Walter Winchell in his broadcast on Sunday evening, January 13, 1952, included the following items of possible interest to the Bureau:

WINCHELL:

New York City: Federal Judge Sylvester Ryan is expected to send the Frank Costello case to the jury on Tuesday.

Federal Court House, New York: The lawyer for Frank Costello may pull a big surprise tomorrow. Lawyer George Wolff may call a number of newspaper men who covered the Senate Crime Committee hearings.

COMMENT:

None. This is for your information.

WINCHELL:

San Francisco: The next big demonstration by Communists in San Francisco will take place on January 16. They will go from house to house passing out leaflets protesting the arrest of Red leaders by the FBI.

COMMENT:

Information has been received from time to time from San Francisco and Los Angeles that the Communists on the west coast are distributing leaflets and agitating otherwise in protest to the arrest by the FBI of west coast Communist leaders who are presently awaiting trial under the Smith Act. It is known that west coast Communists were planning to distribute such leaflets on a house to house basis.

Russian engineers are successfully mining uranium in the giant mountains of upper Selica. This confirms the worst fears of allied intelligence.

Berlin: Four high Red Army officers deserted to the west this week.

COMMENT:

WINCHELL:

The Presidential doghouse is presently occupied by Mr. Truman's Secretary, Matthew Connolly. The insiders tell me Matthew is seeking another job.

COMMENT:

None. This is for your information.

WINCHELL:

The famous friendship between the President and his friend George Allen is also said to have turned sour. The President expressed great indignation at Mr. Allen's role with his good friend Ike Eisenhower.

COMMENT:

None. This is for your information.

WINCHELL:

Washington: This is the story behind the ransomed American flyers. Sixteen large Hungarian plants offered an alibi to their Red Commissars over failure to meet their Red quotas. They alibied that American sabotage had retarded

their daily output and they seized our flyers as evidence to support their lies. The Kremlin fell for it. This explains the cheap ransom of only \$120,000.

COMMENT:

WINCHELL:

New York Journal American: The high court heard the appeal of Yvette Matson last Tuesday. Her fate will be made known very soon. She is the Brooklyn girl who killed her Air Force husband in Germany. She is now in Womens Federal Penitentiary at Alderson, Virginia.

MEMORANDUM FOR MR. TOLSON  
MR. LADD  
MR. NICHOLS

Irving Hoffman called me from New York to advise that the Post series on Walter Winchell are being syndicated and are to start running in the Los Angeles Mirror on Monday. He stated he is going to do quite a strong piece on these articles which obviously do not give the true picture. Mr. Hoffman told me that today they have a picture of Winchell with Johannes Steel with the comment that "there was a time when Johannes Steel, one of the Communist's pet Commie pet writers on international affairs, had Winchell's ear as above" but according to Mr. Hoffman they do not say that Johannes Steel was writing for the New York Post.

Mr. Hoffman stated that with reference to the piece he was going to write he was interested in the item the Post ran on the gangster in the Stork Club on New Year's Eve and he would like to know the background on this if possible. He stated he had checked on this and he believed it had come from McKelway's book in 1940 which was a series of profiles put out by the New Yorker. I told Mr. Hoffman that I had checked all our files in the Bureau, our regular call files and identification files and fingerprint files and we have no one by that name. I stated, of course, I would not say that no one by that name exists, but certainly if we were in pursuit of a man, or a man had impersonated a federal officer, or we had prosecuted him or he was a fugitive we would have him listed. I stated we had no record of any Terry Riley and I surmised that Lyle Stuart had probably picked it up from McKelway. Mr. Hoffman stated he thought he could challenge Stuart and say he would like to see them produce the man, as he felt if we could not they certainly could not, and he wondered if he would be safe in doing this. I told him I believed they could not produce such a man unless, of course, they had some fake one show up. I further told Mr. Hoffman that I recalled this particular evening very well at the Stork Club; that I did not recall this incident at a time that I was there with Walter Winchell and at the time Jim Braddock was the heavy weight champion of the world and Jim was at some other table with a group of friends and at midnight when the New Year came in someone suggested that Jim and I have our photograph taken together, and we did. I stated we put on some funny hats and I had a pop gun which was given out as a souvenir and there was no one else in the picture and there certainly was no such person as Riley in our entire party and I would certainly be the last person to ask anyone to join in on a picture unless I knew who they were. Mr. Hoffman asked whether he could

Walter Winchell in his broadcast on Sunday evening, January 6, 1952, included the following items of possible interest to the Bureau:

WINCHELL:

New York City: U. S. Government contempt trial of Frank Costello starts tomorrow. Seven subpoenas have been served. Among the first on the stand will be Senator Kefauver and Rudolph Halley. Costello can get eleven years.

COMMENT:

Costello is being tried for Contempt of Congress. This is not a Bureau case.

WINCHELL:

Albany: The New York State Crime Commission has discovered startling news about a lower court judge in Manhattan, based on a tip offered by Governor Dewey.

COMMENT:

None. This is for your information.

WINCHELL:

Sing Sing: Julius and Ethel Rosenberg, now in the death house, will have their appeal heard on January 11th. Since Federal Judge Irving Kaufman sentenced them to die there hasn't been one new case of spying.

COMMENT:

The Julius and Ethel Rosenberg cases grew out of the Harry Gold espionage case and their convictions resulted from Bureau investigation.

WINCHELL:

The latest under scrutiny by the Senate Security Committee is a White House Secretary.

COMMENT:

As you are aware, the McCarran Committee has requested information in the Bureau files concerning [REDACTED]. The fact that the Committee has made this inquiry was forwarded to the Department with the request that the Department advise as to the method of handling the Committee request. To date no reply has been received from the Department. It is not possible to tell definitely if Winchell was referring to [REDACTED].

WINCHELL:

House Un-American Activities Committee will serve fifteen subpoenas on Broadway theatrical people before the week end.

COMMENT:

The Bureau is aware that the HCUA has contemplated reconvening hearings on Communist infiltration in the motion picture industry early this year.

WINCHELL:

New York City: Federal Judge Harold Medina was tortured for many months by the Reds defense lawyers at the trial of the eleven convicted Reds. However, one of those lawyers, Harry Sacher will never again bother any other Federal Judge because he has been barred for life. Another legal thorn in Medina's side was also suspended for two years. Unfortunately, there is no way that Judge Medina can get back the years they took from his life.

COMMENT:

Abraham J. Isserman was the other attorney for the eleven convicted Communist leaders that was disbarred for two years. This disbarment proceeding has been pending for some time and final decision was just recently made in New York.

THIS PALPITATING PALSHIP HAS ENDURED FOR NEARLY FIFTEEN YEARS. IT IS ONE OF THE MOST COMPLETE AND TOUCHING EXAMPLES OF WINCHELL-S FIDELITY TO A HERO. AS IN THE CASE OF ALL WINCHELL-S GOOD GUYS, HOOVER CAN DO NO WRONG AND ANYBODY WHO DARES TO CRITICIZE HIM AUTOMATICALLY BECOMES A DANGEROUS CHARACTER IN WINCHELL-S BOOK OF REVELATIONS

IN SO LONG AND INTENSE A RELATIONSHIP THERE HAVE BEEN A FEW TENSIONS, WHEN ONE FELT THE OTHER MOMENTARILY DEFECTIVE WINCHELL MIGHT BE AGGRIEVED, BECAUSE HOOVER HAD SHOWN EXCESSIVE GENEROSITY TOWARD ANOTHER JOURNALIST OR HOOVER MIGHT BE IRRITATED BY WINCHELL-S MISQUIDED ALLEGIANCE TO SOME GOVERNMENT OFFICIAL WHOM HOOVER DEPLORED.

THERE ARE ALSO INTERVALS WHEN CONGRESSIONAL CURIOSITY OVER THE EXTENT OF WINCHELL-S INTIMACY WITH THE AFFAIRS OF THE FBI CREATES A DISCREET COOLING-OFF PERIOD IN THE HOOVER-WINCHELL ASSOCIATION, BUT THE CHILL HAS NEVER BEEN PROLONGED OR FATAL.

TO READ AND HEAR WINCHELL OVER THE COURSE OF THE YEARS IS TO GET THE KIND OF IDEALIZED BIOGRAPHY OF HOOVER USUALLY RESERVED FOR SUCH IMMORTALS AS BABE RUTH. NO WORD OF CRITICISM EVER INTERRUPTS THE FLOW. WINCHELL IS NOT MERELY DEDICATED TO THE PUBLIC WORKS AND HISTORIC UTTERANCES OF THE TOP G-MAN. HE DISPLAYS A FANATICALLY DETAILED PREOCCUPATION WITH HOOVER-S LITTLE JOYS AND SORROWS, HIS ILLS AND RECOVERIES, HIS FURIES AND HIS FLUTTERS.

IRONICALLY, IN HIS ZEAL FOR HIS TASK THERE IS SOME QUESTION AS TO WHETHER WINCHELL HAS ALWAYS BEEN HELPFUL AND WHETHER, IN THE LONG RUN, HOOVER FULLY EMERGES FROM WINCHELL-S WORD-PICTURES AS THE MAN OF DISTINCTION HE IS ALLEGED TO BE. THERE ARE MOMENTS, AT LEAST, WHEN WINCHELL-S EXPRESSION OF BOYISHLY BOISTEROUS ESTEEM FOR OUR TOP COP HAVE MADE BOTH OF THEM LOOK DOWNRIGHT COMIC.

TAKE THE CASE OF THE MISSING COMMUNIST LEADERS.

BACK ON NOV. EIGHT, NINETEEN FORTY EIGHT, WINCHELL GAVE THE COUNTRY THIS REASSURING NEWS- "THE FBI CAN PICK UP EVERY COMMUNIST CHIEF WITHIN AN HOUR VIA ITS UP-TO-DATE LIST." SEVEN DAYS LATER HE REPEATED THE ASSURANCE-

"MANY TOP MEN IN THE COMMUNIST PARTY HERE ARE IN HIDING. ... THE FBI KNOWS ALL THE LEADERS AND IF AN EMERGENCY COMES UP THEY WILL BE COLLARED WITH THE SAME DISPATCH USED ON PEARL HARBOR DAY."

ALL THIS SOUNDED LIKE CLEAR REASSURANCE FROM THE FBI THAT THE COMMUNIST CHIEFTAINS COULDN-T MAKE A MOVE WITHOUT SOMEBODY CALLING HOOVER. THE MYTH MIGHT HAVE SURVIVED IF EIGHT RANKING COMMUNISTS HADN-T JUMPED BAIL ON THE EVE OF SENTENCING LAST JULY.

SEVEN ARE STILL MISSING AND THE EIGHTH WAS CAUGHT BY THE MEXICAN COPS.

SINCE THE EPISODE OF THE VANISHING UN-AMERICANS WINCHELL HAS BEEN RELATIVELY SILENT ON THE EMBARRASSING SUBJECT OF FBI SURVEILLANCE. HE DID REPORT ON JULY NINE THAT THE FBI "FEARS" THAT ROBERT G. THOMPSON, ONE OF THOSE STILL A W O L, IS "ARMED AND SEEKS TO BECOME A MARTYR." PRESUMABLY HE GOT THIS FROM THE SAME SOURCE WHICH TOLD HIM THAT GUS HALL HAD A VIAL OF POISON WITH HIM AND WOULD KILL HIMSELF "A LA HIMMLER" THE MOMENT HE WAS APPREHENDED. HALL WAS NABBED IN MEXICO ON OCT. NINE, NINETEEN FIFTY ONE, THE VIAL WAS MISSING.

HOOVER-S REPUTATION FOR ~~XXXXXXXX~~ OMNISCIENCE ~~XX~~ MAY BE DAMAGED ON A LESSER SCALE BY SUCH ITEMS AS WINCHELL-S BLEAK REPORT ON JULY FOURTEEN, NINETEEN FORTY EIGHT-

"JOHN EDGAR HOOVER-S "PAINED" EXPRESSION, INTIMATES KNOW, IS FROM HIS FEAR THAT "WAR MAY COME TOMORROW." NOW DON-T ASK HIM IF IT IS TRUE, HE WILL ONLY DENY IT."

UNFORTUNATELY FOR HOOVER, THERE IS NO RECORD OF A DENIAL. IN HIS DESIRE TO PROVE THAT THE G-MEN ARE ALWAYS THERE WHEN IT

MATTERS, WINCHELL SOMETIMES OFFERS BEWILDERING HIGHLIGHTS OF HINDSIGHT. THUS, AFTER THE ATTEMPT TO ASSASSINATE PRESIDENT TRUMAN LAST YEAR, HE WROTE-

"THE WASHINGTON RUMBLINGS THAT THE FBI HAD NO ADVANCE NOTICE OF THE PUERTO RICAN INSURRECTION DOESN-T IMPRESS THE K GOVERNMENT AGENCIES WHICH GOT DETAILED ADVANCE NEWS /FROM THE G-MEN/ ON THE SAN JUAN NATIONALISTS- PLANS."

THE PARAGRAPH WAS OBVIOUSLY INTENDED TO SHOW THAT J. EDGAR HOOVER ALWAYS HAS HIS FINGER ON THE PULSE OF THE PLOTTERS. IF THAT WAS TRUE, THE OBVIOUS QUESTION- UNASKED AND UNANSWERED BY WINCHELL- IS WHY THE G-MEN DIDN-T FOIL THE PLOT BEFORE THE SHOOTING STARTED.

SUCH MISFORTUNES ARE LIKELY TO AFFLICT ANY PUBLIC FIGURE WHO BARES HIS CERTITUDES AND PROPHECIES AS OFTEN AS HOOVER-S ARE UNFOLDED BY WINCHELL.

THEIR RELATIONSHIP GOES WAY BACK. IN NINETEEN THIRTY FOUR- ALTHOUGH THEY HAD NOT YET MET, HOOVER ASSIGNED TWO G-MEN AS WINCHELL BODYGUARDS WHEN THE COLUMNIST TOOK A TRIP TO MOB-RIDDEN CHICAGO. SINCE WINCHELL THEN /AS NOW/ MANAGED TO LIVE A DOUBLE LIFE IN WHICH HE COULD CLAIM SOME DISTINGUISHED GANGSTERS AS FRIENDS EVEN WHILE HE CONSORTED WITH THE COPS, THE UNDERWORLD ALSO HAD THREE MEN TAKING CARE OF HIM.

BY NEW YEAR-S EVE OF NINETEEN THIRTY FIVE WINCHELL AND HOOVER WERE CELEBRATING NEW YEAR-S EVE TOGETHER AT THE STORK CLUB, AN EVENT SUBSEQUENTLY PRESERVED FOR POSTERITY IN PUBLISHED ESSAYS. IT WAS QUITE A NIGHT BECAUSE TERRY REILLY, A NOTORIOUS GUNMAN OF THE ERE, WAS

ALSO ON HAND AND HOOVER /NOT RECOGNIZING REILLY/ JOINED OTHERS IN TRYING TO PERSUADE HIM TO POSE FOR THE PHOTOGRAPHERS WITH A TOY MACHINE-GUN. REILLY WAS ON PAROLE AT THE TIME, HAVING BEEN CONVICTED OF EXTORTION AND IMPERSONATING A G-MAN.

ALTHOUGH WINCHELL-S PALSHIPS WITH UNDERWORLD FIGURES HAVE FLUCTUATED, REACHING A GAUDY CLIMAX WITH HIS RECENT PUBLIC ENNOBLING OF FRANK COSTELLO, HOOVER HAS APPARENTLY NOT SEEN FIT TO TELL WINCHELL TO CHANGE HIS CIRCLE OF FRIENDS. THERE IS SOME EVIDENCE, HOWEVER, THAT GOSSIP ON THE POINT HAS WORRIED THE G-MAN. HOOVER HAS SHOWN INCREASING DISCRETION ABOUT BEING SEEN IN UNDUE PROXIMITY TO MOBSTERS.

IN RECENT YEARS THE STORK CLUB HAS BECOME THE CHIEF RENDEZVOUS FOR HOOVER AND WINCHELL, PERHAPS BECAUSE OF THESE PRIOR EMBARRASMENTS AT OTHER PLACES OR POSSIBLY BECAUSE WINCHELL LEAVES THE STORK LESS AND LESS FREQUENTLY WITH THE PASSAGE OF TIME EXCEPT TO MAN HIS OCEANSIDE FLORIDA BASTION.

IF THE CURIOUS DUALITY OF WINCHELL-S TIES WITH THE G-MEN AND FRANK COSTELLO HAS BROUGHT ANY PAIN TO HOOVER, IT MUST BE WEIGHED AGAINST THE CONSTANT STREAM OF ADULATION AND ANXIETY WITH WHICH HOOVER-S LIFE IS RECORDED BY WINCHELL.

THERE ARE DAYS WHEN IT SOUNDS AS IF WINCHELL RECEIVES A DAILY MEDICAL BULLETIN ON THE G-MAN- WELFARE.

ON SEPT. TEN, NINETEEN FORTY ONE, WINCHELL DISCLOSED THAT HOOVER HAD LOST TWENTY POUNDS IN FOUR WEEKS, "EATING HALF OF EACH MEAL." ON MAY FIFTEEN, NINETEEN FORTY THREE, WE LEARNED THAT HOOVER "AFTER A TOUGH TEN DAYS OF FLU IS HONKY-DOOLY AGAIN." THE FOLLOWING YEAR-

SEPT. FOUR, NINETEEN FORTY FOUR-- WE GOT THE OMINOUS WORD THAT  
"JOHN EDGAR HOOVER WAS SO ILL RECENTLY HE THOUGHT HE WOULD DIE."  
BY NINETEEN FORTY FIVE WINCHELL IS SOLICITOUSLY REPORTING THAT  
"CERTAIN POWERFUL ENEMIES IN WASHINGTON ARE TRYING TO WORRY HIM  
/HOOVER/ INTO LOOKING OLDER."

THE G-MAN-S ARRIVALS AND DEPARTURES AT THE STORK CLUB ARE  
FAITHFULLY ANNOTATED, AT NO TIME HAS IT APPARENTLY OCCURED TO WINCHELL  
THAT A NERVOUS, SECURITY-CONSCIOUS AMERICA MIGHT BE TROUBLED BY THE  
KNOWLEDGE THAT OUR CHIEF G-MAN IS FOREVER /ACCORDING TO WINCHELL/  
SLIPPING IN AND OUT OF NEW YORK NITERIES. UNDOUBTEDLY HOOVER SPENDS  
MANY LONG HOURS AT HIS DESK, BUT THE ACCUMULATIVE EFFECT OF WINCHELL  
ITEMS IS TO SUGGEST THAT THE G-MAN CAN-T STAY AWAY FROM NEW YORK.

THE CRUELEST THING THAT WINCHELL HAS DONE TO HOOVER- WITH THE  
BEST OF INTENTIONS-- IS TO TRY TO "HUMANIZE" HIM. THE RESULT OF THIS  
EFFORT CAN ONLY GIVE PAUSE TO THOSE WHO LIKE TO BELIEVE /AS WINCHELL  
WOULD LIKE US TO BELIEVE/ THAT HOOVER IS PROTECTING OUR NATION  
TWENTYFOUR HOURS A DAY AND DESTROYING HIS HEALTH BY HIS SINGLE-  
MINDED DEVOTION TO DUTY. AS HIS DIARY IS AFFECTIONATELY SET DOWN BY  
WINCHELL, HOOVER FINDS EXTRAORDINARY TIME FOR DIVERSIONS UNRELATED TO  
THE NATIONAL DEFENSE.

HE HAS BEEN ABLE, FOR EXAMPLE, TO ACT AS  
LITERARY ADVISOR TO SOPHIE TUCKER-

"SOPHIE TUCKER, WHOSE NEW BOOK "THE LIFE OF THE RED HOT MAMMA,"  
WILL HAVE ASBESTOS COVERS BECAUSE MR. G-MAN SO SUGGESTED IN A CLOWNING  
MOOD," WINCHELL RELATED ON SEPT. EIGHTEEN, NINETEEN FORTY ONE.

DURING THE GRIM DAYS OF MAY, NINETEEN FORTY TWO, WINCHELL DEPICTED  
HOOVER AS A MAN WITH "A NEW RADIO FAVORITE -- RED SKELTON AND HIS  
"I DOOD IT."

ON DEC. TWENTY THREE, NINETEEN FORTY FOUR, AMID THE BATTLE OF THE BULGE, WE LEARN FROM WINCHELL THAT "I JUST SAW G-MAN HOOVER IN BRENTANO-S BUYING A COPY OF "CHARLIE CHAN.""

IT WAS IN THE SAME YEAR THAT AMERICA LEARNED VIA WINCHELL THAT "JOHN EDGAR HOOVER-S TAILOR IS HIDDEN AWAY ON THE SEVENTH FLOOR OF TEN WEST FORTYSEVENTH STREET" AND THAT THE G-MAN HAD FOUND A NEW "REDUCING TRICK" -- A HOT BATH FOR FIFTEEN MINUTES A DAY.

IN DECEMBER, NINETEEN FORTY SEVEN, WINCHELL OFFERED A NEW GLIMPSE OF THE SIMPLE PLEASURES WHICH CAN MAKE THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN JOY AND SORROW FOR A SUPERSLEUTH- "THE ONE PERSON J. EDGAR HOOVER WOULD LIKE TO MEET AND KNOW IS HIS FAVORITE COMEDIAN, JAMES DURANTE." WINCHELL-S INABILITY TO ARRANGE THE INTRODUCTION IS UNEXPLAINED.

ON JUNE TWENTY NINE, NINETEEN FORTY NINE, WE ARE AGAIN GIVEN A BRIEF PORTRAIT OF THE LIGHTER SIDE OF THE MAN- JOHN EDGAR HOOVER PURCHASING A NOISY PAIR OF SWIMMING TRUNKS AT CLYDE-AS ON MADISON AVE." AND IN JAN., NINETEEN FIFTY ONE, WE GET A COY SNAPSHOT OF HOOVER PLAYING STRAIGHT MAN FOR A LOVELY THING-

"TO G-MAN HOOVER, WHO TEASED HER, TEEVY-S NEW DUMB DOLLING BABY- STARED- "I REFUSE TO ANSWER YOUR QUESTIONS ON THE GROUND IT MIGHT INCINERATE ME.""

WINCHELL OBVIOUSLY REGARDS IT AS ONE OF OUR REPUBLIC-S WORST OVERSIGHTS THAT J. EDGAR IS CONFINED TO THE ROLE OF FBI CHIEF WHILE LESSER MEN ARE DESIGNATED TO RUN FOR OFFICE. "DEMOCRATIC BIGGIES ARE SERIOUSLY CONSIDERING G-MAN HOOVER FOR ROOSEVELT-S RUNNING MATE," HE PROCLAIMED HOPEFULLY IN MAY, NINETEEN FORTYFOUR. THERE ISN-T A TRACE OF HISTORICAL PROOF THAT THE IDEA EVER TRESPASSED BEYOND WINCHELL-S COKUMN. IN DECEMBER, NINETEEN FORTYSEVEN, WINCHELL TOLD US THAT HOOVER HAD BEEN APPROACHED BY A "BIG REPUBLICAN" TO SEEK THE PRESIDENCY BUT SPURNED THE OFFER WITH THESE NOBLE WORDS-

"TO BE ELECTED I-D HAVE TO MAKE A DEAL, WHICH I WOULD NEVER."

AT LEAST SOME WASHINGTON CORRESPONDENTS BELIEVE WINCHELL HAD ENTERED THE FIELD OF IMAGINARY INTERVIEWS.

BUT IT IS ONLY IN THE REALM OF ATTACK AND COUNTER-ATTACK THAT THE FULL MEASURE OF WINCHELL-S DEVOTION TO HOOVER CAN BE WEIGHED. ANY DULL BOOK, UNREVEALING MAGAZINE ARTICLE OR C-MOVIE THAT PICTURES HOOVER AS HERO IS SURE TO RATE A PLUG IN WINCHELL-S WORKS, ANY UNFAVORABLE NOTICE IS SURE TO INITIATE A CAMPAIGN OF REPRISAL DESIGNED TO DESTROY THE VICTIM AND TERRIFY ANY POTENTIAL IMITATORS.

IN THIS AS IN OTHER MATTERS WINCHELL OPERATES WITH THE PASSION

LET IT BE SAID FOR HOOVER THAT HE HAS NEVER IN ANY PUBLIC PROTESTATION INDICATED EITHER THAT HE AUTHORIZED SUCH DISCLOSURES OR THAT HE FELT SUCH SAGAS WERE BENEATH THE DIGNITY OF HIS OFFICE.

WINCHELL-S PREOCCUPATION WITH HOOVER-S HEALTH IS EQUALLED ONLY BY HIS CONCERN FOR THE G-MAN-S FINANCIAL WELL-BEING. HE IS ETERNALLY REPORTING THAT HOOVER HAS JUST REJECTED FANCY SUMS FOR JOBS IN PRIVATE LIFE /WHICH COULD WELL BE TRUE/. HE IS ALSO CONSTANTLY LAMENTING HOOVER-S FINANCIAL PLIGHT. "AFTER TWENTY FOUR YEARS OF SERVICE TO OUR COUNTRY, G-MAN HOOVER IS BROKE," SAID WINCHELL ON DEC. THREE, NINETEEN FORTY FIVE.

SINCE HOOVER IS A BACHELOR WITH NO VISIBLE BACKBREAKING OSLIGATIONS, THE REMARK, INTENDED AS A PUFF, COULD HAVE BEEN CONSTRUED AS A RECKLESS CHARGE OF EXTRAVAGANCE. THE FOLLOWING YEAR WINCHELL NOTED THAT HOOVER HAD BEEN GIVEN A NEW CAR "INSTEAD OF A NEW SALARY." IN FEB., NINETEEN FORTY FINE, THE FISCAL INEQUITY STILL TROUBLED HIM- "WHEN THEY VOTED THEMSELVES ALL THOSE STIFF RAISES IN WAGES /IN WASHINGTON/ THEY OVERLOODED G-MAN HOOVER. HMF."

HOWEVER, WINCHELL OCCASIONALLY BRIGHTENS THE FISCAL PICTURE, AS WHEN HE REPORTS THAT "J. E. HOOVER, WHOSE HAT WAS SWIPED AT HARVEY-S IN WASHINGTON, BET TWO DOLLARS ON A HORSE NAMED "LOST-A-HAT" AND WON THIRTEEN DOLLARS AND SEVENTY CENTS."

OF AN ANTI-LOGICIAN. IT GOES LIKE THIS- A- THE COMMUNISTS ATTACK J. EDGAR HOOVER B- ANYBODY WHO ATTACKS HOOVER IS A COMMUNIST. UNDOUBTEDLY IT HAS NEVER OCCURED TO WINCHELL THAT THE SAME FALLACY COULD BE APPLIED WITH MURDEROUS COUNTER- EFFECT- A- IN NINETEEN FORTY FOUR THE COMMUNISTS SUPPORTED THE RE-ELECTION OF ROOSEVELT B- WINCHELL IS A COMMUNIST BECAUSE HE ALSO SUPPORTED ROOSEVELT.

THE MOST SAVAGE INSTANCE OF WINCHELL PUNISHMENT FOR THE CRIME OF QUESTIONING THE WISDOM AND VIRTUE OF J. EDGAR HOOVER IS THE STORY OF MAX LOWENTHAL.

LOWENTHAL IS A MAVERICK LIBERAL WHO LONG AGO DEVELOPED THE THEORY THAT HOOVER-S FBI WAS NEITHER EFFICIENT, ENLIGHTENED NOR SACROSANCT. HE WAS TROUBLED BY WHAT HE REGARDED AS HOOVER-S STEADY USURPATION OF POWER, HE WAS DISTURBED BY FBI WIRE-TAPPING. HE WAS, PERHAPS MOST OF ALL, UNHAPPY OVER THE TIMIDITY OF HIGH-RANKING GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS -- INCLUDING FRANKLIN D. ROOSEVELT -- TO RISK PUBLIC ARGUMENT WITH THE CHIEF G-MAN.

IN THE AUTUMN OF NINETEEN FIFTY LOWENTHAL PUBLISHED A BOOK EMBODYING YEARS OF RESEARCH ON THE FAILURES AND FOLLIES OF THE FBI. AS MOST REVIEWERS NOTED, THE BOOK HAD BOTH VIRTUES AND DEFECTS. IT WAS EARNEST, WELL-DOCUMENTED, AND UTTERLY COMMITTED TO AN INITIAL PREMISE. BUT AT THE VERY LEAST IT WAS A SERIOUS WORK DESERVING SERIOUS COMMENT. IN THE EYES OF BOTH WINCHELL AND THE FBI IT WAS HIGH TREASON.

BY AIR AND BY LAND, WINCHELL OPENED FIRE ON LOWENTHAL FOR WRITING  
"NOTHING MORE NOR LESS THAN A VICIOUS ONE-SIDED ATTACK ON J. EDGAR  
HOOVER." AT NO TIME DID HE CHALLENGE ANY OF THE FACTS SET FORTH IN  
LOWENTHAL-S WORK-- INCLUDING GRUESOME EXAMPLES OF FBI INEPTITUDE.  
INSTEAD HE DEMANDED THAT THE BOOK BE DISMISSED /OR BURNED/ ON THE SIMPLE  
GROUND THAT LOWENTHAL WAS A SINISTER FELLOW.

WINCHELL DID NOT ALLEGE THAT LOWENTHAL WAS A COMMUNIST OR A FELLOW-  
TRAVELLER. HE JUST DROPPED THE WORD THAT LOWENTHAL "KNEW" ALGER HISS  
AND LEE PRESSMAN /AS DID FDR/. HE "REVEALED" THAT AS EARLY AS NINE-  
TEEN FORTY LOWENTHAL HAD SHARPLY CRITICIZED THE FBI -- A REVELATION  
OF SOMEWHAT DUBIOUS IMPACT SINCE LOWENTHAL HAD NEVER HIDDEN HIS  
FEELINGS ON THE SUBJECT. AND FINALLY, AS A CLIMATIC DISCLOSURE,  
HE REPORTED-

"PROFESSOR ~~HAWKINS~~ ON THE LOS ALAMOS ATOMIC BOMB PROJECT DURING  
THE WAR HAS ADMITTED UNDER OATH HE WAS A MEMBER OF THE COMMUNIST PARTY.  
THE FBI HAS DISCOVERED THHAT PROFESSOR HAWKINS HANDLED DRAFT DEFER-  
MENTS AND SECURITY REGULATIONS . . . DR. HAWKINS, UNDER OATH, TESTIFIED  
THAT BOTH HE AND HIS WIFE WERE CARD CARRIERS. HIS BROTHER-IN-LAW  
IS WILLIAM ~~SLOAN~~ OF WM. SLOAN ASSOCIATES -- THE PUBLISHERS OF MAX  
LOWENTHAL-S RECENT BOOK ATTACKING JOHN EDGAR HOOVER AND THE FBI."

SUPREME EXAMPLE OF GUILT BY INVOLUNTARY ASSOCIATION WITH A BROTHER-IN-LAW WAS UNFURLED BY WINCHELL AS THE LAST WORD ON THE SUBJECT. IT WAS SUPPOSED TO RING DOWN THE CURTAIN ON ANY REAL DISCUSSION OF THE BOOK.

ABSURD AND ILLOGICAL AS WINCHELL-S CHARGES WERE, THEY WERE NEVERTHELESS CLEARLY CALCULATED TO TERRIFY BOOKSELLERS AND TO INVITE SUSPICION ON ANYONE WHO TOOK A RATIONAL VIEW OF THE VOLUME. SO SERIOUS DID WINCHELLS-S ASSAULT BECOME THAT THE ANTI-CENSORSHIP COMMITTEE OF BOOK PUBLISHERS COUNCIL FELT COMPELLED TO ISSUE A STATEMENT DECLARING- "MR WINCHELL-S CHARGES ARE SERIOUS AND, BEING WITHOUT SUPPORT, ARE UNFORTUNATE EXAMPLES OF THE USE OF THE SMEAR TECHNIQUE. AS SUCH THEY CONSTITUTE A DANGER TO FREEDOM OF PRESS AND SPEECH."

HOOVER AND WINCHELL HAVE PLAINLY MEANT A GREAT DEAL TO EACH OTHER AND THEIR ALLIANCE IS NOT AS GROTESQUE AS IT MIGHT INITIALLY APPEAR. THEY ARE BOTH MEN WHO ENJOY POWER MORE THAN WEALTH. THEY BOTH HAVE DEEP PERSECUTION COMPLEXES AND ARE ALWAYS VISUALIZING DARK CONSPIRACIES FASHIONED BY INVISIBLE ENEMIES. THEY BOTH HAVE GENUINELY FRENZIED IMPATIENCE WITH CRITICISM OF ANY SORT. THEY BOTH LOVE PLAYING COPS

AND ROBBERS.

ALTHOUGH ENTIRELY REVERENT TOWARD HOOVER-S TALENTS AS AN INVESTIGATOR, WINCHELL NEVER UNDERESTIMATES HIS OWN- SOMETHING OF THE BOY G-MAN IN HIM MUST BE AT WORK AS HE CRUISES AROUND NEW YORK IN THE PRE-DAWN HOURS WITH A POLICE RADIO IN HIS CAR, MAKING HIS ROUNDS AS LEADER OF A WBI OF HIS OWN.

WHO HAS BEEN USING WHOM/Q/

AS A NEWSPAPERMAN WINCHELL OBVIOUSLY FEELS THAT HE "OWNS" THE FBI. HE HAS RECEIVED SOME NOTABLE TIPS FROM THE AGENCY- MOMENTOUS FBI ANNOUNCEMENTS HAVE BEEN INTERMITTENTLY GEARED TO THE HOUR OF WINCHELL-S SUNDAY NIGHT BROADCAST SO THAT HE COULD BE FIRST WITH THE NEWS. HE HAS CERTAINLY BEEN GIVEN FIRST RIGHTS TO ALL DATA ON THE CARE AND FEEDING OF THE CHIEF G-MAN AND OTHER INTIMATE TIDBITS. HE BOASTS TO ASSOCIATES THAT HOOVER HAS A DIRECT TELEPHONE CONNECTION FOR HIM AND THAT HE NEED NEVER BE IN THE DARK WHEN THE FBI CAN SHED LIGHT.

MANY OTHER REPORTERS ARE WILLING TO BE EQUALLY GENEROUS TO HOOVER IN RETURN FOR SMALLER FAVORS.

YET IN VIEW OF THE SERVICES WINCHELL HAS RENDERED ONE WONDERS WHETHER THE BARGAIN HAS FULLY PAID OFF. HE HAS NOT MERELY TAKEN UP HOOVER-S CAUSE AGAINST ALL HOSTILE CRITICS IN THE OUTSIDE WORLD- HE HAS FAITHFULLY FOUGHT HIS BATTLES FOR HIM WHEN HOOVER BECAME INVOLVED-AS HE OFTEN DOES-IN INTRA-GOVERNMENTAL FEUDS.

PERHAPS THE CHARACTERISTIC MOST COMMON TO BOTH MEN IS A SENSE OF INSECURITY AND NOWHERE ARE HOOVER-S JITTERS MORE FREQUENTLY REVEALED THAN IN WINCHELL-S COLUMN. AFTER INTERMINABLY DESCRIBING THE VARIOUS BIG-TIME OFFERS THAT HOOVER HAD REJECTED/AND NO DOUBT THERE HAVE BEEN MANY OF THEM/, WINCHELL ABRUPTLY ANNOUNCED ON JANUARY TWENTYTHIRD, NINETEEN FORTYSIX-"J. EDGAR HOOVER WISHES IT YELLED LOUD AND LONG THAT HE HAS NO PRESENT INTENTION OF RESIGNING FROM THE FBI." IT SOUNDED AS

THOUGH THEY WERE BOTH AFRAID THAT TOO MANY PEOPLE AT THE WHITE HOUSE WERE HOPEFULLY AWAITING THE RESIGNATION.

DURING THE NINETEEN FORTYEIGHT CAMPAIGN THERE WERE UNVERIFIED REPORTS THAT, IF ELECTED, DEWEY WOULD FIRE HOOVER, PERHAPS ON THE THEORY THAT THE COUNTRY WOULD NOT NEED TWO SUPER-INVESTIGATORS IN HIGH PLACES. ON SEPT. NINTH WINCHELL CALLED SUCH REPORTS "BUNK," ADDING- "WE CAN STATE WITH AUTHORITY THAT GOV. DEWEY HAS THE HIGHEST REGARD AND RESPECT FOR THE G-MAN WHOSE REPUTATION REMAINS UNSTAINED AFTER NEARLY TWENTY-FIVE YEARS OF SERVING THE NATION."

THIS SEEMINGLY SETTLED IT BUT NOT QUITE. AFTER TRUMAN-S RE-ELECTION WINCHELL INDICATED THAT POSSIBLY IT HADN-T BEEN "BUNK" AFTER ALL. IN A POST-ELECTION ANALYSIS OFFERED ON NOVEMBER NINTH WINCHELL WROTE- "MAYBE IT WASN-T THAT THE PEOPLE DIDN-T WANT TO SEE TRUMAN LOSE HIS JOB. THEY WERE PROBABLY JUST AS ANXIOUS TO MAKE SURE G-MAN HOOVER DIDN-T LOSE HIS."

THERE ARE, OF COURSE, INTERMITTENT RUMORS OF FRICTION. ONE MAN WHO KNOWS HOOVER WELL/AND DISLIKES WINCHELL/ TOLD US RECENTLY THAT THE FBI CHIEF HAS "REGRETTED" THE EXTENT OF HIS INVOLVEMENT WITH THE COLUMNIST- THIS COULD BE TRUE OR IT COULD BE WISFUL THINKING ON THE PART OF A WINCHELL FOE.

THE PUBLIC RECORD, IN ANY CASE, IS FULL OF LOVE AND KISSES.

ON MARCH TWENTY ONE, NINETEEN FORTY EIGHT, WINCHELL WAS ABLE TO PUBLISH THIS ARDENT LOVE-LETTER FROM THE HEAD OF THE FBI-

"DEAR WALTER- JUST A NOTE TO SAY HELLO. DO TAKE GOOD CARE OF YOURSELF AND DON-T OVERDO BECAUSE YOU ARE FAR TOO VALUABLE TO THE COUNTRY. YOU MUST REALLY GET A LOT OF SATISFACTINN NOW WHEN SO MANY OF YOUR "HYSTERICAL" ASSERTIONS AND PREDICTIONS ARE BECOMING ALL TOO REAL. SOME INDIVIDUALS MUST SURELY BE HAVING ACUTE HYDROPHOBIA IN HAVING TO RECOGNIZE FINALLY HOW TRUE YOU HAVE BEEN ALL ALONG. WITH BEST WICHES I AM. SINCERELY, JOHN".

SO MOVING A MONUMENT SHOULD STAND BY ITSELF BUT A COUPLE OF REMARKABLE THINGS ABOUT THE LETTER MUST BE NOTED. FOR ONE THING J. EDGAR HOOVER, WHO WORKS FOR HARRY S. TRUMAN, FELT NO HESITANCY ABOUT WRITING THIS NOTE AT A MOMENT WHEN WINCHELL WAS BLASTING AWAY AT THE WHITE HOUSE NIGHT AND DAY.

MOREOVER, OUR CHIEF G-MAN FOUND HIMSELF EXTOLLING THE SUPERIOR WISDOM AND PERCEPTION OF A MAN WHO, LESS THAN THREE YEARS BEFORE, HAD BEEN WARMLY BLESSING COMMUNIST-FRONTERS AND ANGRILY DENOUNCING ANYBODY WHO DARED TO QUESTION THE VIRTUES OF OUR RUSSIAN ALLY.

BUT TO RAISE THAT POINT IS TO INTRODUCE CRUELLY

WINCHELL:

Syracuse, New York: 18 prominent citizens of Syracuse go on trial January 7th. They are charged with embezzling a local bank of two million dollars.

COMMENT:

This involves a Bureau case entitled [redacted] et al. Syracuse Trust Company, Syracuse, New York, Federal Reserve Act. The Bureau had completed the investigation and this case is ready for trial.

WINCHELL:

Washington, D. C.: Martha Roundtree, the producer of Meet the Press, and the wealthy Baron D. Shenkel (phonetic) of the Swedish Embassy, Washington, have cancelled plans to wed.

COMMENT:

None. This is for your information.

WINCHELL:

Miami Beach: Martha Ray, the star, and her husband and little daughter were saved in a dramatic rescue at sea early today after their fishing boat far out at sea started to sink.

COMMENT:

None, This is for your information.

WINCHELL:

Athens: Another Nazi war criminal went free today, a holiday present from the King of Greece. Nazi General Alexander Andre (phonetic) is free after serving less than four years of a life term for wartime atrocities and massacres at Crete.

COMMENT:

None. The above is for your information.

WINCHELL:

Vienna: The four American flyers cannot be bailed out before Christmas Day. Budapest banks will not reopen until Thursday. The American Legation does not have \$120,000.00 for their fines in the safe.

COMMENT:

None. This is for your information.

WINCHELL:

Hongkong: The Red Chinese have moved up heavy reinforcements to the French-Indo China border. They are the 43rd and 44th Chinese Communist Armies. All intelligence departments warn their top commands that a truce in Korea will mean all out attacks on Indo China.

COMMENT:

None. This is for your information.

WINCHELL:

The State Department is rocking with shakeups, dismissals and resignations. Assistant Secretary of State Miller and Perkins have been asked to be released.

COMMENT:

Mr. Roach, who serves in a liaison capacity with the State Department, advises that there has been recent newspaper comment concerning the resignations of these two individuals.

WINCHELL:

Another big Federal scandal will center around the terrific profits made by a certain Washington lady. She is the wife of a chief in the U. S. Intelligence. It concerns the sale of an oil tanker. An investment of only \$10,000 gave this lady a profit of 192,000 bucks after paying taxes on capital gains.

COMMENT:

The Bureau has an investigation on ~~the~~  tanker Meehan, American Overseas Tanker Corporation, et al, Admiralty Matter. The New York Office is conducting the investigation of a civil action, wherein the Government is suing for forfeiture of that tanker on grounds the vessel although of American registry is actually owned by alien Chinese. The Overseas Tanker Corporation was organized by Congressman Joseph C. Casey of Massachusetts, and a number of prominent stockholders including Stetinius, Admiral Halsey, Casey and others. No woman is involved in this investigation. This organization bought and sold a number of

tankers; however, none can be identified with the facts as described by Winchell.

WINCHELL:

Moscow has not given the green light yet to George Keenan as our new Ambassador to Russia. Mr. Keenan is out top Russian authority.

COMMENT:

WINCHELL:

The next big income tax scandal will come out of Brooklyn.

COMMENT:

This is not a Bureau case. Yet, it is believed that Winchell's statement concerns one [REDACTED] of the Brooklyn Internal Revenue Office, who was relieved of his duties some time ago.

WINCHELL:

The House Un-American Activities Committee will make new headlines next month with a new expose on Communists. The witnesses involved were quietly served several subpoenas all last week.

COMMENT:

The Bureau is aware of the fact the HCUA has been checking into the infiltration of labor in the Detroit area; also, that the HCUA has contemplated reconvening hearings on Communist infiltration in the motion picture industry some time next year. However, it is not possible to tell which hearing Winchell was making reference.

WINCHELL:

Attention - The American Medical Association: I have information regarding one of Hitler's former helpers. He is now trying to get into this country to accept a teaching post at one of our universities. This Nazi's name is Doctor Kurt Blome. He was once Deputy Chief of Hitler's Chamber of Medicine, a disgrace to the medical profession. This Doctor Blome, ladies and gentlemen, was tried in Germany for torturing prisoners of war to death in Nazi concentration camps. He got away with murder, having been acquitted at Nuremberg four years ago. Dr. Blome's appalling record of atrocities may be found in the book entitled "Doctors of Infamy." Some of his American friends are now trying to get the State Department to grant him a visa to enter the United States. Please ask your doctor to protest to the State Department. His name is Doctor Kurt Blome.

COMMENT:

Search of Bureau files reveals no investigation has been conducted on Kurt Blome. [However, G-2 furnished the Bureau a copy of "Scientific Intelligence Review" dated March 29, 1946, which set out the following background information:] (S-1)(u)

\*"Blome, K. (Prof., Dr.) (Interrogated) - He received a medical degree from Rostock University in 1921, and in 1931 joined the Nazi party. In 1934, he was called to Berlin by the Reichsarzte-fuhrer and at different times from 1934 to 1943 held a number of positions of an administrative nature. On April 30, 1943, an order from Goering appointed him director of cancer research. At the same time he also was selected to become Director of PW Research, and a member of the Pflzarbeiter Committee." (S-1)(u)

WINCHELL:

The Civil Rights Congress is planning another march on Washington some day next month. A demonstration for the repeal of the Smith Act which jailed so many American Reds. This outfit was once cited by the U.S. Attorney General as subversive.

COMMENT:

The Bureau through its informants has received advance information that the Civil Rights Congress does plan to have a demonstration in Washington, D. C., in January, 1952. The Bureau has disseminated all information concerning these plans of the Civil Rights Congress to the interested Government agencies, as well as including this information in the Current Intelligence Summary.

WINCHELL:

Washington: ~~Just how serious the Truman administration is about cleaning house can be judged from this: after one of the President's friends, William F. Willett, was caught using Government influence in the RFC, his job was abolished. But Mr. Willett's was secretly put on the Navy payroll as a housing specialist at about \$12,000 a year. This type of action explains why New York Judge Tom Murphy decided not to take the clean up job offered him by the President. Judge Murphy knew the White House gang wanted to use his mustache as a brush for a political white wash.~~

COMMENT:

None. This is for your information.

WINCHELL:

London: This week the Associated Press reported that high officials of the Allies were optimistic about avoiding the 3rd World War but the same story also noted that (quote) There are many ifs, and buts behind the belief an event could reverse the odds against a new war overnight. The same old double talk. The reason Russia is winning the 3rd World War is that too many of our high diplomats refuse to admit that it has started. Any sane person who reads the front pages every day cannot be optimistic about the possibility of world peace, especially American families whose sons didn't even make the list of prisoners.

[redacted] said he told this Hadassah executive he had not made any such statement and that as a matter of fact, the FBI was doing an outstanding job in Florida. He further told this executive he had been down in Florida and had observed the FBI's efforts and that they had been working night and day in a most conscientious manner.

Mr. Hoover:

While being interviewed the other day in connection with an extortion letter received by him, [redacted] volunteered the following information regarding the Josephine Baker incident at the Stork Club. [redacted] said that [redacted] is apparently worried over this incident. According to [redacted] got in touch with [redacted] and told him [redacted] would like to shake hands and forget the incident and also wanted to have [redacted] and Josephine Baker as his guests for the evening at the Stork Club. [redacted] stated he refused the offer [redacted] as long as there was no guarantee that no discrimination would be practiced in the future at the Stork Club.

[redacted] also said he had received a telephone call from Walter Winchell concerning the Josephine Baker incident and that Winchell talked to him over the telephone two hours and five minutes in a marathon tirade. According to [redacted] Winchell stated that for twenty-five years he had been a close friend of his and of the NAACP and a vigorous supporter of their policies but that now because of his support of the Stork Club's action in the Josephine Baker incident that he was being crucified by the NAACP and by newspapers like the New York Post. Winchell said that as a consequence if he (Winchell) were to go into Harlem now his blood would flow in the streets.

[redacted] stated that he told Winchell that it was Winchell's privilege to admit that he had made a mistake in the Stork Club incident. [redacted] stated that at the end of conversing, Winchell said "You probably have recorded this conversation and will crucify me further." [redacted] replied that there were no recording devices [redacted] and that he had never recorded any telephone conversation, but he said to Winchell, "I don't doubt though that you are recording the conversation for your own benefit." Winchell hesitated for a moment but did not deny [redacted] statement.

WINCHELL:

The U. S. Government will rest its year long case against the Communist Party very soon. If the Subversive Activities Control Board decides that the Government is right all known Communists over here will be put in jail.

COMMENT:

According to William A. Paisley, Attorney in the Criminal Division of the Department and in charge of the Government's case against the C. P. before the Subversive Activities Control Board, the Government's case will be completed shortly after March 1, 1952. Vito Marcantonio, Attorney for the C. P. has stated it will take him approximately two months for rebuttal testimony. If and when the Board rules in favor of the Government and no appeal is taken, members of the C. P. will have to register. But, under provisions of the law, a considerable period of time will have to elapse before the individual members can be prosecuted for failure to register.

WINCHELL:

A reporters report to the people: Attention Washington Post. A top secret around the White House since last September is this one. The President has cooperated very quietly with the authors of an upcoming book which will be called "Mr President - The 32nd President of the U. S." The authors are William Hillman and Alfred Wagg (Waag). It will have a fantastic first printing 125,000 at \$5.00 a copy. Published by Farrar and Straus, "Mr. President" includes Mr. Truman's own diary, personal memoranda, letters and secret documents. He allowed Mr. Hillman to do this book because Hillman predicted his election in 1948. Co-author Wagg was allowed to hide in closets during the White House press conferences to take photographs with special electronic equipment.

COMMENT:

None. This is for your information.

WINCHELL:

San Francisco: Gerhardt ~~Stalberg~~ ~~(Stalburg)~~ the new German Consul General out here has a record just as smelly as his predecessor Captain Fritz ~~Wiedemann~~. This ~~Stalberg~~, ladies and gentlemen, was Herr Von Ribbentrop's chief lawyer. He wrote the opinions encouraging the Nazi plans for race extermination. How the U. S. State Department ever accepted

this assistant and Hitler's mass murders is another administration mystery. To the Department of State. Your files will confirm me. German foreign office 2156 and 2157.

COMMENT:

None. This is for your information.

WINCHELL:

Washington Post: The U. S. Department of Justice has just flashed the green light for a Federal Grand Jury to investigate racketeering in New York. This new investigation against the underworld will be in full swing by next month.

COMMENT:

None. This is for your information.

WINCHELL:

San Francisco Call - Bulletin: A member of the Socialist Workers Party will enter the University of California to organize a campus group of pinko's. This Socialist Workers Party is listed as subversive by the Attorney General of the U. S.

COMMENT:

The Socialist Workers Party has recently had factional difficulties, one group breaking away from the parent group. Recruitment efforts have been intensified to compensate for this loss of membership including plans formed to recruit at the University of California, Berkeley, California, by sending a member of the Party to the University for recruitment purposes.

WINCHELL:

Los Angeles Examiner: California newspapers should do something about the new outfit out there which calls itself "America Plus." It has the support of the most notorious professional bigots on the west coast. A real menace.

COMMENT:

"America Plus" is a comparatively new so-called patriotic organization formed in California, with Jack B. Tenney, former head of the Tenney Committee (California State

Un-American Activities Committee) as one of the leaders. The "Daily Worker," east coast Communist newspaper, has referred to this organization as composed of reactionary individuals. At the request of the Department, an inquiry is being conducted concerning this organization.

WINCHELL:

Washington: The FBI has just learned that the new leadership of the American Communist Party has been quietly taken over by Pettis Perry and Elizabeth Gurley Flynn. Both are awaiting trial right now on charges of plotting to overthrow the Government of the United States.

COMMENT:

Elizabeth Gurley Flynn - member of the National Committee of the Communist Party, USA, and Pettis Perry - member of the Alternate National Committee, have for the past two and one-half months been issuing statements in their names on behalf of the Communist Party. These two individuals have assumed the position of spokesmen for the Communist Party. Both are under indictment in New York City for conspiring to violate the Smith Act and their trial is set for March 3, 1952.

WINCHELL:

The Washington Ticker: People close to the President report that he will stand on the record against any Congressional probe. He will refuse a bi-partisan clean up. In short, any prosecution by the administration will be made by the administration itself.

COMMENT:

WINCHELL:

One of the tough and most powerful democratic senators will seek a public investigation of Max Lowenthal, a White House advisor. He was back of the plan to oust U. S. Attorney General McGrath and replace him with new dealer Justin Miller.

For the Washington Post: Mr. Wiggins. This is the sort of undercover news that makes my kind of job exciting. His name is Irving Velson, V E L S O N. JANUARY 29, 1952

Before closing tonight I want to take time out to extend my personal condolences to a colleague of mine, Mr. Walter Winchell, who is ill in Florida and who left the air Sunday night for a month on doctors' orders. I have disagreed with him many times on many things, particularly in years gone by, but he has my deepest sympathy on this occasion because actually his condition is the result of a war of nerves that has been waged against him by reds and their pinkish friends because of his outspoken opposition to Communism and Communists. Among the open attacks was a vicious and venomous series of articles in the leftist New York Post a week or so ago which were sheer slander and calumny. I suggest to Mr. Winchell, however, that he not take the series too much to heart because of the source. They did an equally vicious and untrue series on me a couple of years ago. In any event, I hope he recovers soon and well and gets back on the firing line with the rest of us who are determined that Communism is going to be stamped out in the United States regardless of what it takes. We're glad to have him with us.

**COVERAGE OF WALTER WINCHELL BROADCAST  
FEBRUARY 3, 1952**

As you know, in his broadcast of Sunday, January 27, 1952, Mr. Winchell announced that due to illness he was taking a leave of absence from all professional activities for at least a month. No reference was made to any substitute. However, it was announced during the past week that Edward Alsop, Washington news analyst, would take Mr. Winchell's place on Sunday, February 3, 1952.

As of possible interest you are advised that at the outset of the broadcast of February 3, 1952, reference was made to Mr. Winchell's illness and it was described as a virulent virus infection rather than a heart condition as was initially suspected. According to the announcer, Mr. Winchell's condition is improving daily. It was pointed out that this is the first broadcast Mr. Winchell has missed in twenty years.

Mr. Alsop was introduced as the coauthor of the widely syndicated Washington column, "Matter of Fact." He began his talk by stating that "the big behind-the-headline story in Washington is this . . . . President Truman has made up his mind not to run again . . . and unless he changes his mind, which is always possible, Truman will throw his whole weight behind the nomination of Governor Adlai Stevenson, of Illinois." Alsop, following the above statement, discussed several reasons why Mr. Truman did not want to run again. He stated that Mrs. Truman had no desire to spend another four years in the White House; that Truman has been trying hard for about a year to persuade his old friend Fred Vinson to run in his stead, but that Vinson has told Mr. Truman that he does not want to run; President Truman has eliminated from consideration as candidates in his place Senators Estes Kefauver and Paul Douglas, both of whom Truman intensely dislikes. Truman certainly considered backing Senator Robert

Kerr of Oklahoma when he likes. Also followed with several observations on the Presidential political picture.

In a further discussion of national politics Mr. Alsop recalled a headline of last week when Mr. Truman called Senator Joseph McCarthy a liar. In fact, according to the background of the story Mr. Alsop stated that David Lloyd, was a dangerous subversive, and that McCarthy's charges were based on the fact that an eccentric great aunt of Lloyd's announced about 20 years ago, when she was about seventy, that she had joined the Communist Party. Also cited the above incident as an example of the type of politics today and then continued his discussion of politics to the end of the program. Shortly thereafter Thomas Anthony Kling, alias "Scup" Kling, was also taken into custody. Schuster was slain on the street near his home in Brooklyn on the night of March 8, 1952. Nine possible extortion letters, received by Schuster, which had previously been referred to the New York City Police Department and turned down by them as "crank letters" were made available by Schuster's attorney to the New York Division of this Bureau on February 25, 1952. The New York Division is conducting an investigation of these letters at this time. Frederick J. Tenuto is one of the Ten Most Important Bureau Fugitives and is wanted for Unlawful Flight to Avoid Confinement-Murder. He escaped in February, 1947, from the Philadelphia County Prison at Holmesburg, Pennsylvania, with four other men, one of whom was Willie Sutton.

WINCHELL:

New York City: Although the police have denied finding any leads in the Sol Rosenblatt shooting, I hear he has given them several clues. An early break in that case is now expected.

You will recall that Winchell's column appearing in the Washington Post, August 11, 1952, carried a comment reading, "The FBI and CIA (Central Intelligence Agency) say such profane things about each other--even Pravda couldn't print them."

You will also recall that you transmitted a letter dated August 12, 1952, to Mr. Winchell, advising him that, insofar as the FBI is concerned, there is no basis for the statement appearing in his column. In accordance with your instructions, a copy of that letter was shown to General Smith by Liaison Agent Papich.

General Smith advised Papich that a few CIA officers, expressing some concern, had directed his attention to the Winchell comment. He stated that he personally did not attach much significance to the comment, primarily because he felt that the relations between the CIA and the FBI are not of a nature to give rise to any such statements. He added that he knew of no situation or incident which might have given rise to Winchell's statement. (S-1) (X) (u)

General Smith advised that he appreciated very greatly the Director's attitude as reflected in the letter directed to Winchell. He stated that CIA was not making any type of inquiry in order to ascertain the basis for Winchell's comment. He advised that, if the Bureau developed any information indicating that CIA personnel might be responsible in any way, he would appreciate receiving the pertinent details. General Smith stated that, as far as he was concerned, the CIA and the Bureau undoubtedly would have differences from time to time, and he commented, "I think we are big enough to settle our problems like men." General Smith then made the following comment regarding newspaper columnists. He stated that he personally was afraid of Winchell and Pearson and made a point of not getting involved with them. He commented that Pegler was "dangerous" but "I think I can handle him." With regard to Pegler, Smith indicated that he apparently has had some dealings with him and felt that he was in a position to prevent Pegler from giving the CIA any serious trouble. (S-1) (X) (u)

## Barry Gray Yells Foul

By FRANK CONNIFF

**B**ARRY GRAY, a night club disc jockey who last Winter opened his microphones to anyone who wanted to savage Walter Winchell, then ailing in Florida, is in the curious position of crying foul now that the rebuttal from the hale and hard-hitting columnist has started.

Mr. Winchell did little to defend himself while one ancient enemy after another was resurrected by Mr. Gray to pour venom on his record. Feuds dormant for years were stoked over by the disc jockey in a bid for notoriety apparently based on the belief that Walter would hold still indefinitely for a campaign of character assassination without parallel in the long history of Broadway.

Nor did the columnist arouse himself when Broadway and Hollywood characters who had sought his help and favors for years allowed themselves to be herded by press agents to the Gray microphones for cheap plugs about their plays, movies and lay-offs.

### The "Worst Offender"

Mr. Winchell bided his time and now his time evidently has come. It seems that Mr. Gray's employer, Chandler's restaurant, is the "worst offender"—in the words of U. S. Attorney Myles Lane—among the local eateries which have been price-gouging and over-charging customers in violation of Federal regulations. A lien of \$300,000-plus has been slapped on the restaurant and Mr. Winchell has begun to keep his readers informed on all angles as they develop.

More than that. Walter has widened his rebuttal to include a few ripe details from the past of the Chandler owners. He charges that one of the bosses is "no stranger to the authorities," that he was investigated as to harboring jail-breakers and that he has been involved in "tax trickery" costing him \$200,000 to square. All this has pained and saddened Mr. Gray, who plaintively asked his audience:

"Why does Winchell only pick on Chandler's and never mention the other restaurants?"

This naive query amused Broadwayites who could give Mr. Gray the answer without a second's hesitation. Mr. Winchell has very little interest in the other joints charged with price-gouging and chiseling. But he will always find a spot in the column for Chandler's and its owners, who provided a forum for months on end from which those with a grudge against the columnist could vent their spleen without the slightest screening for truth, slander, or the personal health of the victim.

### An Empty Gesture

Mr. Gray has excused this smear barrage by saying he has also invited Mr. Winchell to appear—as if the columnist, who is a valuable TV and radio personality, should help build up business for a hashery that now stands arraigned as the worst offender among all New York price-chiselers.

Mr. Gray is alarmed over one other feature of his present situation and I believe he should be. Press agents and theatrical tycoons are no longer anxious to have their properties brace the Gray microphones. The price for a cheap puff or two is coming a little high this season. Whether Mr. Gray realizes it or not, his controversial attacks on a wide variety of people have made him a "hot" character and we do mean "hot."

The disc jockey mutters darkly about "reprisals" and other sinister gambits but this is patent nonsense. It is only human nature not to have an excess of affection for theatrical personalities who give aid and sustenance to a disc jockey dedicated to destroy the reputation of columnists who do not happen to see eye-to-eye with his own political beliefs.

We say to these press agents and producers and personalities who give their support to Mr. Gray: That's just dandy. But surely don't be surprised if we here at the Journal-American invite you to keep getting your plugs from him and not to expect very much from us. Mr. Gray is hot, red-hot, and he is all yours.

Walter Winchell in his telecast and broadcast of October 5, 1952, made the following statements of interest:

(1) The Kluzers in Southern Florida will get the surprise of their lives when the Federal Grand Jury convenes as the FBI knows of their activities.

Comment: He was referring to the Florida bombing cases which are being presented to a Federal Grand Jury convening at Miami, Florida, on October 6, 1952. Forty-seven individuals have been subpoenaed, among them members of the John B. Gordon Klan of Hialeah, Florida.

(2) The Communists in the schools will be exposed by a Senate Committee report on October 11, 1952.

Comment: The McCarran Committee has been holding hearings in New York regarding subversive influence in the educational process and a copy of some of the hearings held thus far has been furnished to the Bureau. It is being reviewed.

(3) A feud is in progress between President Truman and Secretary of Commerce Charles Sawyer over Mrs. Leon Keyserling, who was fired on charges of disloyalty. The President wants her reinstated and the Secretary has refused.

Comment: The fact that Mrs. Keyserling has been suspended has been brought to the Bureau's attention confidentially by the Department of Commerce.

(4) A Nazi supporter of Hitler named Maurice Schlenza (ph.) will enter the United States on a Portuguese visa.

Comment: No record on this name under various spellings could be located in the Bureau's indices.

(5) Guatemala will soon be a Soviet satellite country and it is only 700 miles from the Panama Canal.

(6) Republicans will fire a broadside at Mr. Justice Tom Clark for his handling of the files in the Kansas City vote fraud.

Comment: For some time the Subcommittee of the House headed by Representative Frank L. Chelf of Kentucky has been investigating the Department of Justice and among other things has been inquiring into the Kansas City vote fraud case and its handling by the Department. The question has been raised concerning the use of a sub-B file wherein administrative data was placed upon instructions of Tom Clark, the then Attorney General.

It is noted that the Washington Star of October 5, 1952, carried an article that Congressman Chelf said no "new or startling evidence" had been developed. Chelf stated that Clark used "exceedingly improper judgment" in handling the case in not ordering a more extensive FBI probe of charges.

(7) Pressure is being exerted on Attorney General McGranery to resist Senate Committee action in the Lattimore case but McGranery refuses to be Secretary of State Acheson's "goat" in this case.

Comment: As you know, the McCarran Committee has been rather insistent that the Department of Justice prosecute Lattimore for perjury. The Department has indicated recently that it may present this matter to a Grand Jury.

(8) Nothing will be done about the expulsion of George Kennan, U. S. Ambassador to Russia, although the U. S. has enough information to kick out the entire Soviet Embassy.

(9) The gold bars stolen in Canada have been transported to the U. S. and the U. S. Secret Service in New York City is looking for the gold.

Comment: On September 24, 1952, gold bars were stolen from Malten Airport, Toronto, Ontario, Canada. This gold, valued at over \$200,000, was in transit from Canada to Europe.

Dear Mr. Winchell:

Yesterday, September 18th, I picked up a copy of the local newspaper, turned to the picture section, and saw a photograph of a mansion on Long Island that was sold to the Russian government for \$30,000. My curiosity was strained. I called New York and found that this mansion was located out of Roslyn, which according to my maps is approximately five miles air line from Huntington Bay. Unless I am mistaken, there could not conceivably be two homes that are as much alike as the one pictured outside of Roslyn and the one I happen to know of on Huntington Bay.

The accompanying newspaper article was captioned, to the effect, "Reds Purchase Estate of Former Governor". Further down in the article the purchase price was stated as \$80,000.00, and also the article stated that the mansion was owned by a Governor Miller, as I recall, from 1921 until 1923. After this the statement was made that in 1951 the mansion was bought by a local real estate firm (Mineola, New York).

The above quotes were from an article which originated with Associated Press at Mineola, New York.

The fact that the owner of this mansion from 1923 until 1951 was not indicated, the fact that the mansion sold for only \$80,000.00, the fact that the location is given as Upper Brookville, and, also, the fact that I feel positive I personally have spent considerable time in this particular mansion as a State Department employee during 1944 in training for the Office of War Information, in the Psychological Warfare Bureau, make me wonder.

As I remember, a Mrs. Fields of Marshall Field's was the owner and had donated this property to the State

Department as a semi-secret training ground. This is based upon the assumption that the house mentioned is actually located on Huntington Bay, a few miles out of Huntington, New York, and prior to its sale to the real estate agent must have belonged to the Marshall Fields.

What I cannot understand is why the price of \$80,000 to Russians, the Field ownership, the State Department's use of the property during the war, and also the prior leasing to the Russians of this property for quarters.

As you know, Huntington Bay would make a wonderful garage for all kinds of entries, legal and illegal.

Would you please advise me if my assumptions are correct? Is the house that is being sold to the Russians the one described by me, on Huntington Bay, that belonged to the Marshall Fields?

The Americans for Democratic Action voted for repeal of the Smith Act at their convention in August, 1952. The CIO contributed \$60,000 per year to the World Federation of Trade Unions until 1948.

As you will recall, Marron was indicted on June 20, 1951, for the violation of the Smith Act and is presently a fugitive.

COMMENT:

None.

WINCHELL:

General Bedell Smith will be the next Ambassador to France. General Dean, former Military Attache to Moscow, will become head of the Central Intelligence Agency.

COMMENT:

None.

WINCHELL:

The current issue of Saturday Evening Post will name 9,000 college professors as having Communist front connections.

COMMENT:

None.

WINCHELL:

Tomorrow the Senate Security Committee will reveal the names of three dozen American reds in the United Nations building.

COMMENT:

As you know, there have been Grand Jury hearings in New York with regard to this matter, and a number of United Nations personnel have appeared as witnesses. A number of these individuals are to appear as witnesses before the McCarran Committee beginning October 13.

WINCHELL:

President Truman was once a member of the Ku Klux Klan.

COMMENT:

None. This is for your information.

WINCHELL:

Laughlin Currie, a former White House Assistant, was up before a Congressional investigating committee in 1948 accused of tipping off a Soviet spy ring that we were about to break the Soviet secret code. His attorney was Dean Acheson.

COMMENT:

Currie appeared before the House Committee on Un-American Activities in connection with the Gregory espionage case.

WINCHELL:

Secretary of State Dean Acheson approved a loan to Red Poland on April 24, 1946. Poland paid a \$52,000 fee to Acheson's law firm and the brother of Alger Hiss.

COMMENT:

None. This is for your information.

WINCHELL:

J. Wechsler, Editor of the "New York Post," once a top official in the Young Communist League, claims he quit this organization in 1937 and that he was too young to be a Communist. Wechsler's paper, the "New York Post," has attacked J. Edgar Hoover, the FBI and Walter Winchell for prosecuting the Communists. It has also defended Alger Hiss, William Remington and other "pinks." Page 283 of the record of the espionage trial at which the Rosenbergs and Morton Sobell were found guilty shows that Max Elitcher testified that Rosenberg tried to get him to join the Young Communist League in 1937 and that after he joined in 1939 he found that Wechsler's Red outfit was still an important cell in the Communist Party.

COMMENT:

Wechsler has publicly admitted his former membership in the Young Communist League. Max Elitcher was a Government witness in the Rosenberg espionage trial.



WINCHELL:

Another bomb shell will explode in the U. N. in a few days, of Alger Hiss dimensions, involving a prominent American in the U. N. He was and still may be a plant by Alger Hiss.

COMMENT:

After checking with the supervisor handling Communist infiltration in the U. N., it was not possible to determine to whom Winchell has reference. This Bureau has conducted investigations of a number of individuals in the United Nations. As you know, the McCarran Committee is presently holding hearings with regard to Communism in the U. N. ( )

WINCHELL:

The Immigration Department is taking steps to bar Josephine Baker from the United States.

COMMENT:

Josephine Baker is the well-known Negro singer who is a French citizen. She recently made anti-United States statements while in Argentina. These statements have been given wide publicity. Information concerning Josephine Baker has been furnished to the Attorney General.

On his radio program, Mr. Winchell made no statements of interest to the Bureau other than those set out above.

On his television program on the above date, Mr. Winchell made the following statements of possible interest to the Bureau.

WINCHELL:

The FBI has trapped Charles Hopkins, a nineteen year old ex-convict wanted for kidnaping many persons in the Deep South. The capture may take place at any moment. He may receive the death penalty under the Lindbergh Law.

COMMENT:

Hopkins is a subject in the case entitled [redacted] wa., Fugitive; Charles Hopkins, Fugitive; [redacted] Fugitive; [redacted] Victim Kidnaping, 1952. Juvenile Delinquency Act. [redacted] was captured October 25, 1952. Intensive investigation is being conducted by this Bureau in Florida, Georgia, and Tennessee looking toward the apprehension of the other two subjects.

WINCHELL:

The Department of Justice has quietly investigated the case of Owen Lattimore. Witnesses have been interviewed by E. H., a top expert on Communism.

COMMENT:

The Justice Department plans to present this case to a grand jury in the near future. The case in the Justice Department is being handled by Edward Hummer, a former Bureau Agent.

WINCHELL:

Tennuto and Marsciato, the suspects wanted in the Schuster murder case, may be taken any day. Let me bring them in, please, so that the Runyan Cancer Fund may get the reward of more than \$26,000.

COMMENT:

As you know, Fred J. Tennuto is one of the Bureau's top ten fugitives. He was an associate of Willy Sutton. [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] / Marsciato is wanted by the New York Police Department and is not a Bureau fugitive.

WINCHELL:

The Senate Security Committee will expand its probe to the U. S. Mission in the U.N. One suspect is a top advisor to the American delegates. He was a protege of Alger Hiss. His last initial is R. Another protege of Alger Hiss is being investigated as the ghost writer for the statement of Trygvie Lie, attacking the Senate probe. His last initial is F., F as for Foote.

COMMENT:

As you know the McCarran Committee has been holding hearings concerning Communism in the United Nations. One of the individuals referred to by Winchell may be [REDACTED] a U. N. employee who has been the subject of a security investigation by the Bureau.

WINCHELL:

Uranium cannot be smuggled into our cities and harbors without detection. No enemy can plant the atomic bomb by suitcase.

COMMENT:

None.

WINCHELL:

Last week I said President Truman was a member of the Ku Klux Klan. Drew Pearson stated that this is not true. Here are affidavits to prove that Truman was a member of the Klan in Independence, Missouri, in 1922.

Winchell exhibited affidavits from the following individual Lee M. Allen, Commander KKK Unit, Independence, Missouri; Harry E. Huckle, Lot H. Denton, O. L. Chrisman, L. H. Goddard, Grandview, Missouri; Harry Hoffman, and Harold Bullard (phonetic), King Kleagle of the Klan, Kansas City, Missouri.

COMMENT:

WINCHELL:

Congressman Velde, ex-FBI man and new chairman of the House Committee on Un-American Activities will begin tomorrow to toss Communists out of high places in Government.

Friends of Alger Hiss are trying to get a passport for him so Hiss can live abroad maybe, Switzerland, when he is paroled next month.

To the Hartford Times and Courant the Peoples Party of Connecticut which is sponsoring Paul Robeson's concert at Weaver High School, your city, is a Communist front group or worse. Paul Robeson is no good. Get him out of town. Winchell furnished descriptive background and showed a photograph of James Edward Jackson, Jr., and announced his reward of \$7,000 for the capture of the seven Communist fugitives.

WINCHELL:

An engagement by Larry Alder, harmonica expert, was cancelled by the New Orleans Hotel Ponce De Leon on November 5, 1952, on many complaints from American Legionnaires.

You will recall that according to our files 

WINCHELL:

Norman Corwin, top radio writer, was finally located after three weeks. He was found in the high Sierras where he said he was hunting. The McCarran Committee will call Corwin for extensive grilling next Tuesday concerning Communist infiltration of the U.N.

WINCHELL:

Charlie Chaplin will be detained at Ellis Island, or nearest immigration detention center when he returns to the United States. He will be confronted by damaging evidence given Uncle Sam by an American Undercover Agent.

Comment

According to SA Nelson who is supervising this case numerous informants are being contacted and recontacted concerning this matter. According to Nelson the Immigration and Naturalization Service is conducting the actual investigation and the Bureau is assisting in interviews when requested. From Winchell's description, an American Undercover Agent, this could refer to many persons or no one who has been contacted regarding the Chaplin investigation.

WINCHELL:

Senator McCarran takes over hearings on Communism in the U.N. next Tuesday. A female witness will tell her story of Communist infiltration of the U.N. that will ignite a major diplomatic incident between the United States and Russia,

Comment:

Bureau files concerning Communist infiltration of the U.N. discloses no potential witness who fits Winchell's comment.

WINCHELL:

The FBI in Baltimore has arrested Carl Chase probably wanted for murder in Portland, Maine.

Comment

Chase was apprehended by Bureau Agents on a tip from a private citizen who had seen his description set out in the
