at odds with Fascism. This information further stated that these individuals were here as refugees and not out of any love for the United States or its democratic principles. It was stated that they were attempting to gain control of Italian newspapers in New York; write anti-Fascist editorials; and, if the present Fascist Regime in Italy were overthrown, to return to Italy and take over the high government positions.

During the recent past Valenti has made numerous attacks upon the Italian Fascist regime, both in public addresses and in the Italian-American periodical, "La Parola" which is edited by him and which is published at 80 East 11th Street, New York, New York. At the present time he is said to be a member of the Socialist Party headed by Norman Thomas and is reported to utilize the columns of his periodical to praise the efforts of the Socialist Party and to denounce the activities of the Communist Party U. S. A.

Alberto Pasquale Caselli

Alberto Pasquale Caselli is presently residing at 942 East Avenue in Brooklyn, New York. He was born in Lugo, Cosenza, Italy August 27, 1901 and arrived in the United States June 14, 1913. He lists his occupation as journalist in that he is a writer for the Italian magazine "L'Avvenire" which is published at 85 Fourth Avenue, New York, New York. In addition to the aforementioned employment subject worked during 1942 for radio station W.2.W. in New York "as an expert analyst in Fascist-Nazi propaganda and consultant in Italo-American affairs". He was dismissed from this position by the authorities of the aforementioned radio station on November 19, 1942. According to Caselli his dismissal was predicated upon the fact that he made certain recommendations to his employers concerning some of his fellow employees who harbored Fascist activities.

Caselli was known to have been associated for many years with many of the other individuals referred to in this memorandum.

At the present time this individual's petition for naturalization is being considered by the Immigration and Naturalization Service of the New York Office of the Department of Justice.

Giuseppe Lupis

Giuseppe Lupis was the owner and publisher of "Il Mondo", an Italian anti-Fascist periodical and was employed at one time as a censor of Italian programs at Radio Station W.2.W., 19 West 97th Street, New York City. He at one time functioned in the capacity of secretary of the Italian Socialist Party in the Province of Siracusa, Sicily. He has been identified with the Italian Socialist Movement prior to and since the advent of socialism in Italy.

Although there is a considerable amount of additional data available regarding the background and present-day activities of Giuseppe Lupis, it is sufficient for the purposes of this memorandum to point out that he is presently considered as an informant of the New York Office and has proved in the past that he is a very reliable source of information with respect to Italian activities in the New York area.

Ugo Manfredi

The true name of this individual is Joseph W. Anania and he resides at the present time at 35-05 87th Street, Jackson Heights, Long Island, New York.

On March 5, 1941 Manfredi was employed as a radio announcer at Station W.2.W., 846 Flatbush Avenue, Brooklyn, New York. Later in 1941 he was said to have been employed in the same capacity by several different radio stations in the New York area.

All of his programs were in the Italian language and were reported to be essentially anti-Fascist in nature.

Manfredi is one of the individuals who was instrumental in reorganizing the Italian Socialist Party in the United States and is known to have been closely affiliated with Carlo Tresca and many of the other Italian anarchists and socialists mentioned herein. 62-63146X-1900x; 94-1-12932-4; 61-1335-349

The June 14, 1943 issue of the New York Times reflects that this individual was a speaker at an Italian-American rally held at Irving Plaza in New York on the previous date. This meeting had a two-fold purpose: (1) to commemorate the assassination of Giacomo Matteotti, the one-time leader of the Italian Socialist movement in Italy; (2) to express clear concern of and concern over the President's policy and "failure to call upon the Italians to depose the monarchy" as well as to condemn the Italian Fascist regime. 61-6 7602-a

On September 1, 1943 Manfredi was stabbed while attending a Socialist Party rally at 242 East 14th Street in New York City. According to newspaper reports disseminating at that time an individual by the name of Giuseppe Satori turned himself into the police later the same night at which time he admitted committing this assault upon the person of Manfredi. 61-1335-349

On August 15, 1941 an anonymous communication was received by the New York Office of the Bureau signed "a citizen". In this letter the anonymous correspondent alleged that the following individuals were Fascist spies engaged in subversive activities:

Girolamo Valentini
Atore Manfredi
Carlo Tresca
Alberto Maniccapra
Alberto Capelli

The letter went on to state that these individuals were "go-between's", being neither anti-Fascist nor democratic and it charged that they would inform or double-cross either faction for their own private gain.

The anonymous source further alleged in his communication that Atore Manfredi who sometimes writes articles for the newspaper "La Parola" under the pen names Joseph Silvio Giusti and Costante Colletti is an O.V.A. agent and that Manfredi "by a vicious round-about way threatens some of the anti-Fascists".

On February 22, 1943 Manfredi communicated with a representative of the New York Office at which time he advised that in his opinion the following individuals were responsible for a number of anonymous threatening letters that have been sent to him during the recent past:

On February 26, 1943 Manfredi advised the New York Office that he receives approximately one hundred letters per week, one to ten per cent of which call him "vile" names and predict the same end for him that befell Carlo Tresca.

On February 20, 1943 Manfredi transmitted a number of the aforementioned threatening letters to the New York Office and according to a letter from New York dated September 21, 1943 these letters were transmitted to the FBI Laboratory by the New York Field Division under cover letter dated May 19, 1943 in order that the writings contained therein might be compared with the writings in the National Security and Anonymous Letter Files in the Bureau.

Agnostico Borghi

This individual has been identified with Italian anarchist activities for the past ten to fifteen years. Prior to his coming to the United States he is reported to have been arrested in Italy (about 1920) for having been involved in an anarchist attempt to foment revolution and to bring about the overthrow of the form of government existing in Italy at that time. 61-817-50; BS 200600-143-10

He is known to have been a member of the much-harassed Fucio-Vercelli defense committee. Carlo Tresca was likewise an active member of the same committee.

He also contributes articles to the New Jersey Italian anarchist periodical "L'Adunata dei Reirattari". 61-2477-22

Borghi is described as having been active in the Italian Socialist movement in Italy and is known to have functioned as the general secretary of the Unione Sindacale, a left-wing workers' organization in Italy. As indicated above, he was arrested in Italy in 1920. This arrest was concerned with his participation in the armed occupation of various factories in that country. In 1921 he was acquitted in the Italian courts, but owing to the triumph of Fascism in the meantime he was forced to flee Italy and has since lived in exile.

Borghesi is the author of a book entitled "Mussolini, Red and Black". This book was published in the English language in October 1938 by the Freie Arbeiter Stimme Publishing Company, 45 West 17th Street, New York, New York.

The United States Office of Censorship intercept which was prepared on the basis of a letter received on September 15, 1942 by a Mr. Pio Turroni, alias L. R., Fucate Alvarado 42-30, Mexico, D. F. and addressed to Mr. Osvaldo Saravilla, Newark, New Jersey, reflects the following: Pio Turroni, alias L. R. enclosed with his communication two letters which he was desirous of having Saravilla turn over to Armando Borghi. The first enclosure was a communication written by Massimo Salvadori-Paleotti, a known agent of the British Intelligence Service, wherein Salvadori-Paleotti criticized communist elements in New York for utilizing his name in their publications and wherein he requested Borghi to publish the instant communication in "L'Adunata Dei Refrattari" in order to refute certain allegations made by these communist periodicals.

The second enclosure was also a letter prepared by Salvadori-Paleotti and was addressed to "Stato Operaio". In this letter Salvadori-Paleotti referred to the same letter as the one outlined in the letter to Armando Borghi and designated "Stato Operaio" as the publication in which "you had the insolence to use my name".

The censorship examiner in commenting upon the contents of the aforementioned intercept stated that the writer of the cover letter in question, Pio Turroni, is an anarchist refugee who uses the initials "L. R." or the name Luis Roman San Jose in his correspondence. The examiner further pointed out that Armando Borghi is a contributor to "L'Adunata Dei Refrattari", an Italian anarchist periodical published in New York City.

On November 30, 1941, Borghi was taken into custody by the Immigration and Naturalization Service authorities on the basis of a deportation warrant which has been outstanding since 1928. This warrant was originally issued on the basis of information, apparently unsubstantiated, furnished by the Italian Ambassador in Washington, D. C., to the Attorney General wherein the Ambassador suggested that Borghi, an Italian anarchist propagandist had entered the United States illegally. The Italian Ambassador at that time indicated that Borghi was probably connected with a bombing attack which occurred on the Italian Consulate General in New York in 1926.

There is no information at hand at the present time which would indicate the disposition which has been made of the deportation case on Borghi by the Immigration and Naturalization Service.

Alberto Mangiacapra

On October 13, 1938 an individual designated as Albert A. Mangiacapra, a minister at the Presbyterian Labor Temple, which is also known as the American International Church, 14th Street and Second Avenue, New York City, was reported to be utilizing his church as a "meeting place for communist unions and radical organizations".

On October 1, 1941 an individual designated only as Reverend Albert Mangiacapra was reported to be a member of the American Committee for the Protection of Foreign Born, 79 Fifth Avenue, New York City. One of the purposes of this American Committee for the Protection of the Foreign Born was to outline the rise of Italian nationals (enemy aliens) residing in the United States at the present time. Congressman Vito Marcantonio was also said to be a member of the aforementioned committee.

On September 13, 1941 an anonymous communication was received by the New York Office signed "a citizen" wherein Albert Mangiacapra was accused by the anonymous correspondent as being an O.V.A.S. agent and as affiliated with Valenti, Manfredi, Trasca and Scudelli for the purpose of carrying on Fascist activities in the United States.

In December 1941 an anonymous communication was received at the Bureau in an envelope addressed at the Grand Central Annex, New York City, December 18, 1941 wherein reference was again made to the aforementioned individuals, including Mangiacapra, as being agents of the Italian Secret Police. On this occasion the correspondent who signed himself as "an Italian anti-Fascist" enclosed a clipping from an undated issue of "La Parola" which dealt with a letter directed to Ritorio Manfredi by one Angelo Corvovella. The letter to Manfredi, which was published in "La Parola", was criticized by the anonymous correspondent and was referred to as Italian Fascist propaganda.

This anonymous communication is being forwarded herewith for the FBI Laboratory so that the handwriting can be compared with that contained in the anonymous letter signed with the initials "C.R." which is referred to in reference letter. It is requested that a photostatic copy of each of these two anonymous communications be forwarded to the New York Field Office for inclusion in its appropriate file.

In connection with the Bureau is called to the fact that a translation of a portion of the anonymous communication received September 18, 1941, is attached to the serial as contained in the New York files. It could not be ascertained whether the translation was made by the anonymous sender or some other individual.

In connection with your request for a description of the manner in which the New York letter of May 13, 1943, enclosing anonymous letters sent to ~~ANTONIO~~ as captioned, you are advised that said letter was captioned as follows:

It was concluded that Ittore Manfredi, K1, prepared neither the handwriting on the letters designated Q5 through Q13 nor the handwriting on Q14 and Q15.

It was further concluded that the individual who prepared the handwriting on Q14 and Q15 did not prepare the handwriting on Q5 through Q13, all of which was prepared by one individual.

The handwriting and handwriting on Q14 and Q15 were compared through the Federal Security Agency but no identification was effected. Appropriate photographic copies are being added to this file for future comparison.

Dear Sir:

I am enclosing herewith a specimen of the handprinting and handwriting of Giuseppe Nudi, which was obtained at the Matteawan State Hospital for the criminally insane at Beacon, New York. No further specimens of the handprinting and handwriting of Nudi could be obtained as he refused to furnish them. This specimen is being enclosed in an envelope marked "Exhibit A". Information obtained regarding the case history of Nudi is similar to that previously forwarded to the Bureau and consequently is not being repeated.

I am also enclosing herewith in an envelope marked "Exhibit B", a letter in the handwriting of Giuseppe Nudi which was obtained from his brother, Raffaele Nudi.

In an envelope marked "Exhibit C", I am enclosing a post card in handprinting and a carbon copy of a letter which were furnished by [REDACTED]

In an envelope marked "Exhibit D" I am enclosing a number of anonymous communications received by [REDACTED]. Among these are two post cards and two letters in handprinting signed "O.R.". One of the communications forwarded to [REDACTED] and enclosed in the envelope marked "Exhibit D" is obscene and is being put in a separate envelope and properly marked.

During a check of the indices at the New York Field Office it was ascertained that George Mink is the subject of an Internal Security case and that he is carried as a key figure by the New York Office; also, that his whereabouts has been sought for several years. Mink was arrested in 1935 in Denmark for espionage activities and is reportedly an agent of the C.P. Information received from a confidential source known to the Bureau reflected that George Mink was possibly involved in the murder of Carlo Tresca. Your attention is directed to the report of Special Agent Arthur E. Doolley of this office entitled "GEORGE MINK, with aliases; INTERNAL SECURITY-C", dated January 13, 1943. A review of this case file will give you a complete picture of the background of George Mink.

Pursuant to a lead in the aforementioned report, Special Agent [redacted] contacted Inspector [redacted] of the New York Police Department on December 14, 1943 to ascertain first whether the New York Police Department was seeking George Mink as the murderer of Carlo Tresca and, secondly, whether the New York Police Department knew the present whereabouts of George Mink. Inspector [redacted] who has been very cooperative with the New York Office, referred Agent [redacted] to Assistant New York District Attorney Louis Pagnucco who is handling the Carlo Tresca murder case. Mr. Pagnucco was informed that the Bureau is interested in Mink purely from an internal security standpoint. The District Attorney expressed a desire to cooperate with this office and advised that the New York Police Department was not seeking George Mink as the murderer of Carlo Tresca. He stated that at the time of the murder, several angles were considered which might have led to the murderer. He stated that one possibility was a political angle and in this respect the name of George Mink came into the picture. He asserted that he was convinced that George Mink was not the murderer and that the Communist Party had nothing to do with it.

When pressed further for his reasons he did not give a satisfactory answer but indicated that his decision had depended on information developed by another Assistant District Attorney working under him by the name of E. Lipsky. Mr. Pagnucco advised that the New York Police Department had no idea of Mink's whereabouts; that furthermore if Mink were located he, Pagnucco, would be interested in interviewing him concerning the case but only as a routine lead. He asserted that the Police Department at the present time was trying to trace the ownership of the car in which the murderer was driving at the time of the crime and that he, Pagnucco, believed that he might ultimately locate the murderer by tracing this car and therefore he was emphasizing this angle over all other possibilities.

Assistant District Attorney E. Lipsky was interviewed on the same date by Agent [redacted] in order to determine the basis for Mr. Lipsky's decision that George Mink and the Communist Party were not implicated in the crime. Mr. Lipsky advised that he was never able to locate George Mink. In describing the background of Mink he had no hesitation in saying that he derived his information from reading such books as "I Confess" and "We Accuse". He stated that he made a few inquiries, namely of one [redacted]

[redacted] was subsequently contacted by Special Agent [redacted] with negative results. He, too, was familiar with the background of Mink but had no idea of his current activities or whereabouts and expressed the opinion that Mink was either in this country or in South America.

Efforts were made to locate [redacted] at the listed address, with negative results.

No contact has been made with [redacted] concerning George Mink because Gitlow has been contacted on several occasions by agents of this office and his knowledge of Communistic activities seems to be strictly limited to past activities which have been described in his book. Agents handling the Communist work also have made the same observations concerning [redacted] and therefore no further investigation is anticipated to locate [redacted] whereabouts at this time.

From the nature of the conversation with Mr. Lipsky it appeared to Special Agent [redacted] that the Assistant District Attorney had only made casual inquiries concerning the whereabouts of Mink and that he had not made a detailed investigation to determine if Mink was actually connected with the Carlo Tresca case.

It is believed that there may be further specimens of the handprinting or handwriting of "O.R." available in New York. As soon as such are obtained they will be forwarded to the FBI Laboratory. In the event the Laboratory believes it advisable that any of the communications signed "O.R." be shown to [redacted] for identification, this will be done. However, no steps in this direction will be taken unless instructions are received from the Laboratory.

Reference is made to the memorandum which I transmitted to Tele. Room on October 27, 1943, relative to the captioned case. This memorandum included an anonymous communication which was addressed in Spanish in Madrid to "Victorio" (Victor F. Gonzalez), Calle Florida Nacional, 1-0 to Mexico, D. F. In pursuance of my request the above mentioned letter was searched through the files of the Laboratory. The following pertinent information was obtained from the file of the Laboratory with those of "Victorio" mentioned.

In accordance with preparation of my memorandum of October 27, 1943, there was located in the Central File of the Bureau an anonymous communication which was post marked at New York, New York, dated Central Annex on December 19, 1941, and which was addressed in the following manner "Federal Bureau of Investigation, Washington". This letter appears in File 100-3-39.

The above mentioned document which I enclosed in my memorandum of October 27, 1943, is written in the Italian language and the anonymous communication bearing File 100-3-39 is written in the English language. It is believed that both communications were prepared by the same person. Accordingly, it is respectfully requested that the latter communication be searched through the files for the purpose of ascertaining whether both were prepared by the same individual. In the event that there are not, it is requested that the copy of letter bearing in File 100-3-39 be searched through the file of writings pertaining to "Victorio" for the purpose of ascertaining whether the identity of the author of the communication can be ascertained.

It is requested that this matter be given preferred attention.





Dear Sir:

I am sending under separate cover for examination by the F.B.I. Laboratory a number of communications in handwriting signed, "O.R." These communications were obtained from GIUSEPPE NUNZI, who is connected with the Italian Socialist newspaper, "Il Periodico". They are being referred to as "Mullberry A". It is believed probable by this Office that the author of the communications signed, "O.R." may be GIUSEPPE NUNZI, who is presently confined at the Mattawa State Hospital for the criminal insane, Westchester County, New York. It is noted in the fact that one of these communications furnished by NUNZI and apparently in the same handwriting as the other "O.R." communication is signed, "Mullberry Street". Recently Confidential Informant [redacted] whose identity is known to the Bureau, advised Special Agent [redacted] of the New York Field Division that the District Attorney of New York County in his investigation of the BRISCA homicide was investigating a number of individuals with known criminal records who reside on Mullberry Street. As a matter of fact, the automobile used in the murder of BRISCA was later located in a garage on Mullberry Street. It may be possible that the writer of the communications signed, "O.R." may have some information regarding the individual or individuals who perpetrated the BRISCA murder.

In our quest the F.B.I. Laboratory desires to know what the author of the communications signed, "O.R." is GIUSEPPE NUNZI, the Bureau's authority is requested to interview NUNZI at the Mattawa State Hospital.

It is believed from conversations had with NUNZI and from an examination of the history of the patient that NUNZI has sufficient mental capacity to be able to carry on a satisfactory interview with you. It is possible that NUNZI may be in a position to furnish information on the individual or individuals who perpetrated the BRISCA murder.

RESULTS OF INVESTIGATION:

It was concluded that "G. R.", whose handwriting appears on the specimens submitted previously designated as 31 through 34, also prepared the handwriting on the specimens described above as 57, 156, 157 through 161, 163, 164, 166, 167 and 161. 15, 3 and 17 referred to in the preceding sentence were received by the Bureau from the Office of Immunity by letter dated September 17, 1943; 35 through 41 comprise a letter postmarked December 19, 1943 addressed to the Bureau and 2 and 13 were received from your office by letter dated December 25, 1943 with which were also submitted 14, 15 and 11.

The handwriting which was concluded not to have been prepared by "G. R." appears on 30, 32, 45, 48, 49, 50, 51, 52, 158, 159, 160, 162 and 160.

It was concluded that Giuseppe Nudi, whose known handwriting appears on K3 and K3, prepared the handwriting on Q16, Q54 (the enclosed postal card only), Q78 and Q180.

Due to the limited amount of Nudi's handwriting available for comparison with the "C. R." communications, a definite conclusion could not be reached as to whether Nudi prepared the "C. R." series of letters and postal cards.

Specimens Q147, Q148, and Q149, which comprised the letter furnished by Luigi Antonini which he claims was not handled after he received it, was chemically treated for the development of latent fingerprints but none of value was found.

Specimen Q147 is an envelope made of white bond paper which contains no watermark. This envelope measures 6.10" in length, 3.64" in width, 0.0060" in thickness, weighs 2.202 grams and bears an address handwritten with a soft lead pencil.

Specimen Q148 is a sheet of white, ruled paper which contains no watermark. This sheet of paper measures 10.97" in length, 8.45" in width, 0.0033" in thickness, and weighs 3.723 grams and bears a message handwritten with a soft lead pencil. The front of Q148 bears 25 blue lines spaced an average distance of 0.33" apart beginning 1.30" from the top of the sheet. The back of Q148 bears an equal number of similarly spaced blue lines.

The handwriting, handwriting and typesetting on Q147 through Q149, with the exception of "C. R." handwriting which was previously covered, will be searched through the Anonymous Letter File and a subsequent report will be submitted.

In view of this additional examination has been completed and a pro vista photographic copy made, Q147 through Q149 will be forwarded to your office for return to Chicago Office.

Reference is made to your letter of February 12, 1944 requesting the New York Field Office to obtain additional human specimens of the handwriting and handprinting of REUBEN SI.

In an enclosing herewith inclose specimens of the handwriting of SI, which were obtained from him at the Metropolitan State Hospital for the Criminal Insane at SI, SI, SI, by Special Agent SI.

The handprinting and handwriting specimens were obtained from SI under a pretext and during the course of the interview. He was asked if he had ever seen a written or hand-written letter signed "C.T." which had been sent to SI at SI. This letter had been intercepted and was deciphered by the FBI Laboratory as SI in the course of their examination. SI said that he had never seen the letter and that he had no handwriting in. He added that he did not know how to handprint. When requested to submit handprinted specimens, however, he quickly complied.

SI was asked if he had ever used the initials "C.T." but he said he had not. He volunteered the information, however, that he had from time to time used the name "C.T. SI" in signing communications as may be readily observed, the first letters of these two words start with "C" and "T".

COMMENT

VIEW OF CARLO TRESCA CRITICIZES THOSE WHO CLAIMED IN THE "DEMOCRATIC" DEMONSTRATIONS IN ITALY TO RUIN POTENTIAL DEVELOPMENTS IN ITALY.

Communication consists of a letter, typewritten on a half sheet, which opens: "Caro Compagno!" (Ex. "Dear Comrade!") It reads:

First I must confess I do not speak nor write Italian, altho I read and understand it fairly well. Even before I lived with Carlo Tresca I had read and loved Fontanara and Fane E Vino. And your last book which has caused considerable controversy among "Leftists", -rather short-sightedest, two dimensional people is dear to me. -moved me deeply, and Carlo loved it, too. Carlo shared with you that rare and beautiful gift - he loved people as people and not merely as symbols. This is one reason I have wanted so much to write to you, and why I wish you could see the memorial issue of "Il Martello" which his friends and followers published. It is limited, not as great as Carlo, but it is touching. You are the best and most brave and courageous and creative person, who is yet able to think clearly. You both maintained a positive attitude in the face of the blackest black, grey and white people have had to try to penetrate.

I wonder if you or your close friends understand clearly, altho officially nothing is done or recognized, that Carlo was killed on account of the desperate Italian situation, either by other EPU (Ex: probably S. U.) or by anti-fascists who were eager to climb on the 'democratic' bandwagon and control that is to ruin the potential developments in Italy. I believe this death was a disaster for what we all desire as was Rosa Luxemburg and Karl Liebknecht. That is all I hope and hope you are on hand somewhere somehow to bend the future the right way. Naturally in my country (I am here on visit) the reaction has started in, and even among the Italians absolutely nothing constructive is being done. If you can possibly get a letter to me through the same sources as I have mentioned, I will get to you, I would appreciate it very much. Just to let me know that you understand the significance of this death is all I need. (Ex: "I am here on visit")

A postscript in another handwriting, says the following:

Dear Arthur, we wanted very much that this letter would find our friend as soon as possible. Hope to see you in the next year. -I wish it letter say later so fast. Thanks. Write soon. Best. -[Illegible]

Previous records reveal that Avenida Juarez 141, Coyoacan, Mexico is the address of Gustav Regler (B7000)

Previous correspondence has shown that Gustav Regler uses the same kind of thin yellow paper when writing his letters, as is the case here, and that his typewriter, also, is badly adjusted, making each character half red and half black. His letters also contain numerous typographical errors.

For these reasons, one is led to believe that the letter is being sent by Gustav Regler (B7000)

Previous correspondence reveals that Eabette Gross (B7000) has addressed covers to Arthur Koestler which contained letters opening "Dear Mario." This fact and the current communication indicate that Arthur Koestler is acting as an intermediary for his friends in Mexico.

The author of Fontegara and Pane E Vino, to whom this communication is obviously intended, is Ignacio Silone, who is active in the Italian underground which functions from Switzerland. This has been revealed by previous correspondence. He is said to be financed by the Italian-American Labor Council, which is headed by Luigi Antonini.

SPECIAL NOTICE: Information was taken from private communication of those officials whose knowledge of it is necessary to the war. In no case should it be widely disseminated.



Result of examination:

It was concluded that the handwriting on Q483 through Q487 was prepared by "B. I."

It was concluded that the handwriting appearing on Q489, Q490, Q491, Q492, Q493, Q494, Q495, Q496, Q497, Q498, Q499, Q500, Q501, Q502, Q503, Q504, Q505 and Q506 was not prepared by "B. I."

The source and description of the previously submitted material, including that of "B. I." was set forth in Laboratory Report 75-11435, 75-11436, and 75-11437 dated February 6, 1944 copies of which were designated for your office.

It was concluded that none of the handwriting appearing on Q483 through Q487 was prepared by GIUDIZIO NERI whose known handwriting was submitted by your office under date of January 18, 1944 and designated in the Laboratory as Q48 and Q49.

Specimens Q485, Q486 and Q487 were chemically treated for the development of latent fingerprints and a separate report will be submitted on this examination.

Specimen 435 is an envelope made of white bond paper containing no
writing. This envelope measures 6.00 inches in length, 3.64 inches in width,
0.0041 inches in thickness and weighs 1.295 in grams. The address was written
with a soft lead pencil.

Specimen 436 is a sheet of unruled white relief paper containing no
writing. This sheet of paper measures 10.00 inches in length, 4.15 inches
in width, 0.0034 inches in thickness and weighs 2.073 grams. The message
was hand written with both a soft lead pencil and a red lead pencil. The front
of 436 bears twenty-five blue lines spaced an average distance of 0.57 inches
apart to leaving 1.51 inches from the top of the sheet. The back of 436 bears
an equal number of similarly spaced blue lines.

Specimen 437 is a sheet of white, unruled relief paper which contains no
writing. It bears in the upper right-hand corner a circular postmark for

Dear Sir:

I am sending under separate cover for examination by the F.B.I. Laboratory a number of communications in handprint signed, "O.R." These communications were obtained from ETTORE MANFREDI, who is connected with the Italian Socialist newspaper, "La Parola". They are being referred to as "Exhibit A". It is believed probable by this Office that the writer of the communications signed, "O.R." may be GIUSEPPE NUDI, who is presently confined at the Matawan State Hospital for the criminal insane. Your attention is called to the fact that one of these communications furnished by MANFREDI and apparently in the same handwriting as the other "O.R." communications is signed, "Mulberry Street". Recently Confidential Informant *b2, b7D* whose identity is known to the Bureau, advised Special Agent *DU* of the New York Field Division that the District Attorney of New York County in his investigation of the TRESKA homicide was investigating a number of individuals with known criminal records who reside on Mulberry Street. As a matter of fact the automobile used in the murder of TRESKA was later located in a garage on Mulberry Street. It may be possible that the writer of the anonymous communications signed, "O.R." may have some information regarding the individual or individuals who perpetrated the TRESKA murder.

In the event the F.B.I. Laboratory determines that the author of the communications signed, "O.R." is GIUSEPPE NUDI, the Bureau's authority is requested to interview NUDI at the Matawan State Hospital.

It is believed from conversations had with MANFREDI and from an examination of the history of the patient that NUDI has sufficient lucid moments to be able to carry on a satisfactory interview with him. It may be possible that NUDI may be in a position to furnish information or leads of value if permission to interview him is granted.
